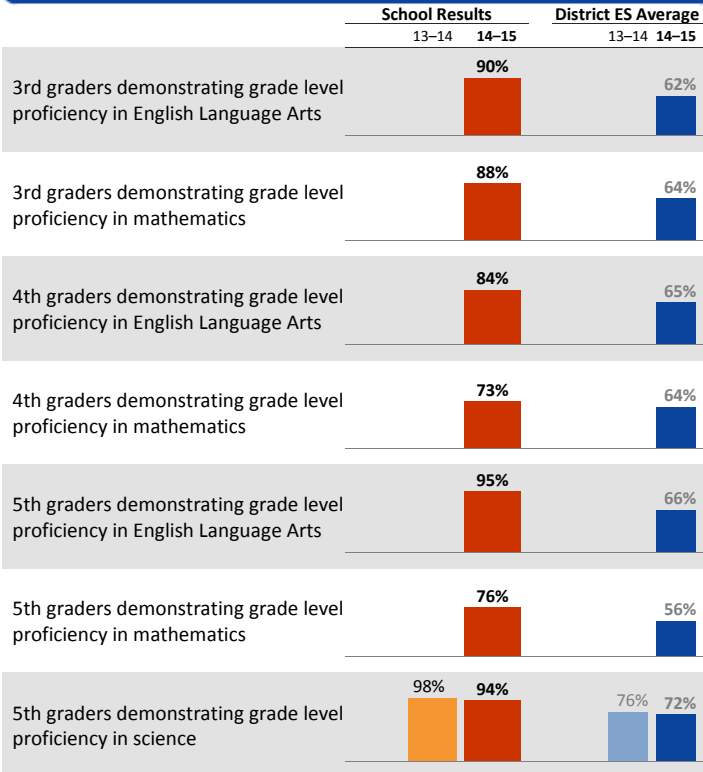

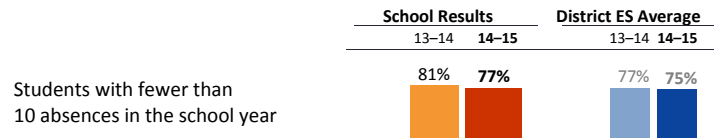

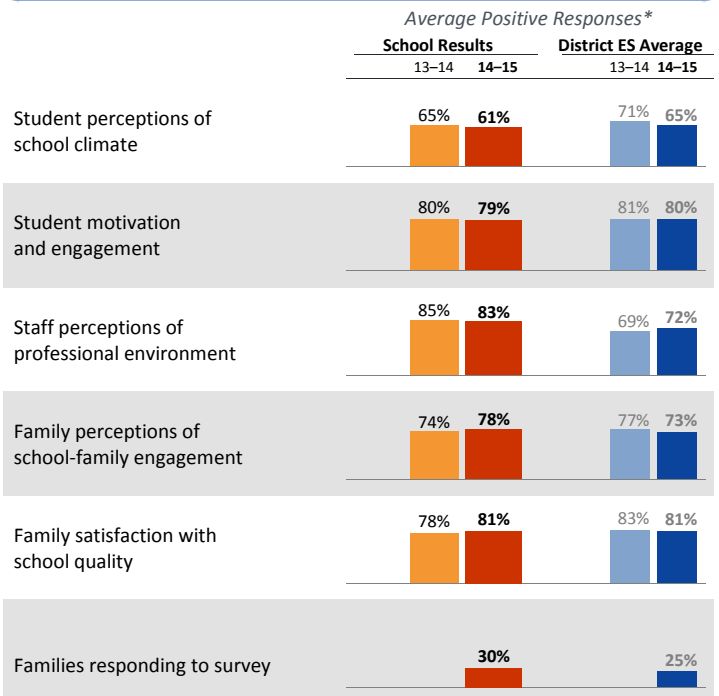

### Student, Family, and Staff School Climate Survey

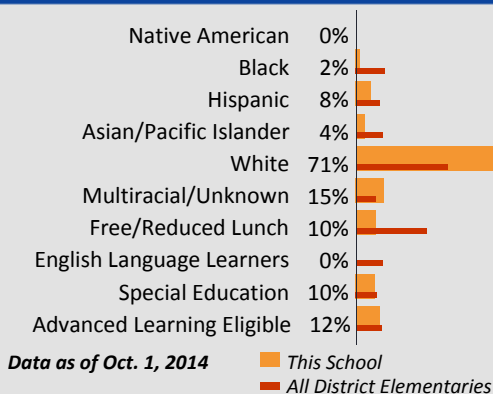

### School Mission Statement

North Beach provides rigorous and differentiated instruction that challenges each student to achieve to the best of his or her ability. ### School Goals

For the 2015-2016 school-year we will focus our goals on Reading at North Beach. This goal is to increase the percent of students meeting or exceeding standard at each grade level. The Measure of Academic Progress (MAP) will be used to measure annual growth. This assessment will be given in the fall and in the spring. Teachers will use frequent classroom based assessments to measure growth on a weekly basis. They will also use the Columbia Teacher’s College Reading Assessment to find each student’s strengths and areas of need.

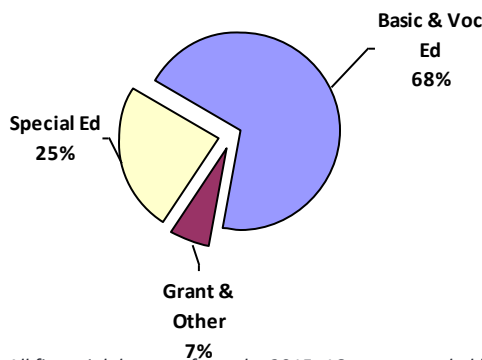
### School Description & Plan to Achieve Goals
