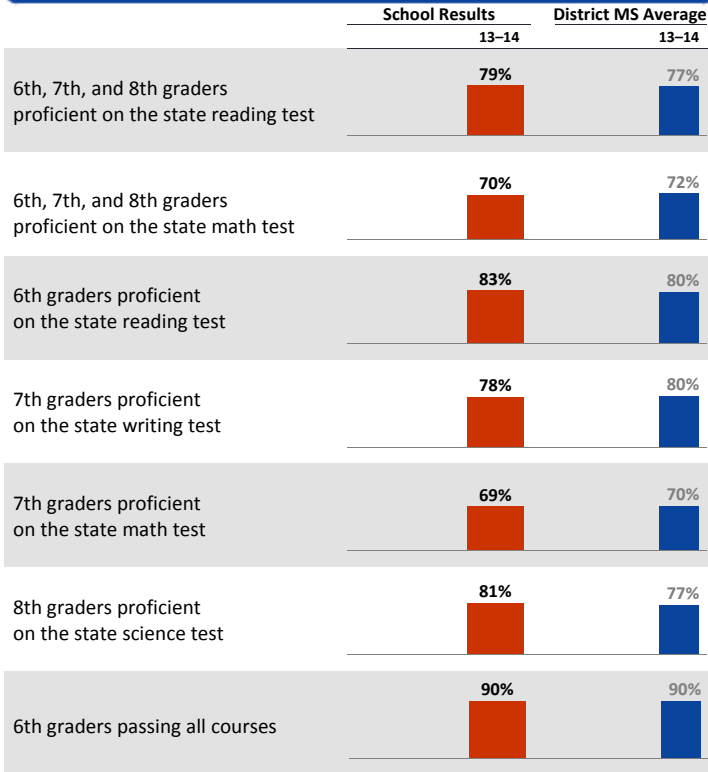

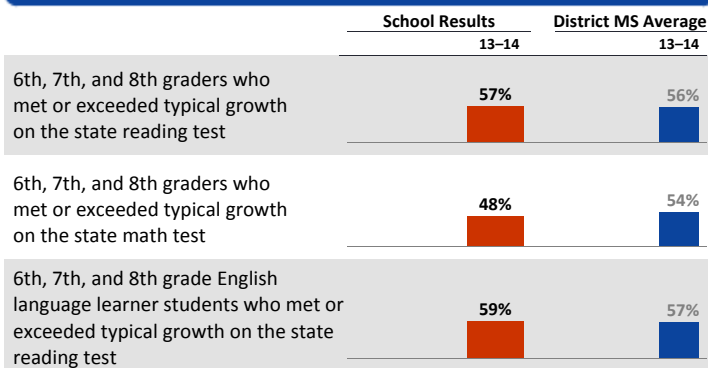

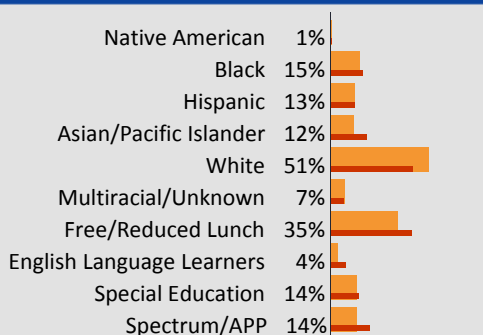


Year-to-Year Growth: Following the Same Students



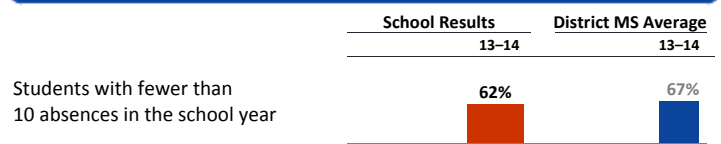
This measure shows how much growth students have achieved compared to similar students across the state in the same grade level.

Attendance



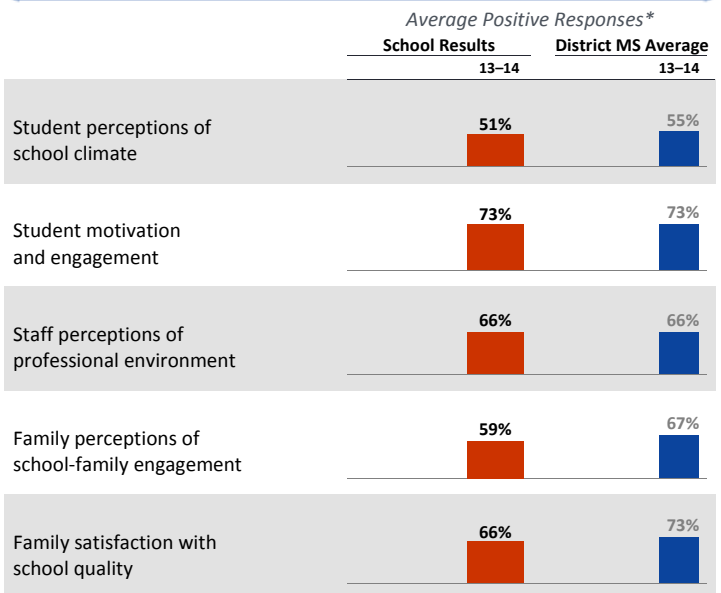

School Goals

In math, we will increase the % of students proficient on the state test from 78% to 83% for 6th grade, from 73% to 78% for 7th grade and from 67% to 72% for 8th grade.

For reading, we will increase the % of students proficient on the state test from 78% to 83% for 6th grade, from 74% to 79% for 7th grade and from 67% to 72% for 8th grade.

For 8th grade students we will increase the % of students proficient on the state science test from 73% to 78%.

School Description & Plan to Achieve Goals

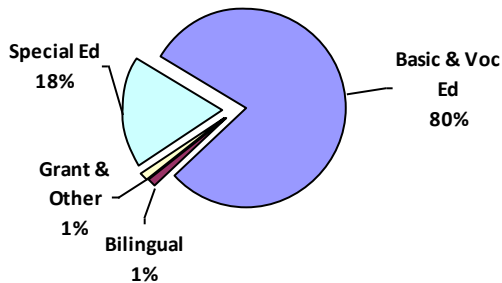
Madison Middle School is a cooperative partnership of students, parents, staff, and community members who have a vision of our school as a challenging and fun place to learn. Madison is a four time winner of the School of Distinction Learning Improvement Award for Washington State. We, at Madison value the development the whole child; their academic, social and emotional well being.

Humanities and reading teachers will continue to create and implement a culturally responsive, differentiated, aligned curriculum and other research based practices. Humanities and reading teachers will use school-wide assessments and teacher-designed, calibrated common assessments to inform instruction. Students not meeting standard will be evaluated for the Read 180 class or another reading intervention class. The humanities department will work together to incorporate the Common Core Standards into the reading curriculum in Language Arts and Social Studies.

Math: Teachers will use best practices to improve math discourse among our students. Teachers will collaborate to collectively identify effective strategies to increase student engagement. Some students who are identified as needing additional support will be given a second math class to provide extra instruction. This year our math department will participate in the OSPI benchmark assessment. This will provide teachers with additional student academic performance data.
