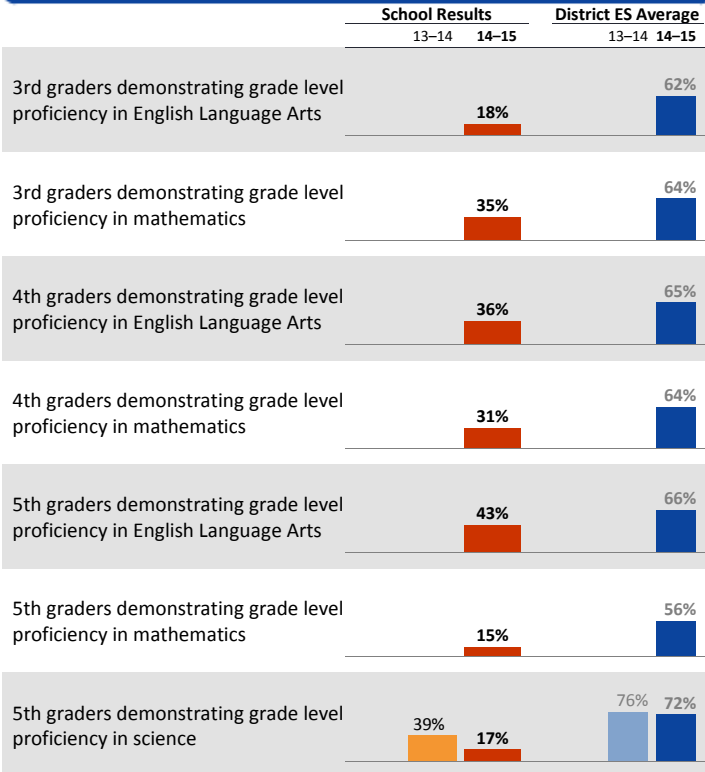

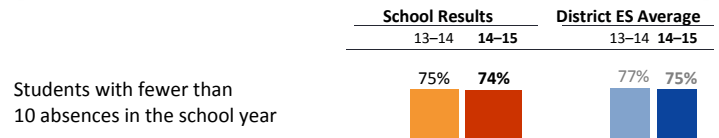

Attendance



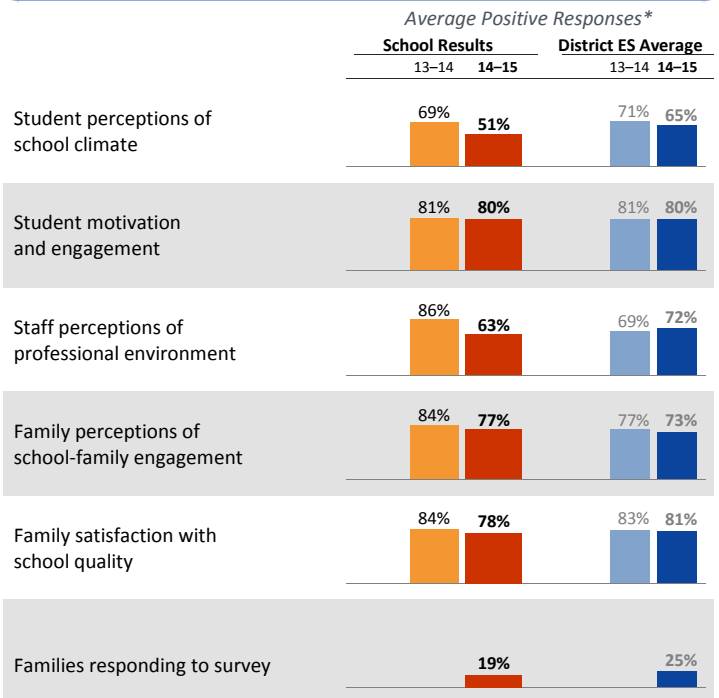

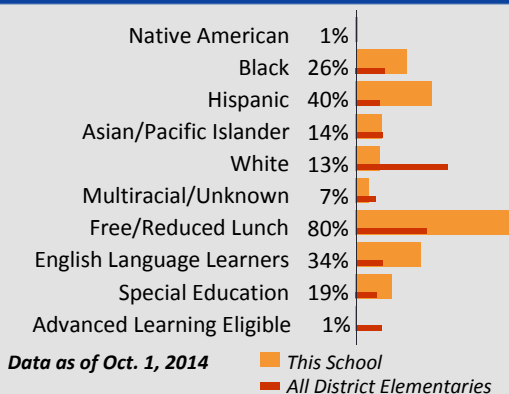

School Mission Statement

We foster a climate of compassion, academic excellence, problem solving, creativity, and cultural awareness where the school, families, and the community are working together for the social, emotional, physical, and intellectual development of each child.

School Goals

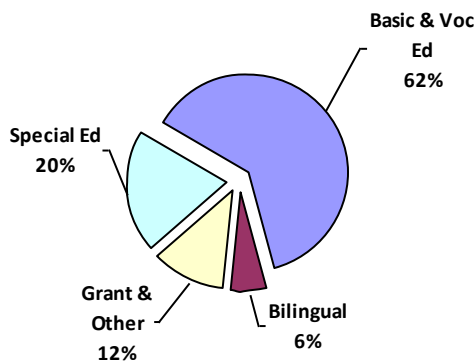
Roxhill’s intermediate students (grades 3-5) will increase their proficiency percentage on the English Language Arts SBA by 16% from 34% to 50%. In the Math SBA, intermediate students will increase their proficiency percentage by 21% from 29% to 50%. Roxhill’s Primary students (K-2) will increase the number of students meeting proficiency on the MAP assessment by 20%. 70% of our K-5th grade students will have fewer than 5 absences in the first and second trimester.

School Description & Plan to Achieve Goals

Roxhill Elementary is a full service community school committed to the success of each and every student academically and social emotionally. A full service community school is both a place and a set of partnerships between the school and other community resources. Its integrated focus on academics, health and social services, youth and community development and community engagement leads to improved student learning, stronger families and healthier communities. This is not a program, but rather a collaborative approach to supporting student success. It is not just a set of services, but rather, a different way of doing business, one in which all stakeholders are in authentic relationships and have a shared vision for success. At Roxhill, we have the Families and Education Levy and Collaborative Schools for Innovation and Success Grant. These opportunities enable us to work in partnership with the University of Washington, Communities in Schools, City Year, Neighborcare and other community partners to provide comprehensive, wrap-around support for our students and families.
