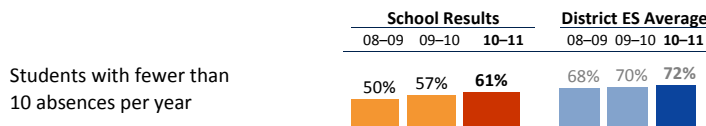

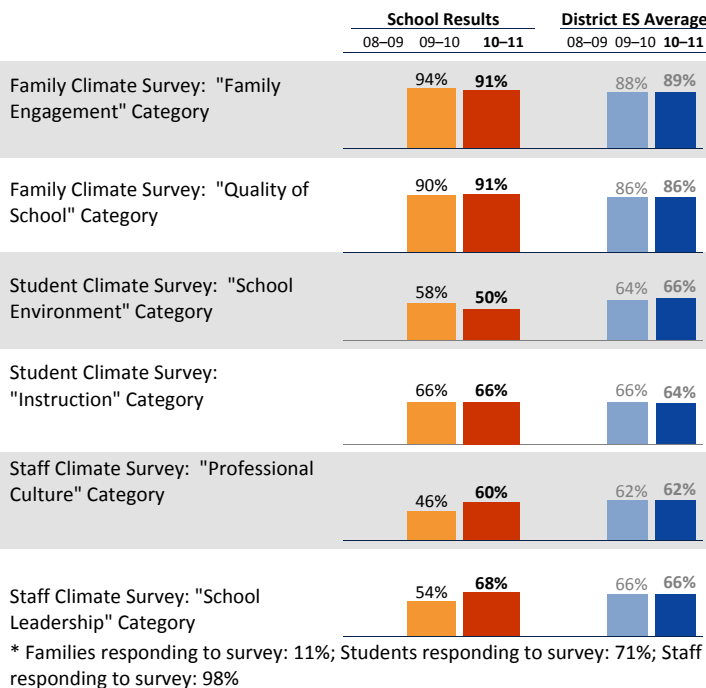

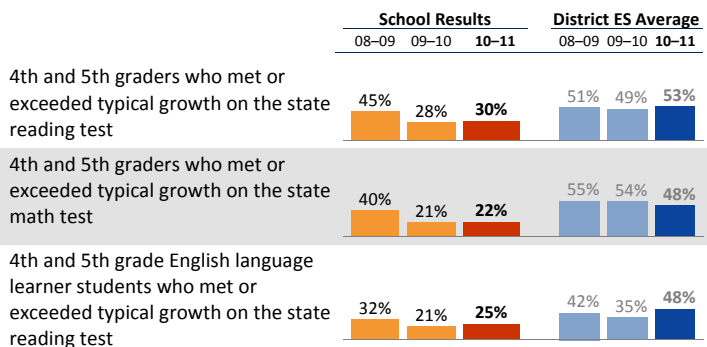
Average Positive Responses

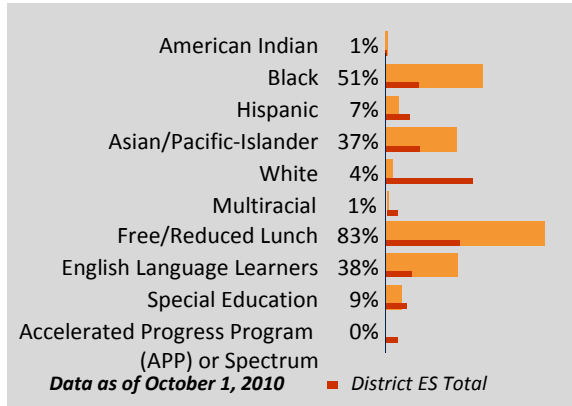

Year-to-Year Growth: Following the Same Students

School Goals

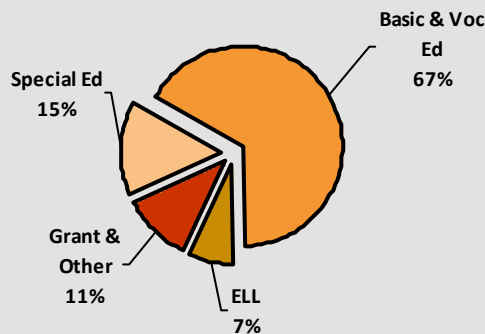
For intermediate students we will increase the % of students proficient on the state math test from 24% to 44% and from 38% to 48% for reading. For all students we will increase the % of students meeting or exceeding typical growth on the MAP math test from 41% to 51% and from 40% to 50% for reading. For all students we will increase the percentage of students feeling positive about school environment from 57% to 67%.

School Description and Plan to Achieve Goals

READING: Implementation of a Balanced Literacy program. As part of our master schedule every student is provided 90 minutes of uninterrupted instruction. This includes: teacher-led small groups where children receive instruction at their reading level, self-selected reading, independent practice geared toward their specific needs and instruction in phonics and/or vocabulary development. Instructional assistants and other ELL teachers provide academic support within K-5 classrooms. Through this collaboration, cross grade level teams identify when skills are taught and when they are mastered. With the use of the intervention/enrichment block instructional staff will provide opportunities to accelerate the learning of students at all levels. Instructional staff will collaborate to identify the specific needs that will be targeted during this time, with the use of MAP data. **MATH:** Implement a school-wide Comprehensive Mathematics Program (as part of a master schedule) to include scheduling that will support flexible math groupings of students, with the use of Everyday Math curriculum. Identify students who are approaching grade level expectations and provide them with focused interventions, specifically in number sense and problem-solving. Once these students achieve mastery, students not meeting grade level expectations will be identified and provided strategic supports. Students will receive additional reinforcement of key math skills by accessing EDM, DreamBox and SuccessMaker (online).
