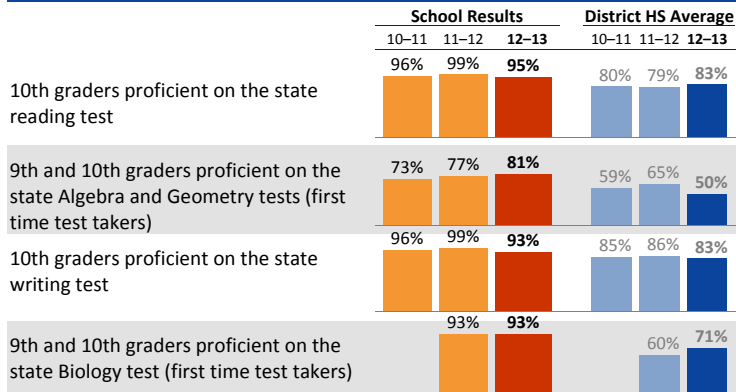

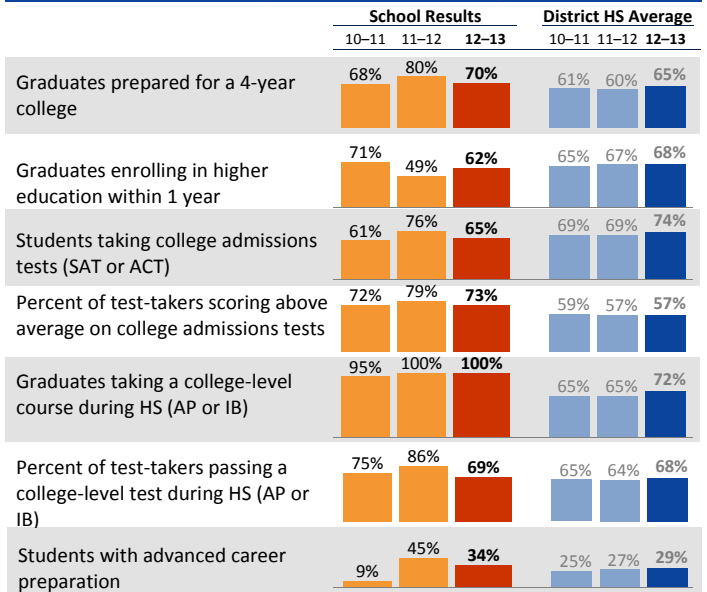

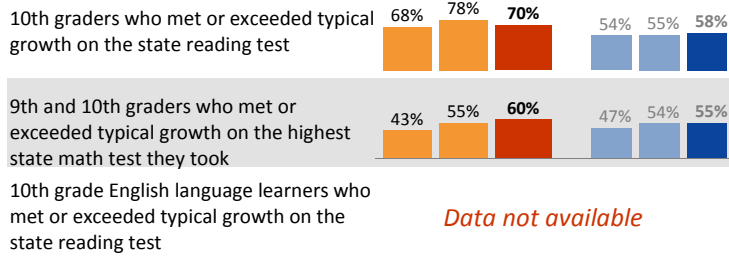

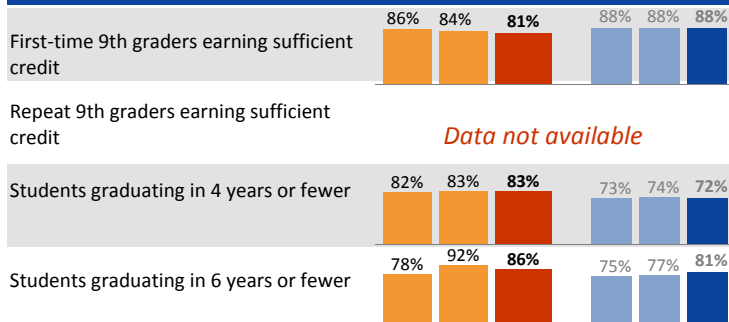


### Year-to-Year Growth: Following the Same Students

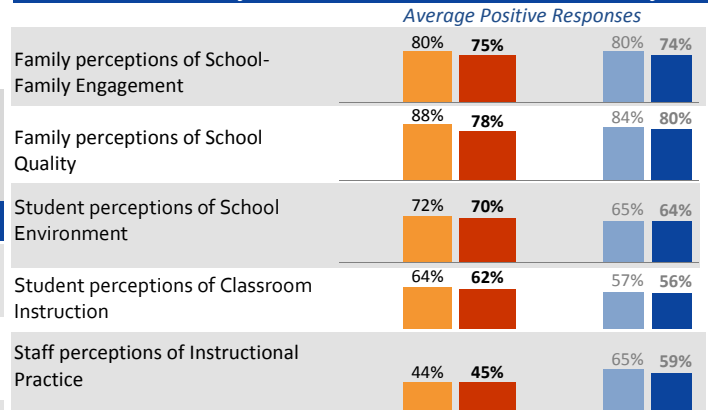

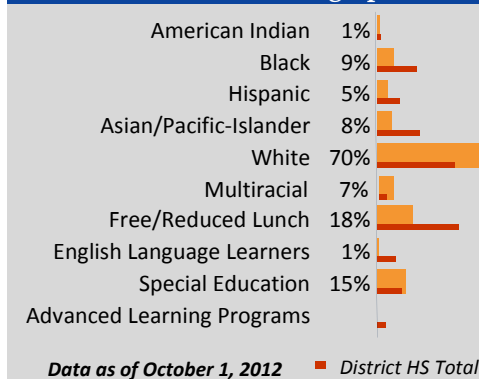

## School Plan & Budget for the 2013-2014 School Year

### School Mission Statement

Our mission is to empower and inspire all students to positively impact our world. We provide a high quality arts integrated college prep curriculum and provide an academic program that prepares all students for a four year university.

### School Goals

SPS adopted the new Teacher and Principal Evaluation System. Now, each staff member must set a # of goals for: a group of students within a class, the entire class and the entire grade level. While many teachers used this practice in the past, the new aspect of the evaluation system includes comparison of student growth as measured by conducting pre- and post- common assessments created by each grade level team. For example, to set a goal for all Humanities students, teachers would need to agree on a common rubric to monitor student achievement based on the pre- and post- assessments conducted in each classroom. The Center School goals for the 2013-2014 school years include supporting students to show growth on common formative assessments in each grade level across the curriculum.

### School Description and Plan to Achieve Goals

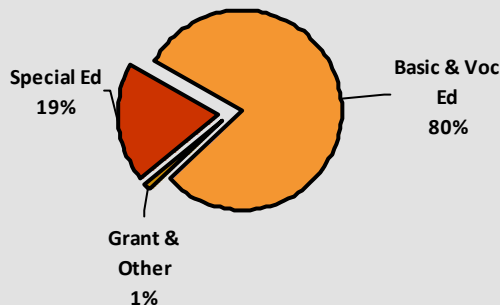
2013-2014 Professional Development proposal:

Continuously align teaching with Common Core and other standards being developed in order to increase rigor

- Create grade level common assessments
- Create common assessments rubrics
- Establish a system that uses feedback from assessments to make adjustments to curricula
- Conduct pre- and post- student evaluation
- Research and discover new strategies
- Apply new strategies into practice
- Monitor and adjust instruction based on student response to new practices
- Ensure student growth as measured by the common grade level assessments (as compared to the pre-evaluation results)
