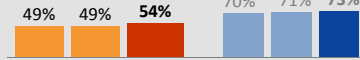

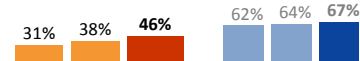

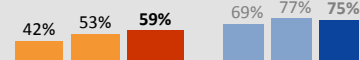
6th, 7th, and 8th graders proficient on the state reading test



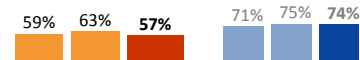
6th, 7th, and 8th graders proficient on the state math test



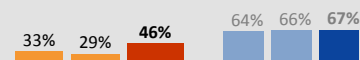

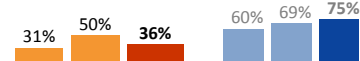
7th graders proficient on the state writing test

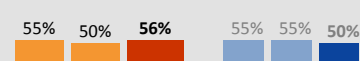

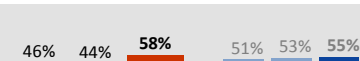
6th, 7th and 8th graders who met or exceeded typical growth on the state reading test



6th, 7th, and 8th graders who met or exceeded typical growth on the highest state math test they took



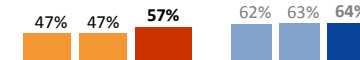
6th, 7th, and 8th grade English language learner students who met or exceeded typical growth on the state reading test

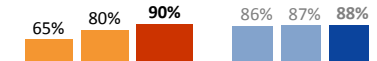

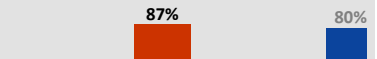

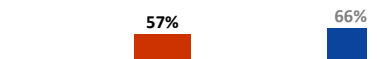
Family perceptions of School-Family Engagement



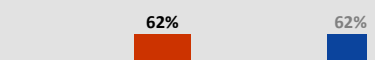
Family perceptions of School Quality



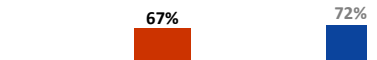
Student perceptions of School Environment



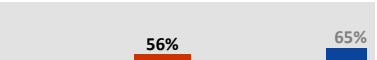
Student perceptions of Classroom Instruction

## School Plan & Budget for the 2012-2013 School Year

### School Mission Statement

Strong Relationships and High Expectations—Every Student Excelling and Cared For—in Our Collaborative Learning Community-Every student Achieves, Everyone Accountable.

### School Goals

**Reading**-6th grade will make a 20% gain from 43% to 63%, 7th grade will make a 10% gain from 59% to 69% and 8th grade will make a 10% gain from 51% to 61% on being proficient on the state reading test.

**Math** -6th grade will make a 20% gain from 43% to 63%, 7th grade will make a 10% gain from 57% to 67% and 8th grade will make a 10% gain from 46% to 56% on being proficient on the state math test.

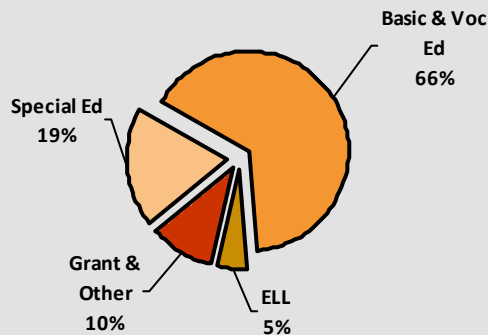
### School Description and Plan to Achieve Goals

**Math:** Students who scored a Level 1 or 2 on their most recent MSP and some level 3 students will have an additional math class focused on building the foundational math skills (Numbers and Operations). Math teachers provide instruction based on state standards and inform their instructional practices through collaboratively developing standards-based units, by using students' data to progress monitor and intervene appropriately.

**Reading:** All students have 100 minutes of reading and writing instruction daily. Students are scheduled in “just-right” reading classes based on MAP and MSP data. Finer-tuned adjustments occur with reading level assessments, interim assessments and teacher feedback. Reading classes include Teachers College Reading and Writing model, Inside curriculum, Read 180 and Systems 44. We utilize multiple pedagogical approaches, such as differentiated small group instruction, accountable talk protocols, and daily assessments (e.g. short-writes, long-writes, conferring, exit tickets). All Literacy teachers collaboratively developed a school curricular calendar that is vertically aligned and anchored with the state and common core standards. Explicit non-fiction reading instruction will take place in LA blocks, social studies and science classes. Students who scored a Level 1 or 2 and some level 3 on their most recent MSP will have the opportunity to participate in Academic Break Camps, Saturday Academy and After School Power Hour to strengthen their reading and math skills.
