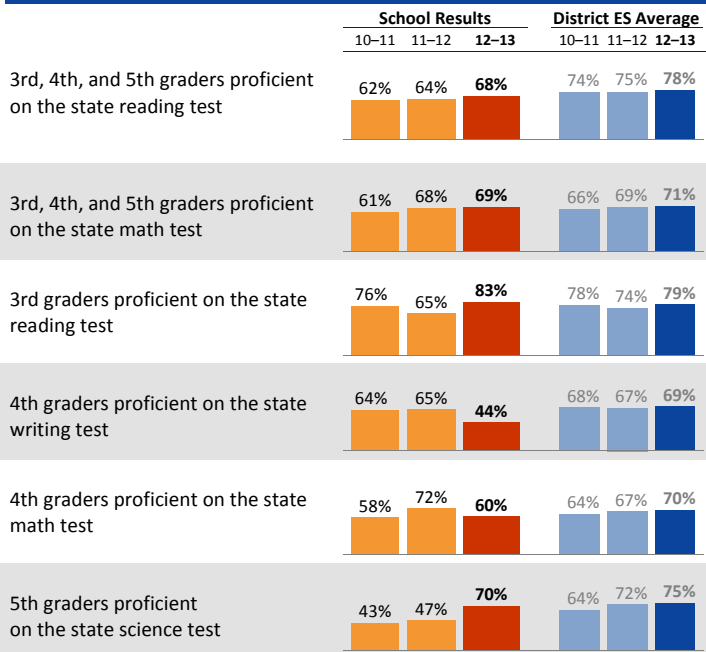

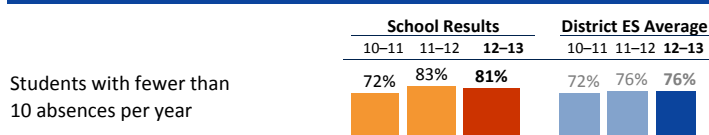

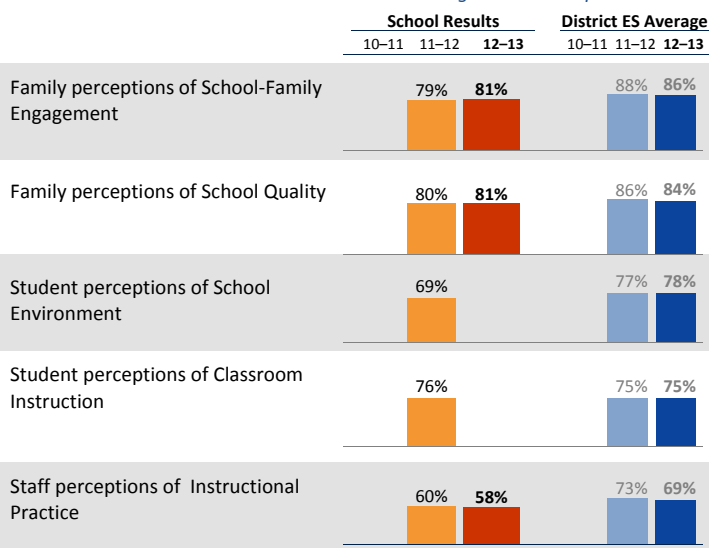

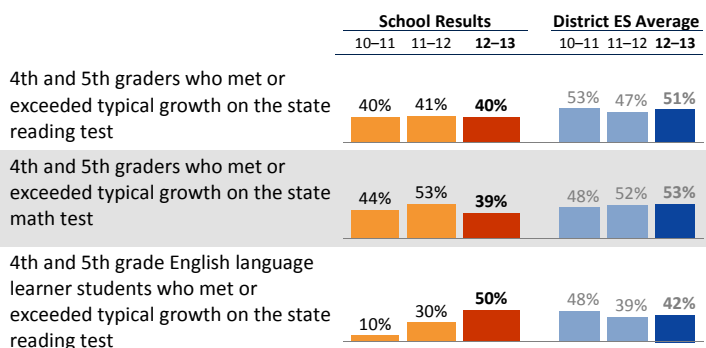

Year-to-Year Growth: Following the Same Students

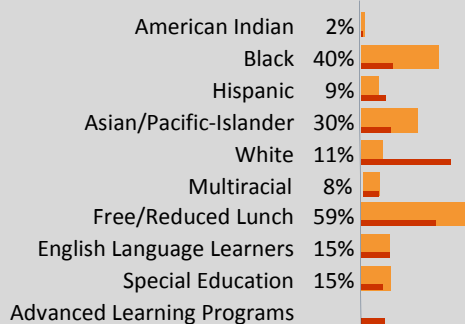

School Mission Statement

We view each child as a bright spirit on a magnificent journey in our quest to contribute powerfully to the healing of humanity and Mother Earth. We aspire to balance academic excellence with social, emotional and physical well-being.

School Goals

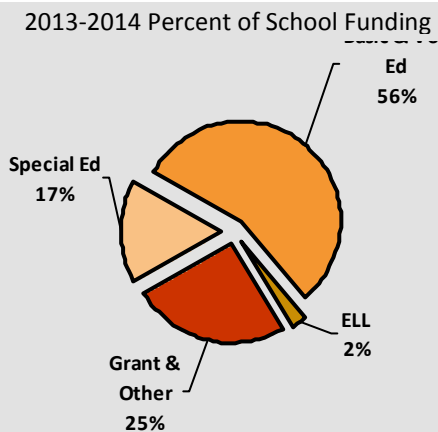
Reading / Language Arts: 1. We will increase 3rd – 5th Grade student proficiency on MSP state test from 69% to 75%, by focusing on the increased achievement of Black students from 56% to 66%.
 1. We will increase 6th – 8th Grade student proficiency on MSP state test from 69% to 75%, by focusing on the increased achievement of Black students from 53% to 63%.
Mathematics: 1. We will increase 3rd – 5th Grade student proficiency on MSP state test from 69% to 75%, by focusing on the increased achievement of Black students from 49% to 59%.
 We will increase 6th – 8th Grade student proficiency on MSP state test from 60% to 70%, by focusing on the increase achievement of Black students from 39% to 50%.

