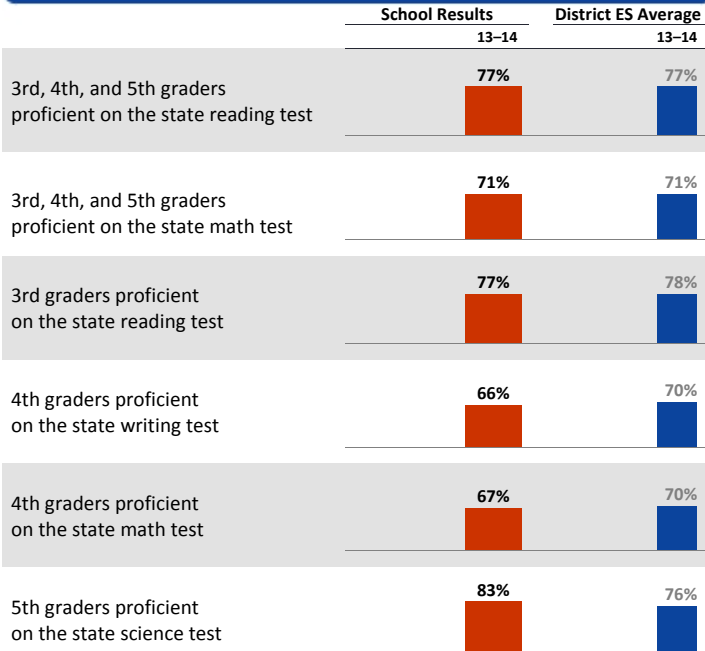

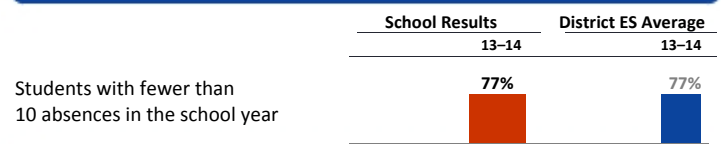

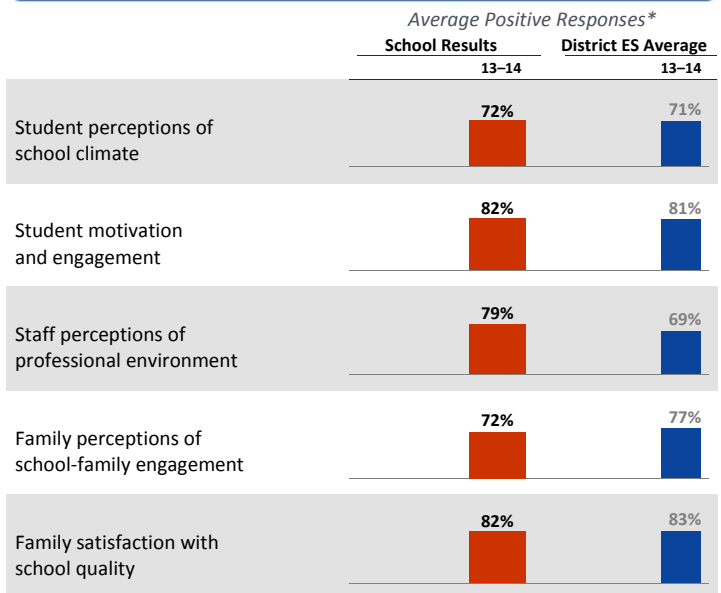

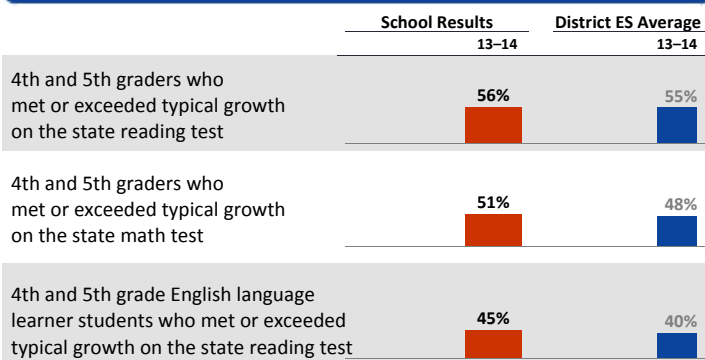

Average Positive Responses*

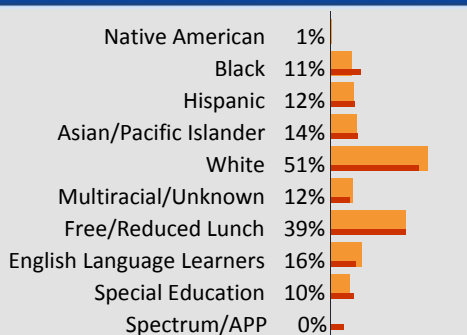
Year-to-Year Growth: Following the Same Students

School Mission Statement

Olympic View is a community of joyful, active learners who are supported and challenged to reach their full intellectual, social, emotional and physical potential.

School Goals

For intermediate students (grades 3-5) will increase their proficiency percentage on the reading MSP from 81% to 85%. For intermediate students (grades 3-5) will increase their proficiency percentage on the mathematics MSP from 65% to 85%. For intermediate students (grades 4-5) will increase their proficiency percentage on the mathematics MSP from 33% to 55%. For 80% of all students will make annual typical growth on the common district reading and mathematics assessment (MAP). For 3rd grade students receiving Free and Reduced Lunch we will increase the percentage of students proficient on the MSP from 50% to 72%.

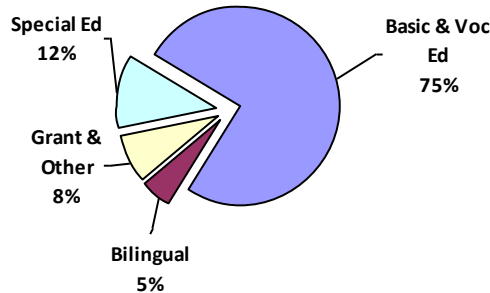
School Description & Plan to Achieve Goals

Olympic View is a K-5 school in the Maple Leaf neighborhood of northeast Seattle. Strong family and community support enables us to provide students with a rigorous, enriching, supportive learning environment. Below are some of the strategies we are using to pursue our academic achievement goals: • Grade Level teams will unpack the standards that tell what students should know, understand and be able to do (content), how well students must do these things (performance), and which instructional strategies, techniques or recommended activities (curriculum) should be used.

- Grade level teams design performance assessments and tasks that are differentiated based on the individual learner.
- We assign tutors to work with struggling students to help them master essential concepts and skills
- Our Reading/Math specialist provides pull-out, push-in, and extended day instruction for struggling readers.
- Math instruction for grades 1-5 provides additional opportunities for differentiation, support, and challenge. It enables us to provide small group instruction within grade levels, as well as a “Walk to Math” Advanced Learning Opportunity (ALO) option for students ready to move ahead one grade level in math.
