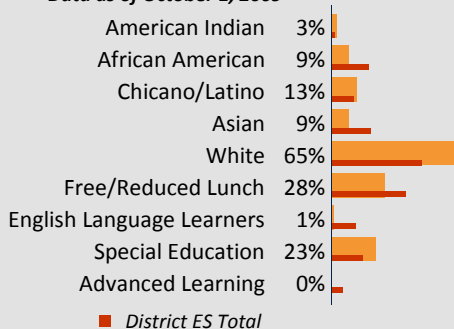

Pathfinder K-8 School educates students to become passionate, lifelong learners, respecting themselves, others and the environment.

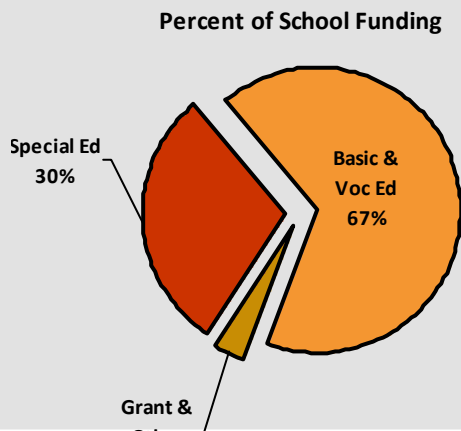
School Goals

Reading: to increase the number of students meeting standard on the MSP by an average of 6%. •3rd - 90% will meet standard •4th - 90% will meet standard •5th - 88% will meet standard
Math: to increase the number of students meeting standard on the MSP by an average of 10.5% •3rd - 78% will meet standard•4th - 75% will meet standard •5th - 67% will meet standard
Writing: to increase the number of students meeting standard on the MSP by an average of 22%. •4th - 75% will meet standard

School Description & Plans to Achieve Goals

Upon analyzing our students' academic achievement data we have developed a rich and robust professional development plan to help our students demonstrate growth in the areas of reading, writing and mathematics. Pathfinder K-8 is in its second year of readers workshop and fourth year of writers workshop implementation across all nine grade levels. We have comprehensive classroom libraries to support the workshop model and provide our students access to a variety of genres and ability levels. We are continuing our relationship with Columbia University's Teachers College with a staff developer who is focusing on both readers and writers workshop. We have designed an after school extension class called PHAT (Pathfinder High Achieving Team) that focuses on accelerating reading and writing skills for targeted students in 6th through 8th grade. In addition we will be implementing a computerized program called Study Island that will provide intervention and enrichment opportunities for our students in kindergarten through 8th grade. Our math plan for this year is extensive. We have added an additional math class in our middle school so that every student receives two math classes everyday (intervention/enrichment). We have developed a math professional development plan with a consultant from the University of Washington. The work with the coach includes studio days and in-service days totaling 14 professional development days throughout the year. We will also be utilizing Study Island for math intervention/enrichment for our students in kindergarten through 8th grade. In addition to the above we have 7 well trained hourly tutors who support our Learning Assistance and Middle School Support Programs by working directly with students who are identified as not meeting standard in reading and mathematics.

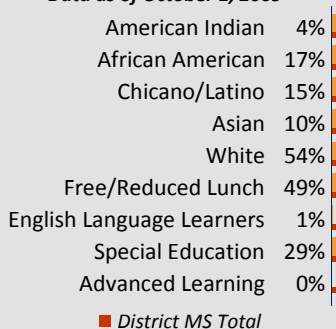
