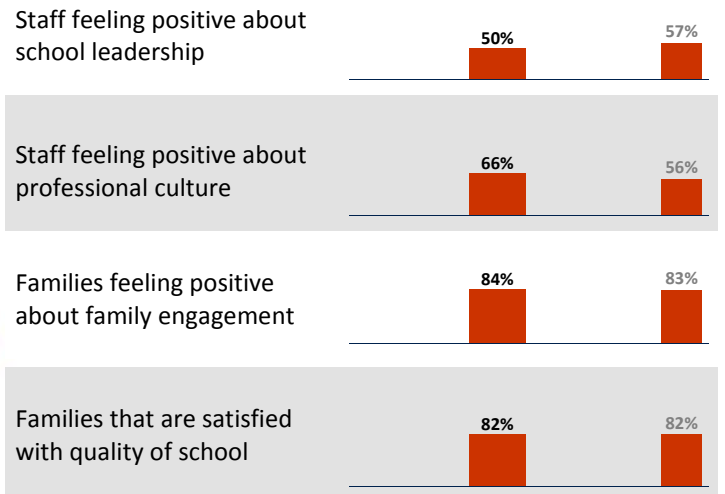
Academic Growth & Student Outcomes

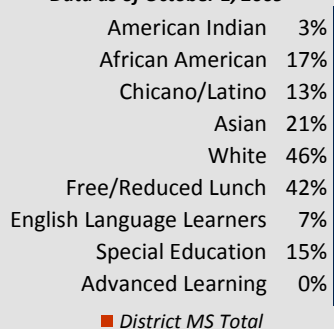

School Mission Statement

Madison Middle School is a cooperative partnership of students, parents, staff, and community members who have a vision of our school as a challenging and fun place to learn. Our school will provide memorable learning experiences for all students so they can grow to be successful adults.

School Goals

- Math:** Increase the number of 6th, 7th and 8th grade students passing the math portion of the MSP by at least 5%.
- Reading:** Increase the number of 6th, 7th and 8th grade students passing the reading portion of the MSP by at least 5%.
- Writing:** Increase the number of 7th grade students passing the writing portion of the MSP by at least 6%.

School Description & Plans to Achieve Goals

Madison is a diverse comprehensive middle school where diversity is valued. Madison offers a rigorous curriculum that challenges all learners. Our staff is dedicated to providing the best possible education to our students. We are proud that for the third year in a row we have received the “School of Distinction” Award from The Center for Educational Effectiveness (CEE) and Phi Delta Kappa - Washington State Chapter.

Math: Our teachers consistently use formative assessments to determine instructional next steps. We provide additional time and support for students who need extra help. Our teachers participate in math studio days which are designed for teachers to work together on a particular lesson and examine the student learning.

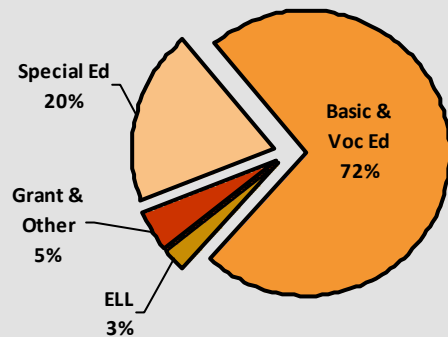
Writing/Reading: We will use a teaching model called “Writers Workshop” in our Humanities classes to help teachers identify students’ strength and weaknesses. Teachers will examine student work to inform their choice of strategies to improve students’ skills in reading and writing. A collection of interventions are being developed for teachers to access for students who are below grade level.

Family Engagement: We know that family engagement is important to students’ academic success. We hold four family nights to help students and families engage in our academic program and to share strategies to help students succeed.

Community Support: Madison partners with the YMCA to help support our students with a variety of after school activities. These activities include extra academic support, enrichment activities, and athletics. Our wellness center provides services that support of students’ physical and emotional health.
