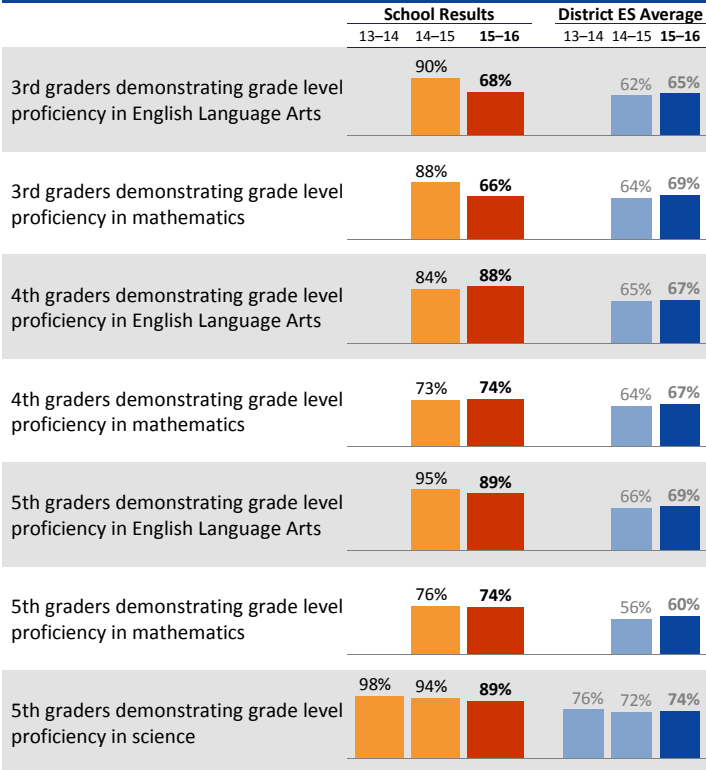

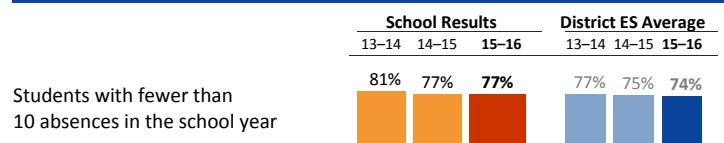

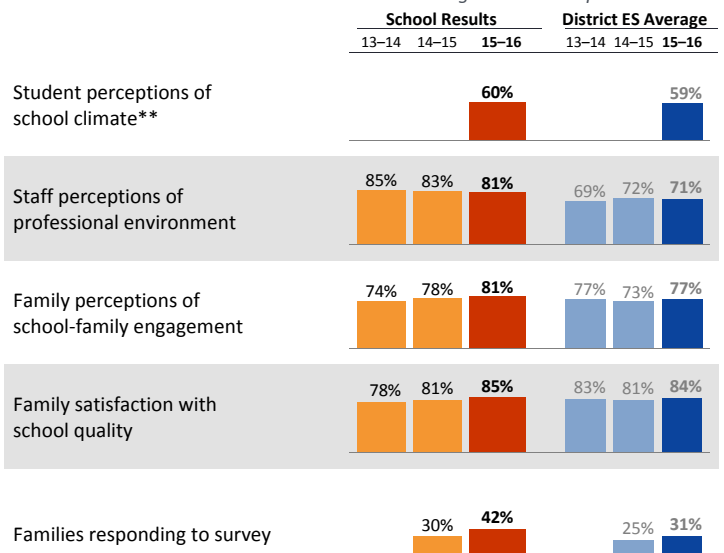

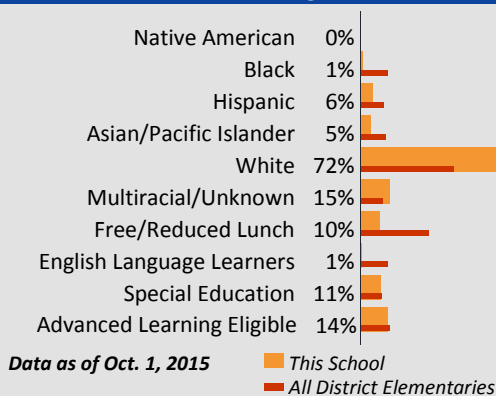
Average Positive Responses*

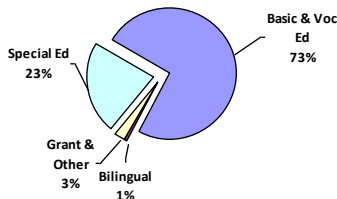

School Description & Plan to Achieve Goals We will address the needs of all children in the school, particularly low-achieving students by using these research-based best instructional practices to close the achievement gap. We will: examine data frequently in our PLCs and make data-informed decisions; collaborate and share ideas around best instructional practices; model and engage students with manipulatives; implement Math Talks; plan for frequent formative assessments; post & communicate clear learning targets; provide students with anchor charts; work on math facts practice; teach math vocabulary; use the "Gradual Release of Responsibility" Model; align our Learning Targets to CCSS-M; teach students in whole groups and small differentiated groups; provide enrichment and reteach opportunities to all students.