School Description and Plan to Achieve Goals

Math: South Shore PK-8 School provides Common Core State Standards (CCSS) standards-aligned mathematics instruction Kindergarten through 8th grade. We use the Envision Mathematics CCSS program K-6th grade and standards based accelerated “8th Grade Algebra for all” scope and sequence for 7th and 8th grade. We provided accelerated coursework in mathematics and currently have 15%-20% of middle school students accelerated in mathematics by two years (20 – 8th students in Geometry). We provide a double-dose during the school day/PCP mathematics intervention class for students in grades 3-5 as well as an additional mathematics support class in Grade 6-8. South Shore utilizes various technology programs to support students who are temporarily not meeting standard from Grade 3 – 8. These programs include: Dreambox Math, IXL Math and BrainX (for special education and students who need support with cognitive structures). We provide additional mathematics acceleration and enrichment instruction three days per week for Grades 3-5. South Shore PK-8 contracts with University Tutors for Seattle Schools providing twelve Seattle University and Seattle Pacific University tutors that provide before and after school tutoring on Tuesdays and Thursdays as well as in-class push in support in all 3rd and 5th grade classrooms and 6th – 8th grade math classrooms.

Reading: South Shore PK-8 School implements Balanced Literacy across PK-8 grades implementing the Columbia University TC Readers and Writers Workshop curriculum calendars and instructional strategies for literacy instruction supported by our multiyear partnership with REACH Associates (Cathy Feldman and Lee Kappes) focused on the Guided Reading, CCSS implementation and Core Habits of Teaching and Learning. Professional development for all staff include TC Workshop training, REACH literacy partnership site visits and data-focused PLC – focused on MAP data, TC Running Records, exit tickets and OSPI Reading Benchmark Assessments from Grade 1st – 8th. South Shore PK-8 offers a variety of Reading Support programs across our K-8 program. We partner with Powerful School for K-2 Reading Support (decoding, phonics, etc.) and offer pull out intervention support for learners in grades 3-5th. We have focused Reading Support for a target group of 3rd Grade ELL focus students as well as three middle school Reading Support classes for 6th-8th grade. We utilizes the Mimio/Headsprout Reading Program for Grades 3-5 and Read 180 program for middle school.

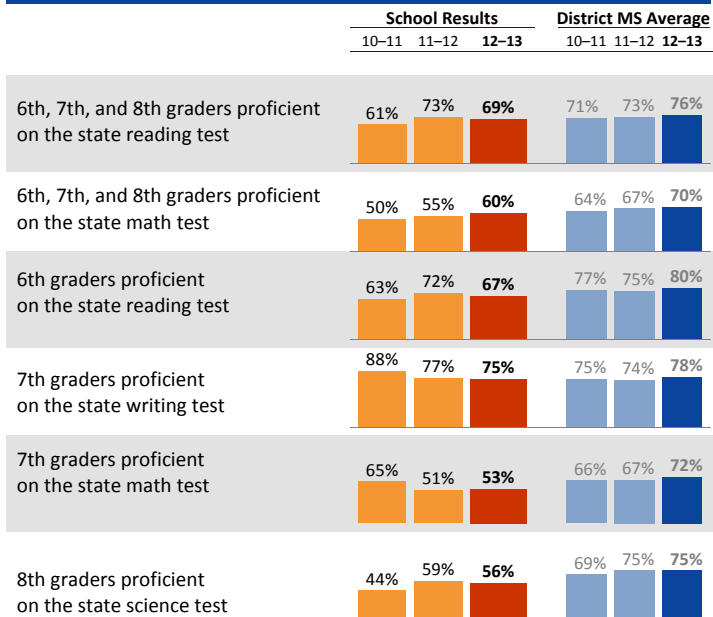

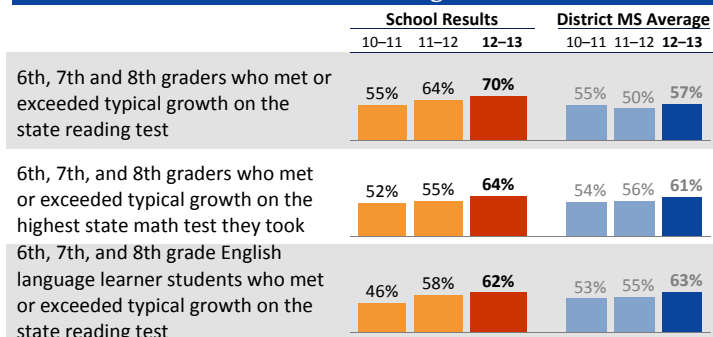

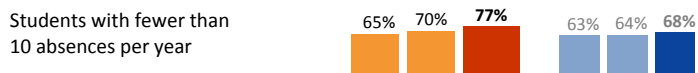


Year-to-Year Growth: Following the Same Students

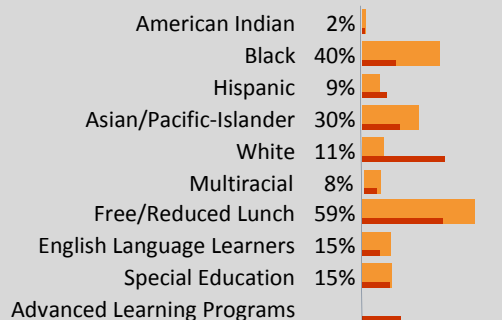
