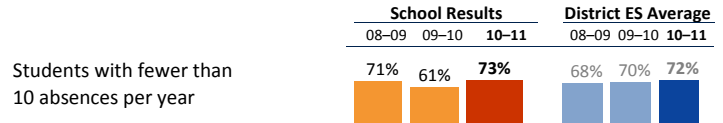

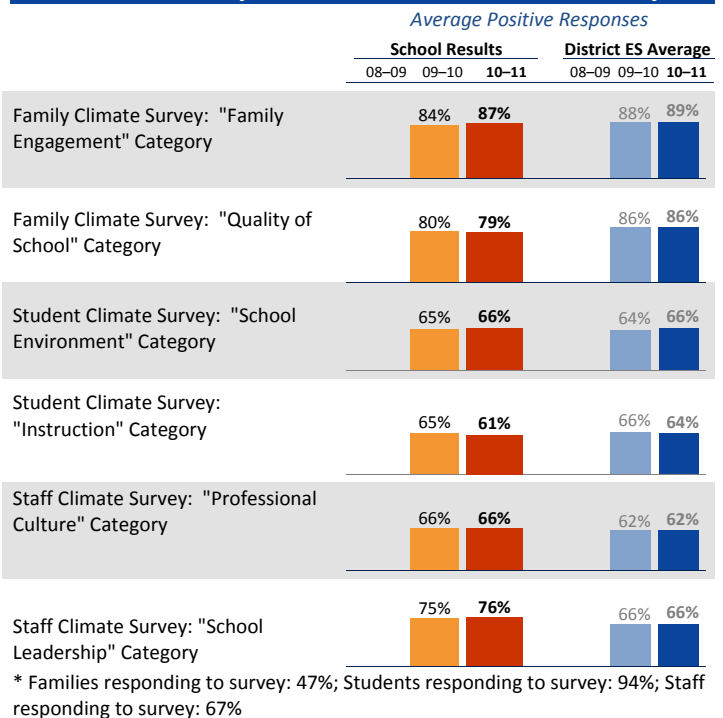

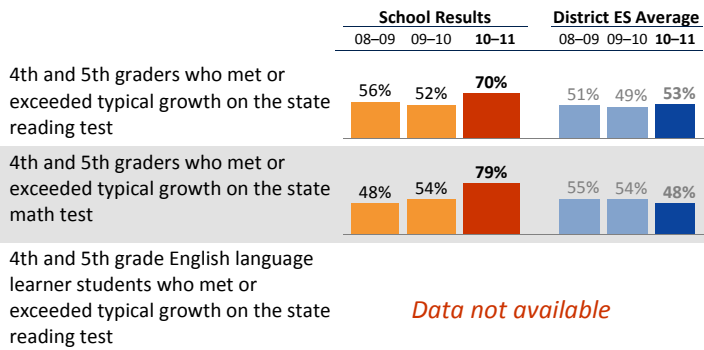

Student, Family, and Staff School Climate Survey



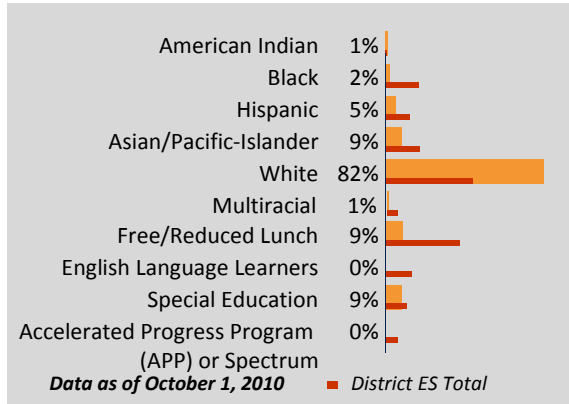
Year-to-Year Growth: Following the Same Students

For intermediate students we will increase the % of students making gains on state math test from 64% to 80%. For 4th grade students we will increase the % of students meeting or exceeding typical growth on the math MAP test from 76% to 86%. For all students we will increase the % of students making gains on state reading test from 69% to 80%.

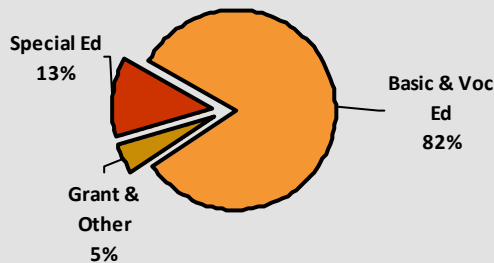
School Description and Plan to Achieve Goals

READING: Aligned Balanced Literacy strategies along with Reader Workshop training and implementation Teachers will use differentiated reading strategies.

MATH: North Beach will work with staff from Whitman Middle School to bridge curriculum areas in math and reading. North Beach will increase our math block by 20 minutes more a day in math for a total of 80 minutes per day. North Beach is a strong community of teachers, parents and students who are dedicated to reaching our full potential as learners and citizens. North Beach provides rigorous and differentiated instruction that challenges each student to achieve to the best of his or her ability. Our inclusive classroom communities are intentionally balanced to provide complex, open-ended, thought provoking and challenging activities with peers who have a variety of strengths and interests.
