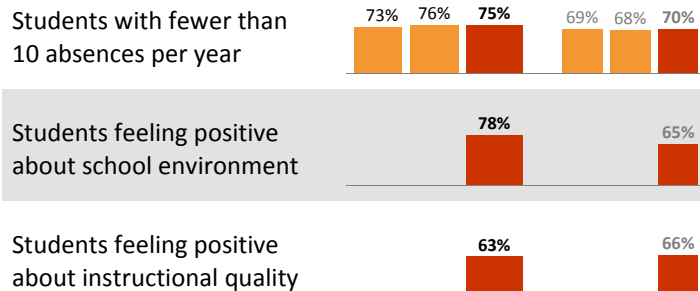

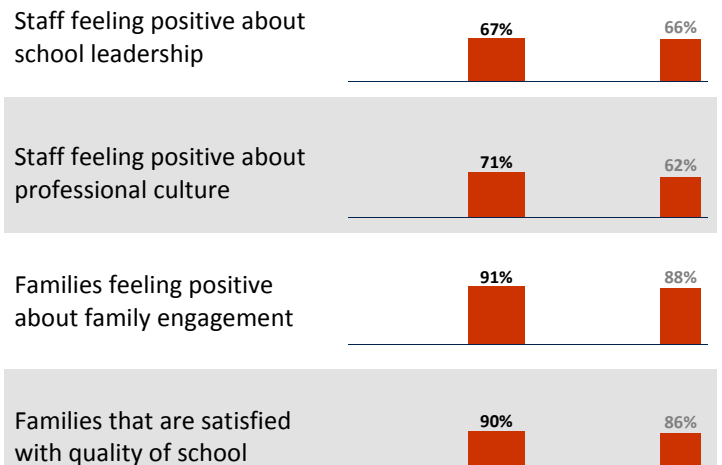

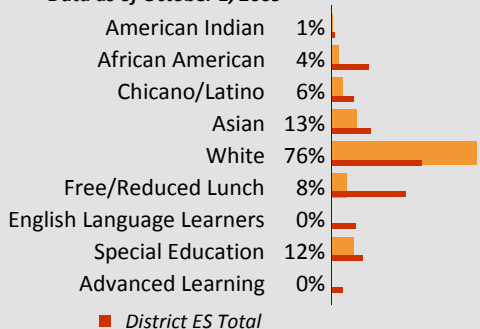

### School Mission Statement

It is **John Hay's** mission to... Train our children to care for others, Engage learners through effective and innovative teaching, **Actively** involve and educate our families, **Collaborate** with others to improve effectiveness, and **Hold** our students, teachers and families accountable as we ...develop caring learners who are actively growing and achieving.

### School Goals

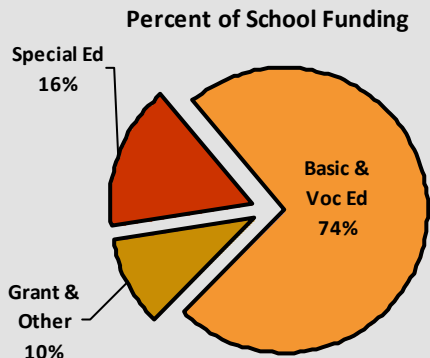
• **Math:** At least 90% of students will make gains on the state math test, an increase from 84% in 2010. At least 70% of students will make or exceed typical growth on the Measures of Academic Progress (MAP) math test, an increase from 67% in 2010. • **Reading:** At least 90% of students will make gains on the state MSP reading test, an increase from 74% in 2010. At least 80% of students will meet or exceed typical growth on the MAP reading test, an increase from 69% in 2010. We will target specific higher-need populations to promote growth for all students. • **Science:** At least 75% of students will meet or exceed state science standards on the MSP science test, an increase from 60% in 2010.

### School Description & Plans to Achieve Goals

To achieve our goals, John Hay is taking the following steps:

- Early identification of instructional level – In September, we collected baseline student performance data in reading, writing and math. Students receive differentiated instruction according to their learning needs.
- Frequent monitoring of student progress is conducted through measures such as classroom-based assessments, MAP, systematic observation and completion and review of classroom work. Adjustments to instruction occur based upon instructional assessments.
- Proactive and reactive interventions are provided to students demonstrating need for supplemental services and/or modified assignments.
- Teachers in collaborative data teams and grade levels work together to respond to the learning needs of students.
- Training is provided to teachers in alignment with our growth and achievement goals and is differentiated to the needs of each teacher.
- Our families are encouraged to become involved in the learning community through attendance at Parent Education events, community-building events, subscription to the daily bulletin, and regular opportunities to volunteer in classrooms and within the larger community.
