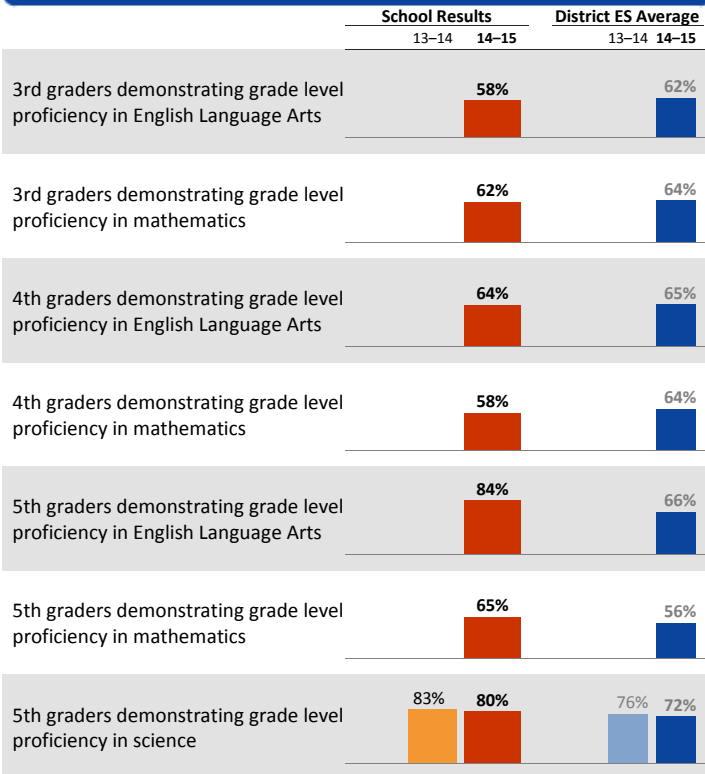

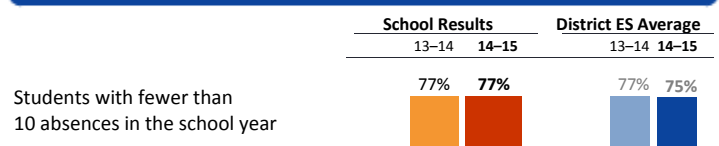

Attendance



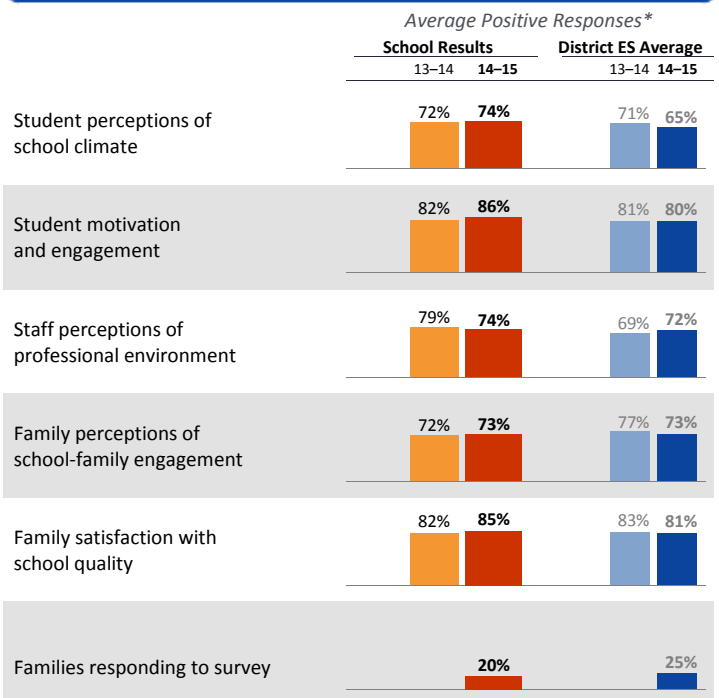

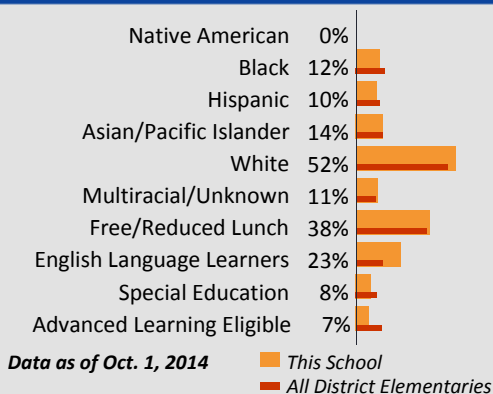

Students will increase their proficiency percentage on the Smarter Balanced Assessment:

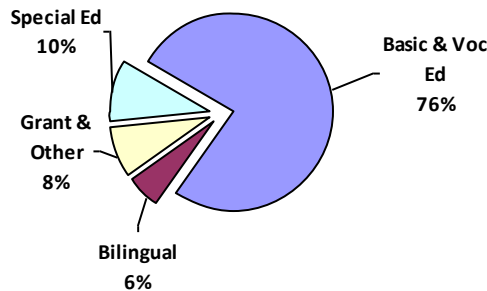
- ELA Grade 3 from 66% to 72%
