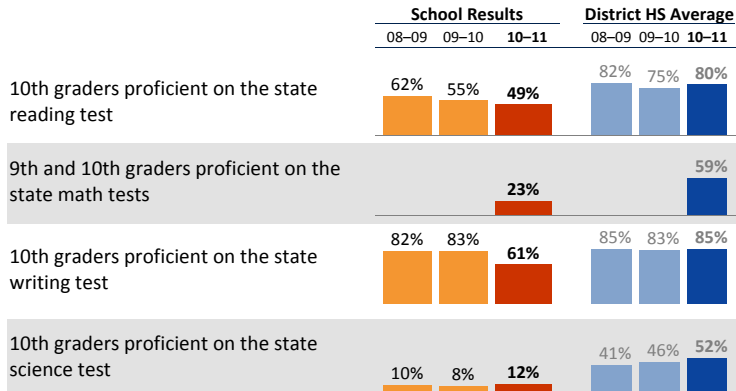

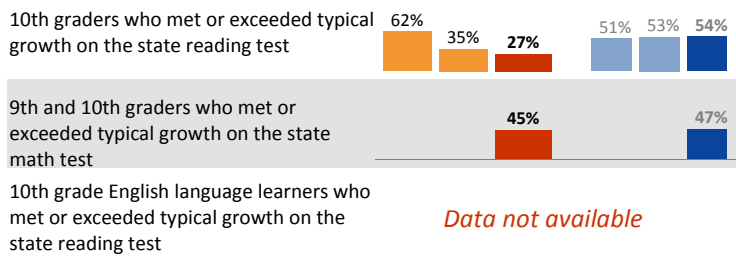

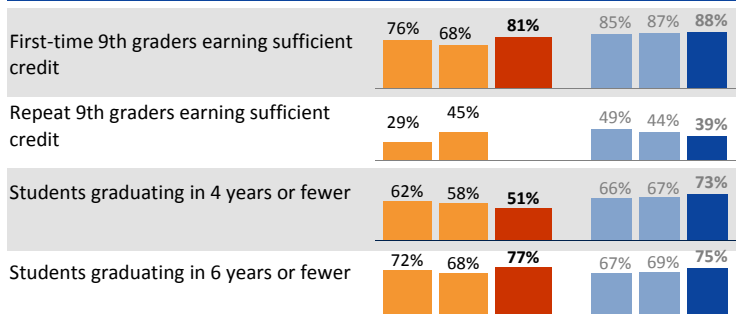


Year-to-Year Growth: Following the Same Students

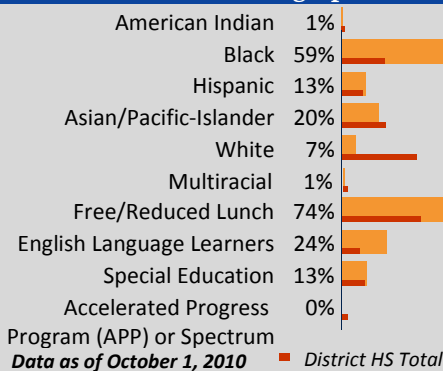
On-Track for Graduation



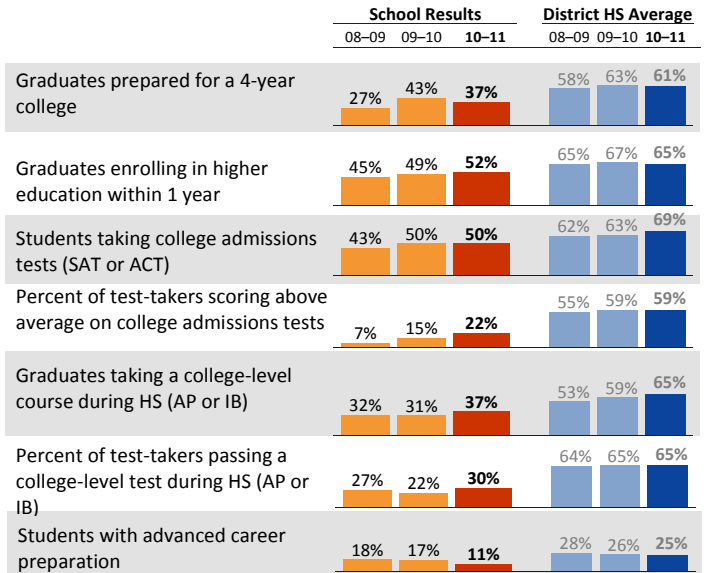
Attendance



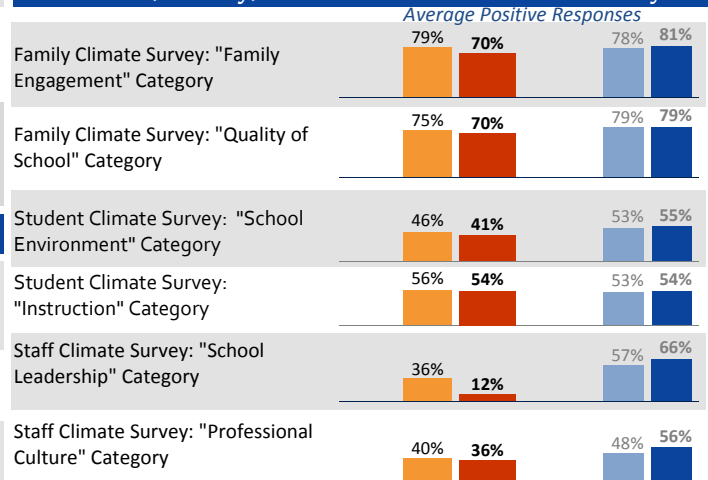
Student Demographics

School Mission Statement

To empower our students to become life-long learners, through the support of family, staff and community, to excel academically and creatively in a multicultural world!

School Goals

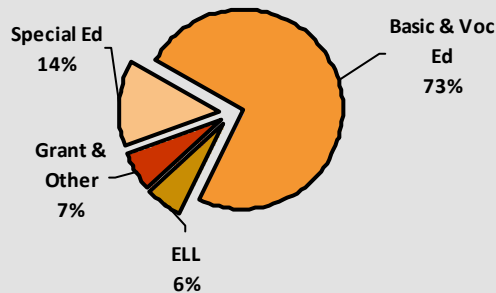
For 9th - 10th grade students we will increase the % of students meeting or exceeding typical growth on the math MAP assessment from 59% to 65%. For 10th grade students we will increase the % of students proficient on the state reading test from 49% to 65%. For 10th grade students we will increase the % of students proficient on the state writing test from 60% to 87% and from 12% to 25% for science. For 9th grade students we will increase the % of first-time 9th graders earning sufficient credit to graduate from 68% to 74%.

School Description and Plan to Achieve Goals

READING: Teachers will use reading Apprenticeship strategies that include investigating, fluency, compare/contrast, summarizing and home strategies. Identified students will participate in the Read 180 class in addition to their Language Arts class. The Language Arts department meets daily with the 9th grade academy to align curriculum and develop common language and common practice. Students will prep for the EOC and HSPE assessments during Academic Saturday Camps. **MATH:** 9th grade academy teams will assess student work to inform changes needed to instructional practices. We are using the research-based Charlotte Danielson (CD) Frameworks for Teaching adopted by SEA by SEA and SPS as part of the collective bargaining agreement (CBA), as the model for teachers professional development. Analyze and review of standardized test scores for students that scored L3/L4 and enroll them into Advanced Placement and Honors courses. Provide identified students academic support algebra lab class. Tutoring is also available after school and during Academic Saturday Camp. Teachers will work with math coaches from the University of Washington to improve their teaching and learning strategies.
