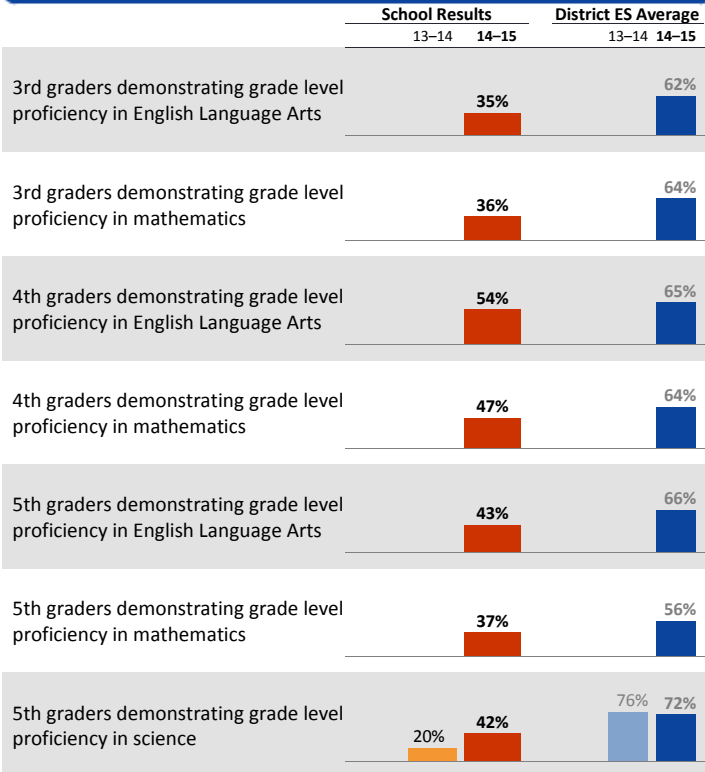

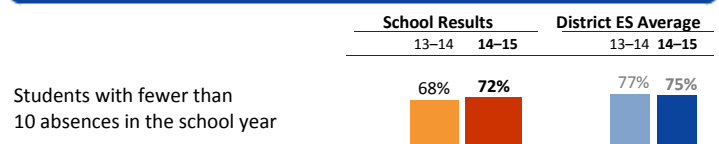

### Attendance



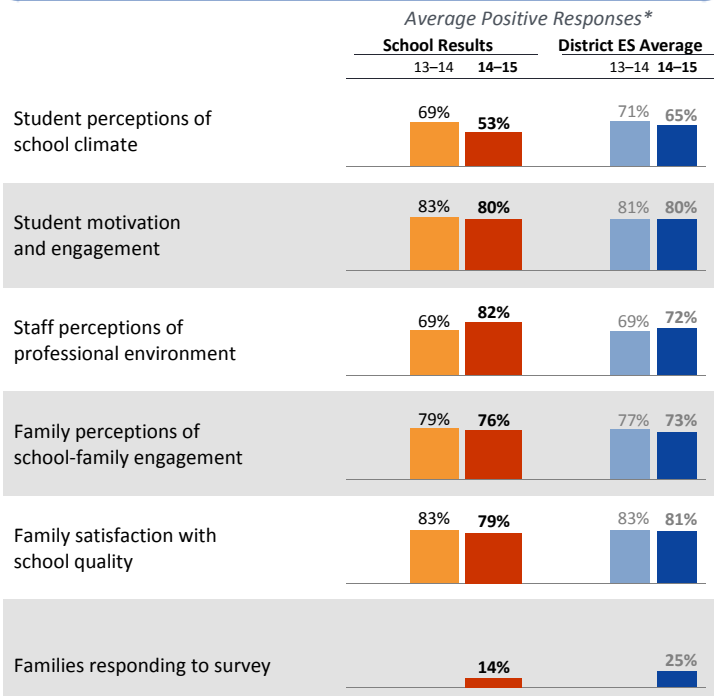

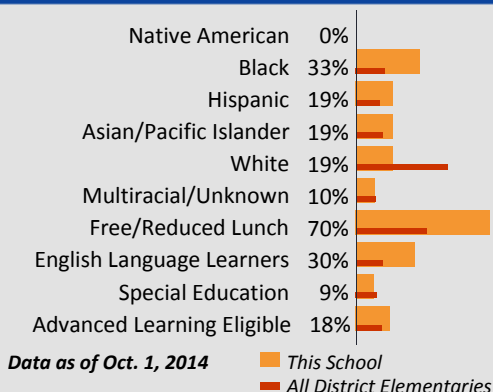

### School Goals

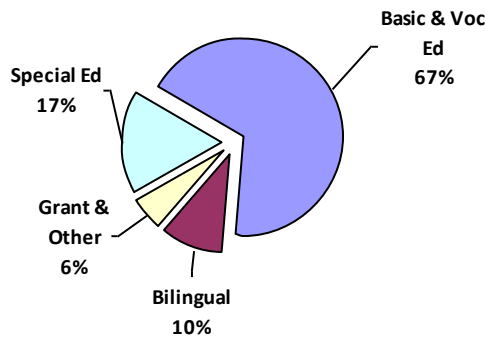
At Hawthorne our goal is to provide an academically enriched school environment where students can be successful, have enriched learning experiences and develop 21st Century Leadership skills. Additionally our goal is to promote and ensure the continuous academic growth of all students in meeting or exceeding proficiency standards on the Measurement of Academic Progress and Smarter Balance Assessments.

### School Description & Plan to Achieve Goals

Hawthorne is a multicultural, multilingual and multiracial learning community that celebrates diversity, challenge and new possibilities. Our school program includes Integrated Spectrum, English Language Learner and Special Education Inclusion classrooms. We are a Creative Approach School that provides students with Project Based Learning opportunities aligned to academic standards through our STEAM Program (Science, Technology, Arts, and Mathematics). The focus of the STEAM model is to further enhance student learning by integrating STEM coursework with the Arts through real world project based learning experiences. Our PBIS and RULER programs support school wide expectations for creating a positive learning environment where students can be successful, and confident in their academic skills and problem solving abilities. Differentiated instruction is used to meet the needs of all learners. Hawthorne uses a Balanced Literacy Approach to effectively differentiate literacy instruction for a full range of learners. Readers Workshop model is used in Kindergarten through 5th grade classrooms to develop students as readers and writers. Math Workshop and Walk to Math models are implemented in 1st through 5th grades to address student academic needs and enrich learning experiences in mathematics. Teachers are provided with daily common planning time as well as extended time to work in Professional Learning Communities. All Hawthorne students participate in our Arts program. Art is integrated throughout the core curriculum utilizing music, visual and performing arts. Extended day academic enrichment learning opportunities are offered to Hawthorne students in partnership with Powerful Schools as part of a state 21st Century Learning Grant. Additionally, students may receive extended learning and enrichment opportunities during the summer through our partnership with Community Day School Association (CDSA). Hawthorne enjoys a robust Family and Community Engagement program that is inclusive of our Family Support Worker, ELL staff as well as parents and community members.
