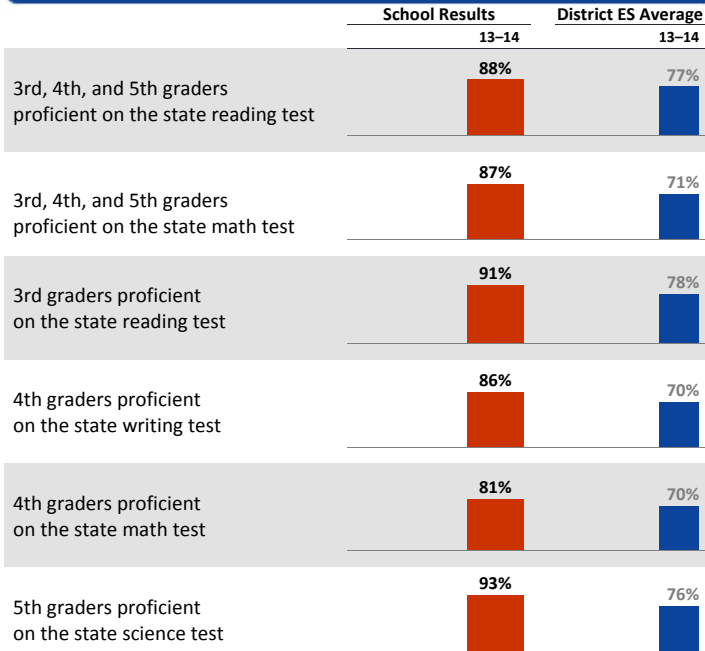

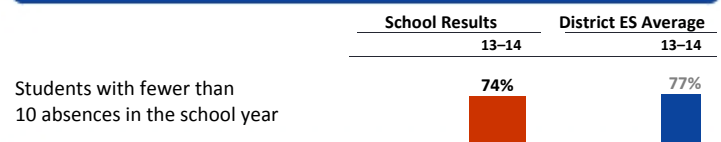

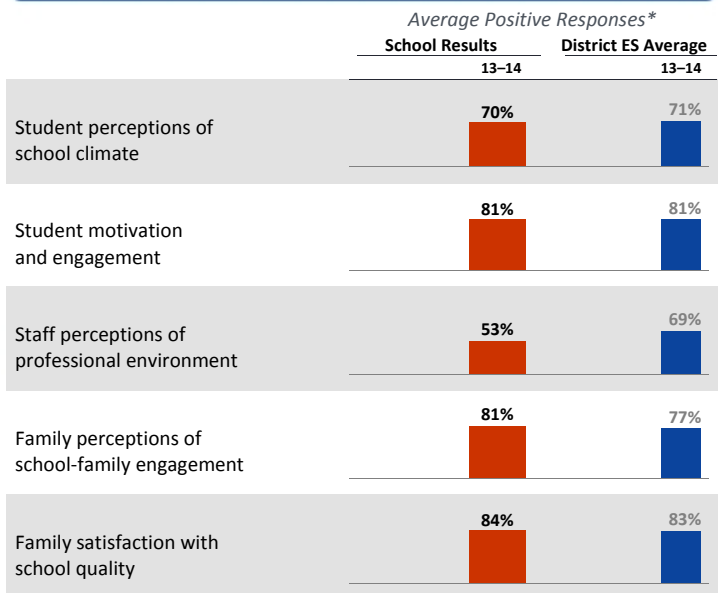

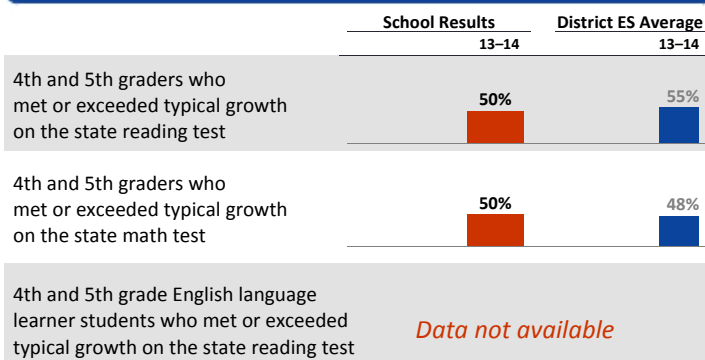

### Student, Family, and Staff School Climate Survey



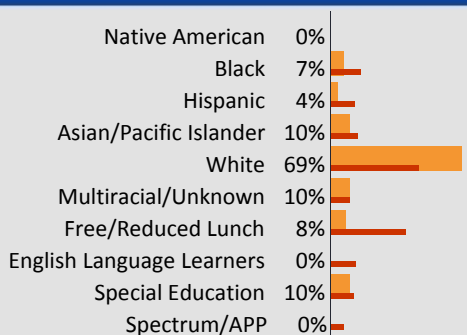
### Year-to-Year Growth: Following the Same Students

**WRITING GOAL:** At least eight-nine percent of our 4th grade students will meet/exceed standards on the 2014 Writing MSP.

**MATH GOAL:** At least eighty-nine percent of our students will meet or exceed typical growth on the Spring 2014 MAP.

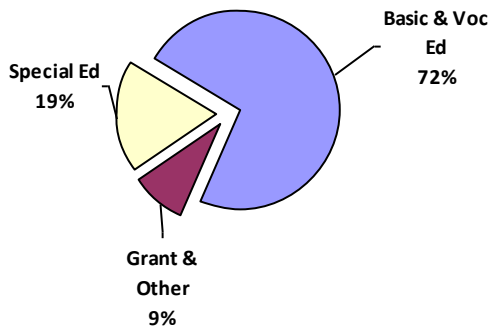
### School Description & Plan to Achieve Goals

**WRITING:** Implement K-5 language arts common core standards using TC Writers Workshop and Words Their Way spelling and vocabulary program. Students and staff analyze results for areas of growth and strength fall, winter, and spring. Teachers collaborate bi-weekly in grade level bands to increase students' writing skills to meet/exceed common core standards. Eighty-nine percent of our fourth graders will be meet/exceed standards on the state's MSP 2014 assessment. Our PTA board BLT representatives and staff share our students' writing progress three times during the year with families.

**MATH:** Differentiated Math Program Grades 1-5 using new Common Core Curriculum Purpose: Allow consistent and aligned differentiation among grades 1-5. Students are taught at their academic need level as well as allowing for more in-depth teaching within mathematic concepts. Our program includes critical thinking, problem solving and enrichment activities for all levels. There is flexible grouping of students for each unit using pre-assessments. Those who are proficient in the skills/content are taught one grade level up. Everyone uses the common core EnVision 2013 math curriculum. All learners benefit from targeted math instruction at their appropriate level of understanding with students in their same grade.
