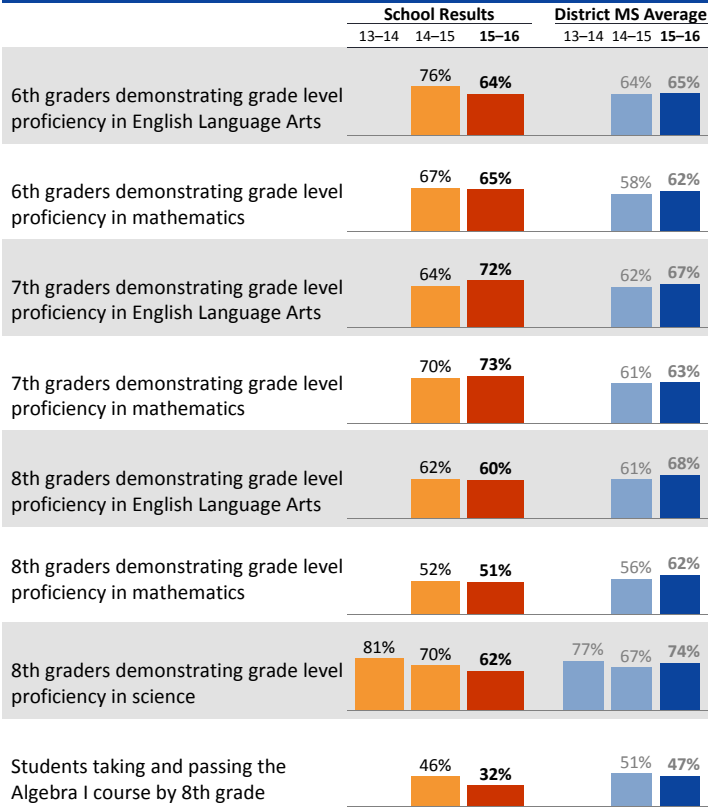

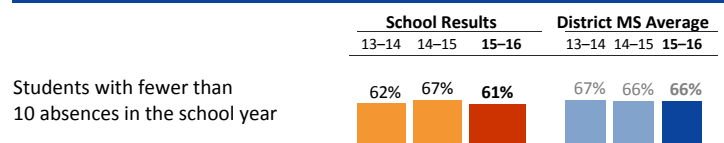

Attendance



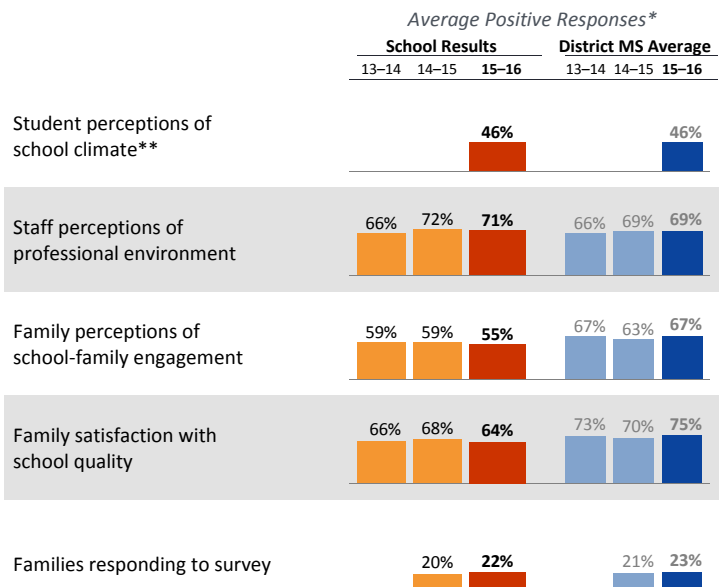

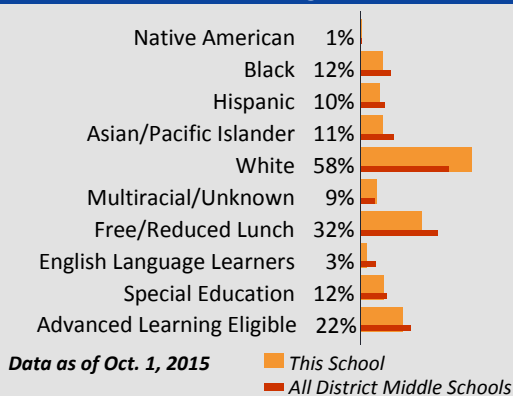

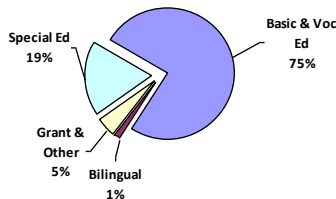
School Mission Statement Focus on Learning, Every Student, Every Adult, Every Day, Growth for All!

School Goals A Sub Group of African American male students (25) will receive a c grade or higher in their core academic courses of Language Arts and Math by June of 2017. Seventy Three percent or more of the Madison Middle School 8th grade students will meet standards on the 2017 Washington State Student Assessment. All Madison Students will increase their performance level by 5% or more on the 2017 SBA when compared to their 2016 SBA results. Madison Middle School will improve its students survey results on the 2017 climate survey.

School Description & Plan to Achieve Goals Madison Middle School is a cooperative partnership of students, parents, staff, and community members who have a vision of our school as a challenging and fun place to learn. Madison is a four time winner of the School of Distinction Learning Improvement Award for Washington State. We, at Madison value the development the whole child; their academic, social and emotional well-being. Language Arts and Social Studies teachers will continue to develop units of study aligned to the SPS Scope and Sequence, teachings lessons that are culturally responsive, differentiated, and based on best practices. Language Arts and Social Studies teachers will use school-wide assessments and teacher-designed, calibrated common assessments to inform instruction. Students not meeting standard will be evaluated for the Read 180 intervention class. Math teachers will use best practices to improve math discourse among our students. Teachers will collaborate to collectively identify effective strategies to increase student engagement. Some students who are identified as needing additional support will be given a second math class to provide extra instruction.
