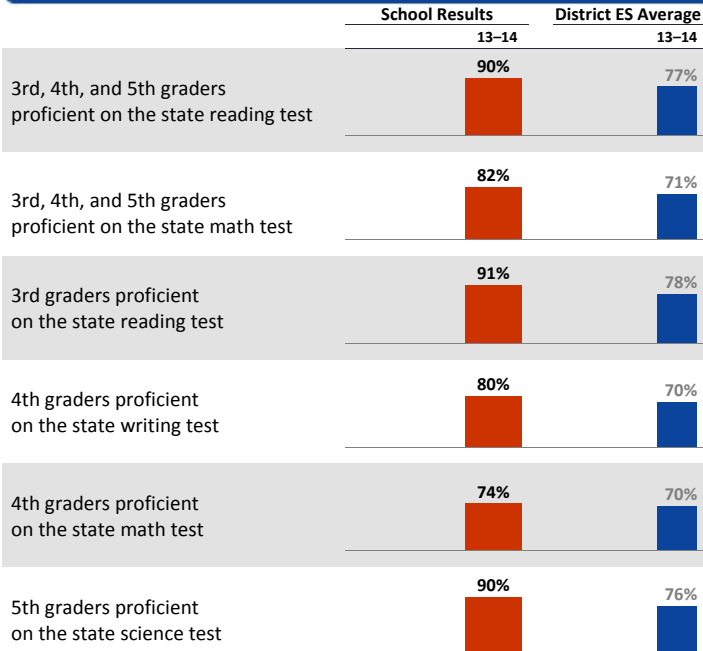

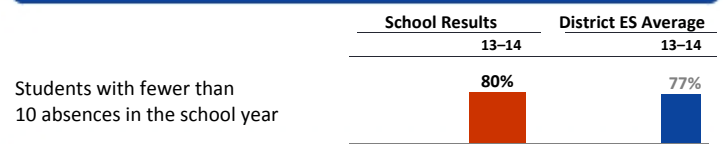

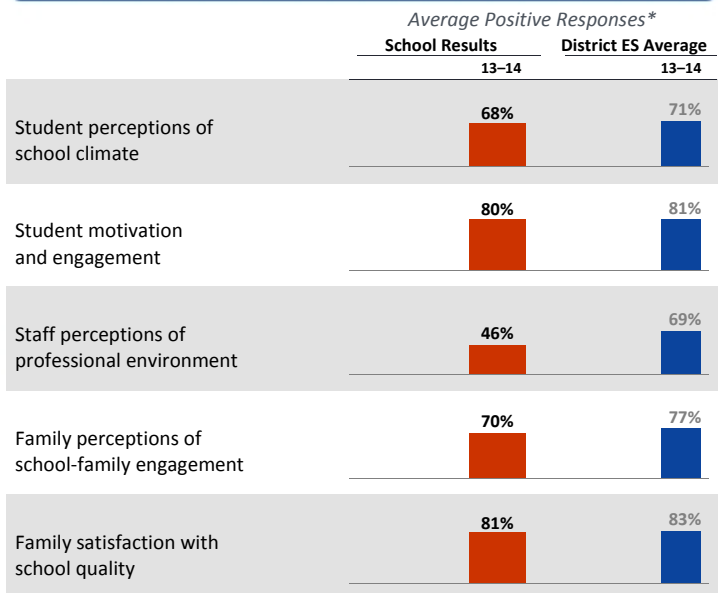

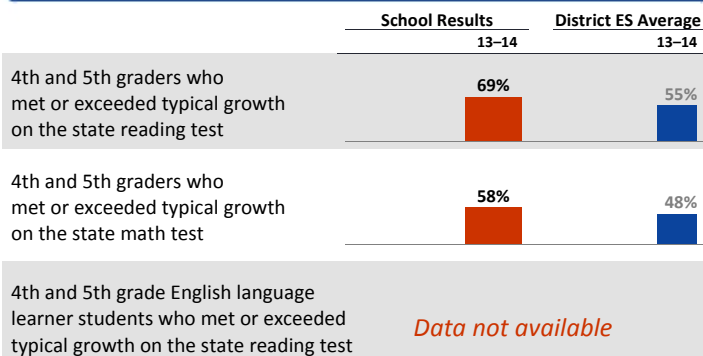

Average Positive Responses*

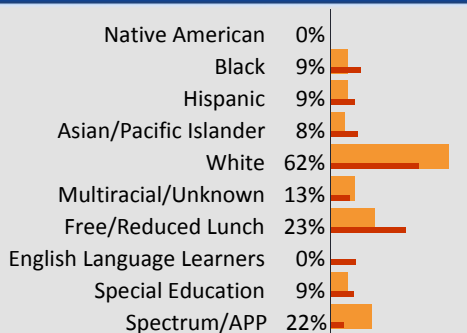
Year-to-Year Growth: Following the Same Students

School Mission Statement

Updated Lafayette Elementary School Mission Statement: Lafayette is committed to educating all students, focused on academic excellence and social responsibility.

School Goals

Working with the BLT to examine data from previous years we decided to focus on Reading and Math. We looked at our student s typical growth last year for Reading and set a goal of 85% of all grade levels making typical growth. For K students we will increase the % of students meeting or exceeding typical growth on the MAP reading test from 71% to 85%, for 1st grade from 71% to 85%, for 2nd grade from 50% to 85%, for 3rd grade from 53% to 85%, for 4th grade from 50% to 85%, and for 5th grade from 60% to 85%. For Math we will increase the % of students proficient on the MSP from 83.5% to 90% for 5th grade, from 79.4%-85% for 4th grade, and from 82.2% to 90% for 3rd grade.

School Description & Plan to Achieve Goals

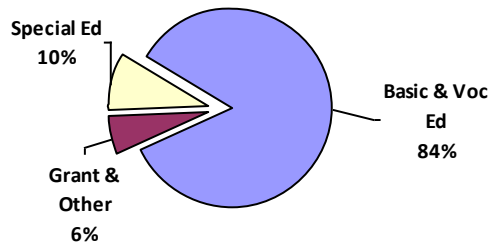
Reading: We have worked to implement a Balanced Literacy Framework using a workshop model. Currently we have 70% of our teachers trained in Readers Workshop and using this model of instruction which allows for differentiated instruction for each student. We have fully implemented common assessments: Running Records, DIBELS, and MAP to provide triangulation of data as well as to identify students working below grade level. MTSS is being put into place to provide a system of interventions for students.

Writing: We are continuing our work in Writer s Workshop for all classrooms. All teachers have received the updated Units which are fully aligned with CCSS. These units focus on persuasive, informative and narrative writing. Throughout every unit of study teachers work on editing, revising and publishing. In addition we have introduced Words Their Way as an option for differentiated spelling assessment in many rooms.

Math: This year 18/23 have been granted a waiver to use enVisions math resource. This resource is fully aligned with CCSS. We provide advanced math instruction for students who are in the top 10% (MAP scores) well above standard on MSP. MAP and Unit assessments will be used to plan curricular focus, form flexible groups, and individualize instruction to meet students needs. Assessments (MAP & MSP) and Teacher recommendation provide candidates for additional small group or individual tutoring. MTSS is being put into place to provide a system of interventions for students.
