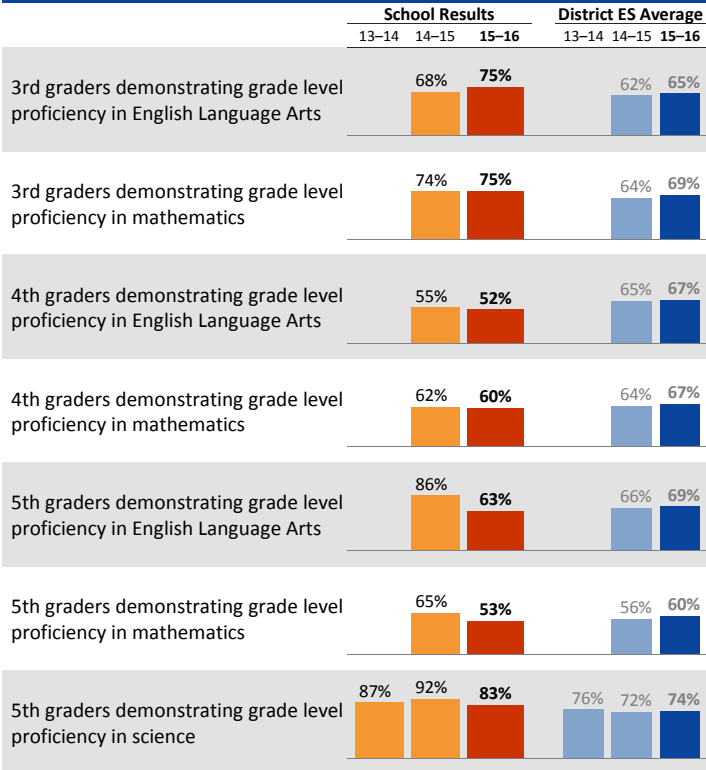

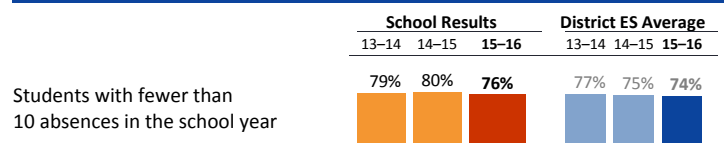

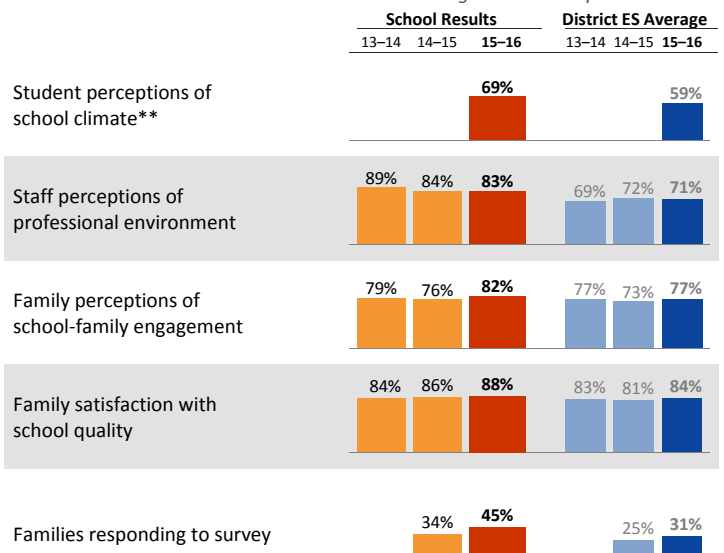

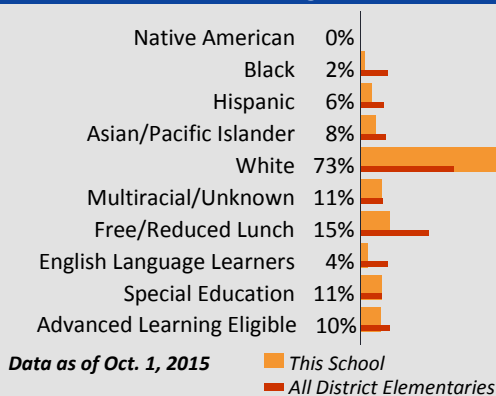
Average Positive Responses*

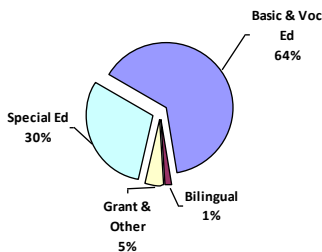

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School Goals	<p>Every Green Lake graduate will be prepared for success in the next phase of their educational process and become a citizen of the world.</p>
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School Description & Plan to Achieve Goals	<p>Green Lake is an open concept, multi-aged school serving students P-5 in general education and special education. We currently have five highly effective programs in special education for many types of learning challenges. Kindergarten co-teaches as two sets of two teachers in a big classroom. This is year four of this approach and data is showing that the approach is highly successful. Our multi-age groupings are first/second for primary and three/four/five for intermediate which runs on a block schedule. MAGIC is a multi-age, grade level approach to teaching and is in year six. Students in intermediate level, block for science, math, PE and art and then spend the other half of their day as a multi-age class to learn literacy. Students also receive swimming, vocal music during the year. Green Lake's goals align with our CSIP plan and can be viewed on Seattle Public Schools website. Green Lake staff is highly qualified and dedicated. PTA is supportive and involved in the school.</p> <p>Best practices include increasing students' active engagement in their learning and differentiating instruction based on student' readiness, skill levels, and learning goals.</p>
