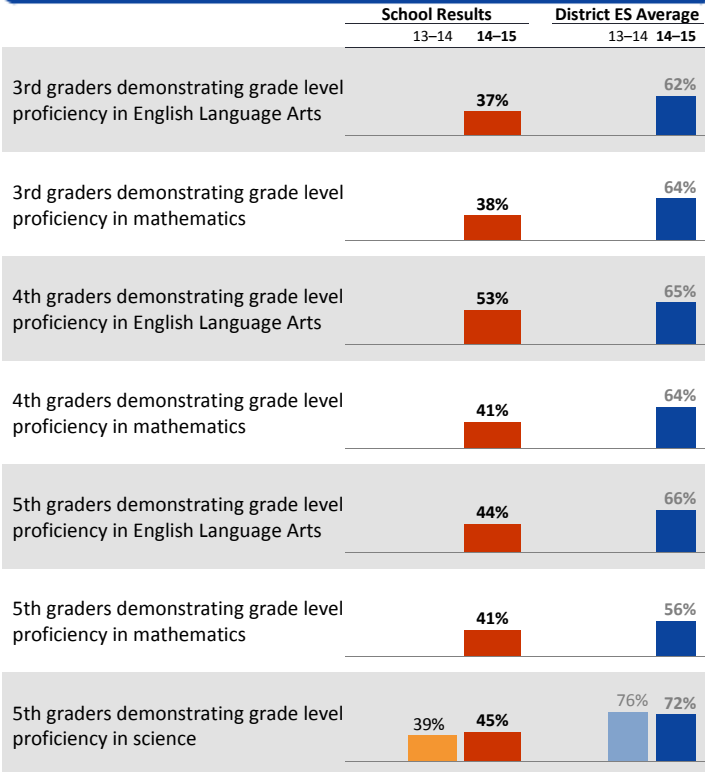

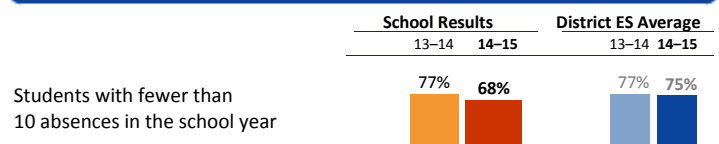

Attendance



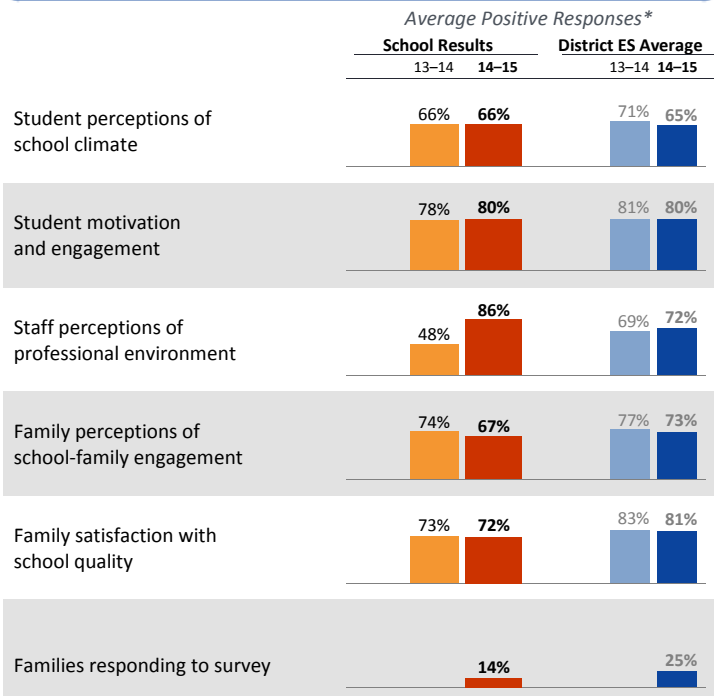

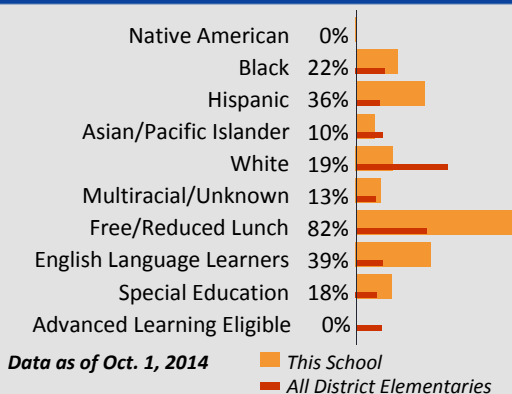

Mission Statement for Northgate Elementary The Northgate community is a team of parents, staff, and students dedicated to creating a positive and nurturing learning environment, resulting in systematically meeting small measurable goals to close opportunity gaps that are present for students.

School Goals

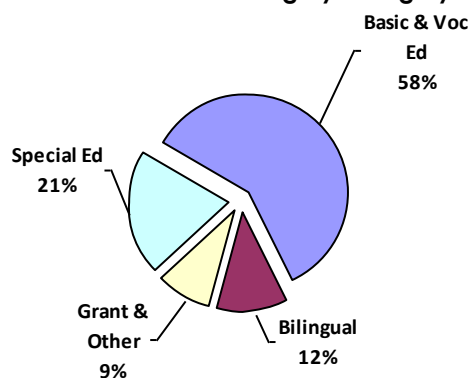
Goals for Northgate Elementary For intermediate students, we will increase the percentage of students proficient on the state reading test from 55% to 65% and from 42% to 60% for math. For 4th grade students we will increase the percentage of students’ proficient on the state writing test from 19% to 40%. For all students we will increase the percentage of students with fewer than ten absences per year from 74% to 80%.

School Description & Plan to Achieve Goals

Description & Plan to Achieve Goals for Northgate Elementary Northgate teachers will improve reading instruction by continuing to Common Core Standards with a Balanced Literacy model. Guided by a Literacy Specialist, teachers will identify specific reading skills that students need, demonstrate their use, and provide opportunities for students to apply them. There will be intentional assessment, use of leveled libraries, guided reading groups and conferring. We are working to make sure that all intervention support aligns with classroom instruction. We accomplish this by all staff participating in professional development the Stanford ELL MOOC, which is aligned to support our work with all students, but specifically English Language Learners. Northgate teachers will improve math instruction by focusing on using clear teaching points, student engagement strategies, math talks and rigorous intellectual work. Teachers will also identify struggling students through data review meetings and create action plans based on need. Specific skill needs will be provided during 30 minute daily instruction. We will offer extra learning time through after school clubs and the technology resources of STMath and Dream Box as well as intervention through LLI, System 44, Foundations and Read 180 for Academic Intervention.
