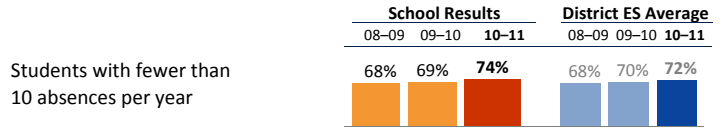

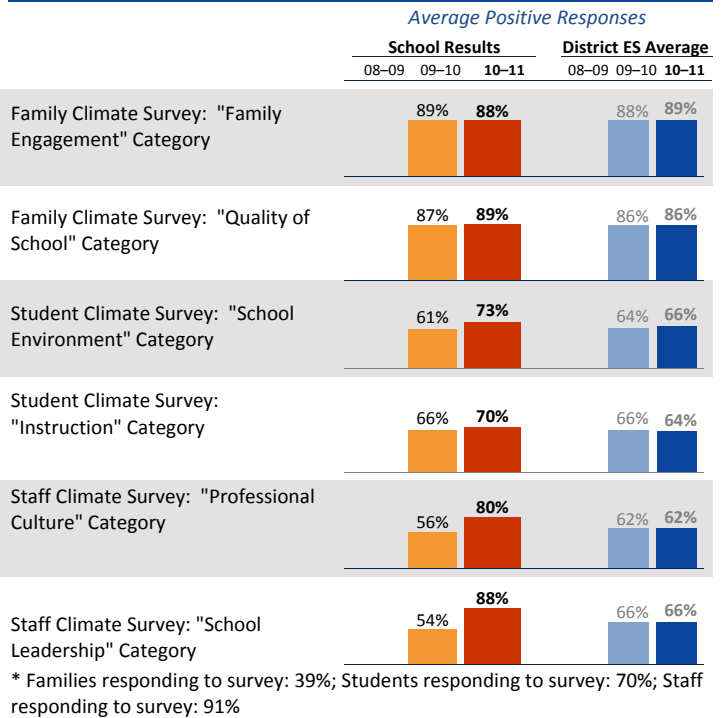

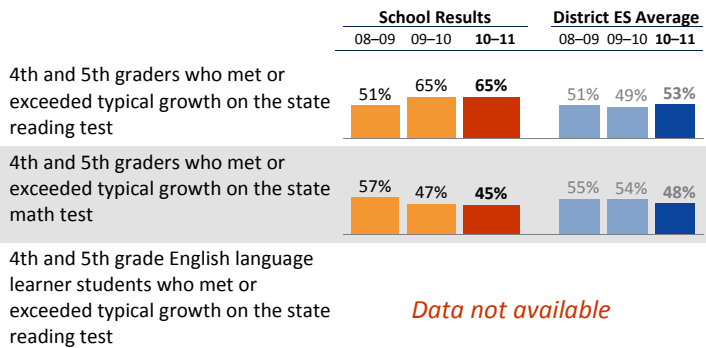

Student, Family, and Staff School Climate Survey



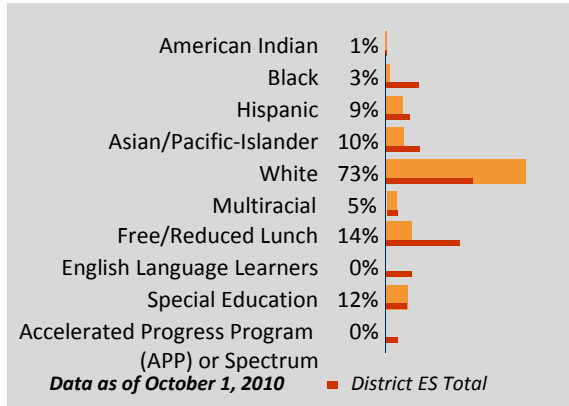
Year-to-Year Growth: Following the Same Students

School Mission Statement

Green Lake School's mission is to be a place where all students: • Strive for academic excellence • Acquire a positive attitude about learning • Celebrate the uniqueness of all individuals • Reject violence • Develop appreciation, respect, and understanding of the environment.

School Goals

For all students we will increase the % of students proficient on the state reading test from 81% to 85%. For math, we will increase the % of students making gains on the state test from 71% to 75% grades 3-5 and writing will increase from 79% to 82% for this years 4th grade cohort. Students percentage on Climate survey report will have students who never feel bullied or threatened increase from 49% to 55%.

School Description and Plan to Achieve Goals

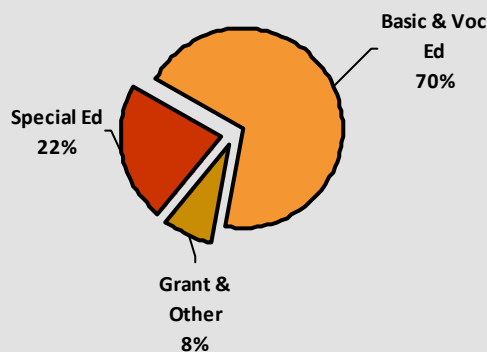
Math: To improve students' knowledge and skills in mathematics. Use EDM school-wide as a comprehensive curriculum to meet student needs.

MSP data shows that there are no significant gaps. We have several individuals who did not pass some or all of the MSP sections. These students as identified in the All School SIT will be identified and strategies implemented to help them be successful in math. The two areas of math we will concentrate on based on the Line Item data from MSP are Geometry and Measurement strand as well as Procedures and Concepts.

Reading: Literacy Coach works with grade level teaching teams to map out units, survey needs, plan professional development. Literacy Coach works with K-5 and related Special Ed. teachers to analyze running records to drive instruction. Teachers will follow a cohort of students in grades 3-5 to analyze data from a variety of sources.
