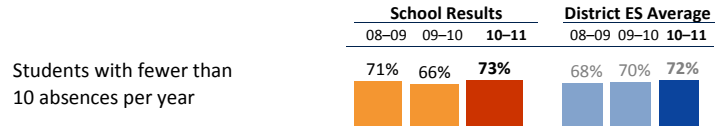

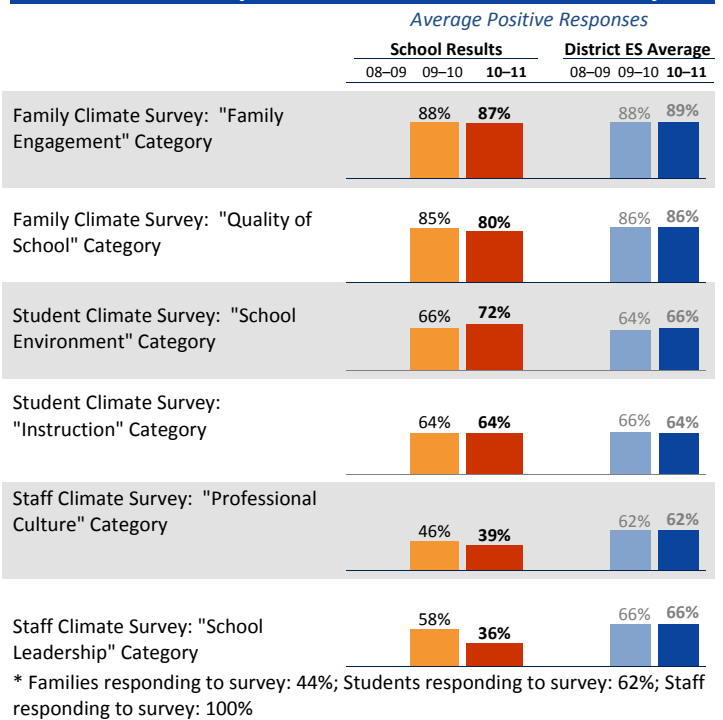

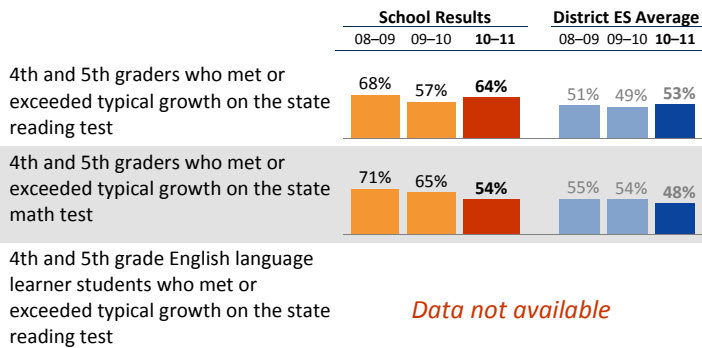

### Student, Family, and Staff School Climate Survey



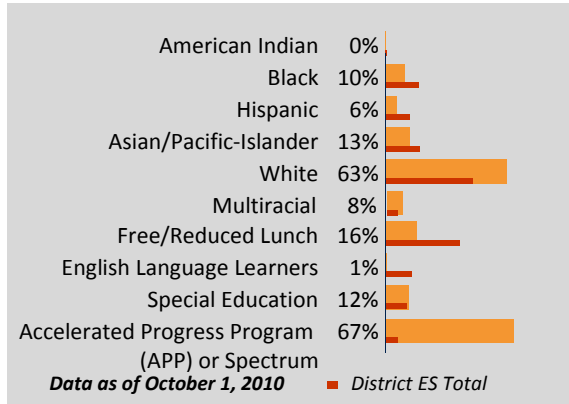
### Year-to-Year Growth: Following the Same Students

## School Plan & Budget for the 2011-2012 School Year

### School Mission Statement

Lowell Elementary School challenges its students, staff and families to be inspired, confident learners; we celebrate diversity and contribute as citizens of the global community.

### School Goals

For intermediate students we will increase the percentage of students making gains on state math test from 88% to 92%. For 4th grade students we will increase the percentage of students proficient on the state writing test from 81% to 91%. For 5th grade students we will increase the percentage of students making gains on state science test from 70% to 80%.

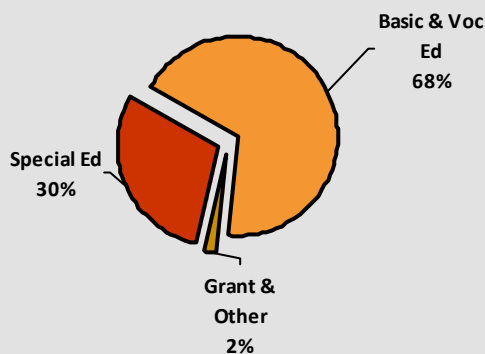
### School Description and Plan to Achieve Goals

**READING:** Implement a data driven comprehensive balanced literacy instructional program school-wide. Support students in the development of effective reading skills and strategies through the use of guided reading groups in K-2 classrooms. Implement Readers Workshop in all intermediate classrooms, during which students read many books and explore different genres, authors and texts. Engage students in critical thinking, shared inquiry, and reflection as they read, respond and discuss selected literature in literature circles. Teachers will work in Professional Learning Communities (PLCs) to improve assessment of student reading and the use of information to make adjustments in instruction. Teachers will work with QRI, DRA, MAP scores, Reading Assessments, and/or conferring notes to assess students reading level.

**MATH:** Align instruction across program grade bands using Everyday Mathematics Curriculum Pacing Guide. Incorporate High Leverage Teaching Moves in math instruction through professional development lead by mathematics coach. Teachers collaboratively plan EDM lessons and formative assessments to use with each EDM unit.
