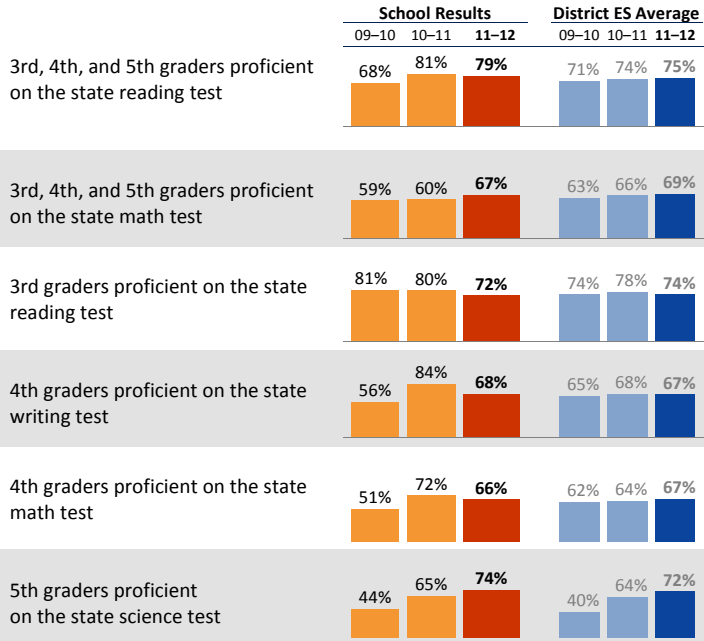

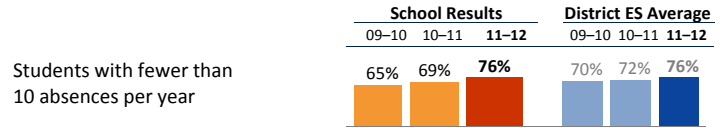

Attendance



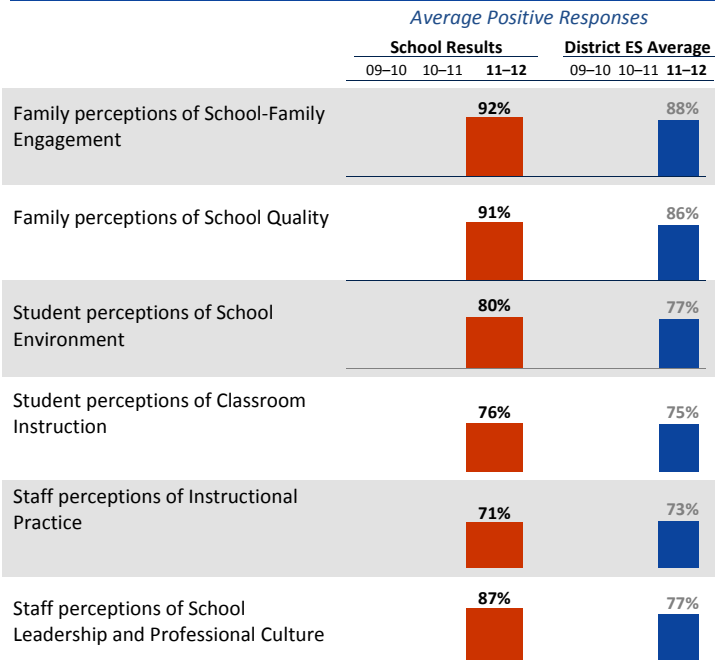

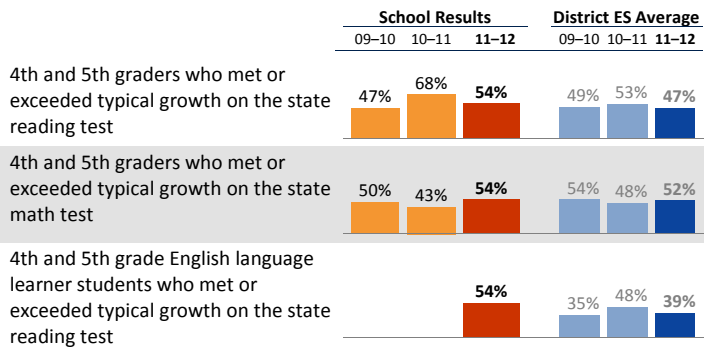

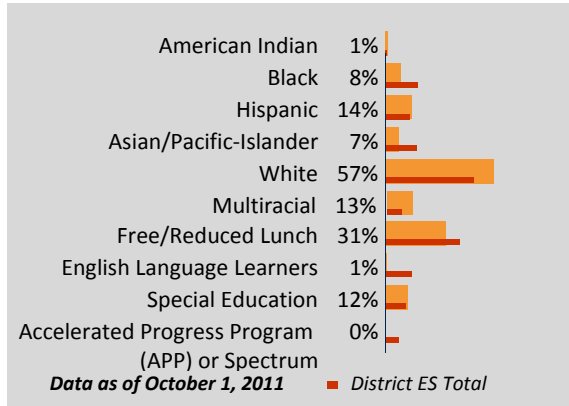

Year-to-Year Growth: Following the Same Students



This measure shows how much growth students have achieved compared to similar students across the state in the same grade level. The overall metric reported is the percentage of students whose growth was average or above (50th to 99th growth percentile) on the state test. Students are compared to other students in the same grade level across the state with similar test scores in previous years.

School Goals

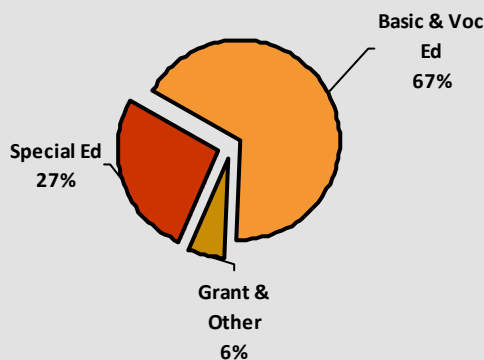
50% of students nationwide met typical growth in reading and math on the Measurement of Academic Progress (MAP) assessment. Our goal is to supersede national standards and for 70% of students in each classroom to meet typical growth targets in reading and math. MAP results have been proven to be an accurate measure of student success on the state test (MSP). Therefore, one of our goals is for 70% of our students to meet typical growth on the 2013 spring MAP assessment, exceeding the national norm of 50%. Another goal is for intermediate students in third through fifth grade, to meet school targets established by the state for reading and math.

School Description and Plan to Achieve Goals

When reviewing last year's state Measurement of Student Progress (MSP) data, our efforts to provide supplemental math activities, math workshop strategies and additional math support helped our school meet all math targets established by the state for each identified student group. An ongoing challenge has been to close the achievement gap for students facing socio-economic issues and those that are not. However, we have made progress in this area. Over the past several years we have increased the overall achievement of students facing socio-economic challenges and annual yearly progress (AYP) has been met on the state assessment in all areas in 2011. Now that new state measurements called Annual Measurable Objectives (AMO) have been established, our goal is to better align curriculum and instruction to the new common core standards in reading. The state 2013 Measurement of Student Progress (MSP) reading target for our particular school is 78.4% and the 2013 MSP math target is for 63.4% of Greenwood students to pass the state math test. One of our primary goals is to improve reading achievement so that Annual Measurable Objectives (AMO'S) are met by all identified student groups. Reading readiness, readers workshop strategies, resource allocation for additional classroom support and schoolwide reading events will better facilitate students overall reading achievement.
