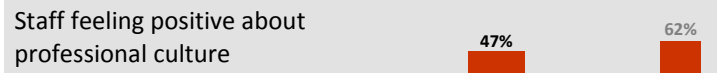
Academic Growth & Student Outcomes

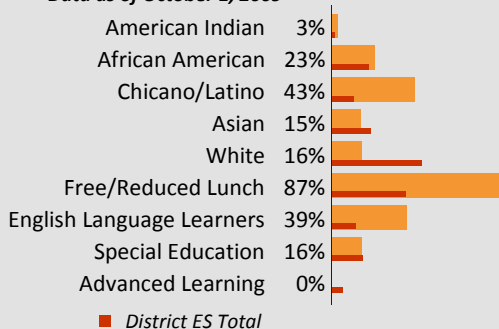

School Report for 2009–2010 School Year

School Mission Statement

Northgate is a team of parents, staff and students determined to challenge students to be all that they can be in a positive, nurturing learning environment. We embrace respect for all cultures and help all children succeed.

School Goals

- In reading and math, our goals are to have 80% of our students show growth on the State assessments in May of 2011, an increase from 64% in reading and 70% in math in 2010.
 - In writing, our goal is to have at least 67% of our 4th graders meet or exceed state grade level writing standards on the MSP writing test, an increase from 57% in 2010.
 - We are also working to have at least a 10 percentage-point increase in the number of students at each grade level reaching the proficiency level in reading and math.
- In climate, our goal is to show a 25% decrease in the number of monthly discipline referrals, from 146 to 110.

School Description & Plans to Achieve Goals

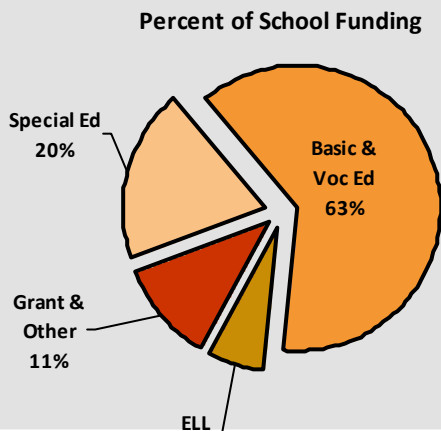
In reading and writing, we are strengthening teaching in each classroom. This means that teachers work with the literacy coach and other trainers on using methods and common language that are effective and consistent. Students are introduced to reading and writing skills in Kindergarten, and these are built upon through 5th grade.

In math, we are teaching state standards and performance expectations in each lesson. Each skill is being carefully planned over the course of the year, and teachers clearly know the timelines for when skills must be learned. We are working on ways to provide more practice and time for students who may need more time to learn. Teachers are also learning about new and innovative ways to teach mathematics – especially problem solving.

In the area of school climate, we are identifying and reinforcing student expectations, and offering frequent opportunities to demonstrate and reward positive student behavior. Students are supported throughout the day on how to learn and work together, and we create additional opportunities in class meetings with teachers, assemblies and celebrations, and through chats with the Principal at lunch and recess.

To support the school, in addition to the total school budget, the district is providing a literacy coach and time for teachers to plan lessons together or receive professional development. Beginning this year, all teachers at Northgate are setting and being evaluated by the principal on student growth goals for learning.
