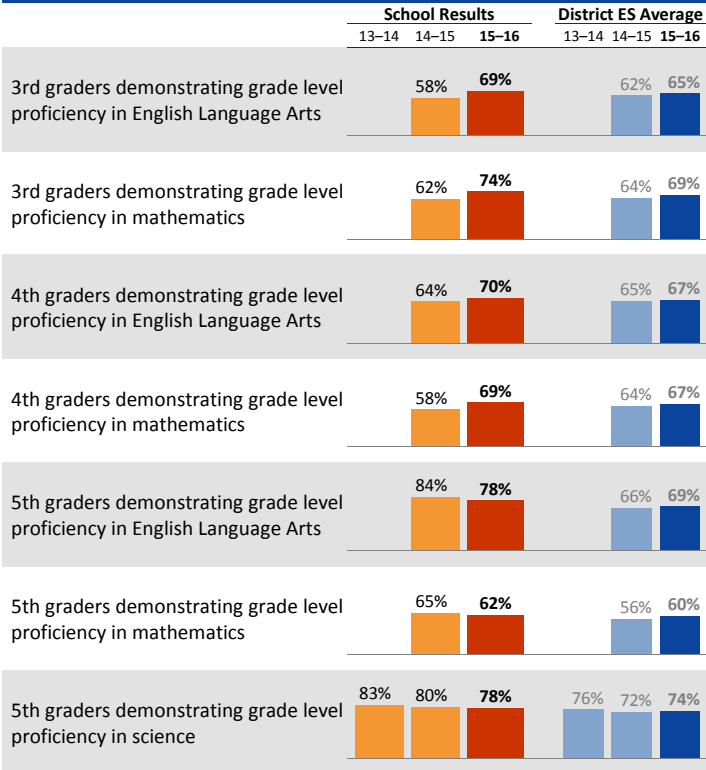

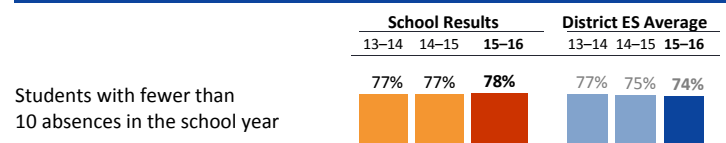

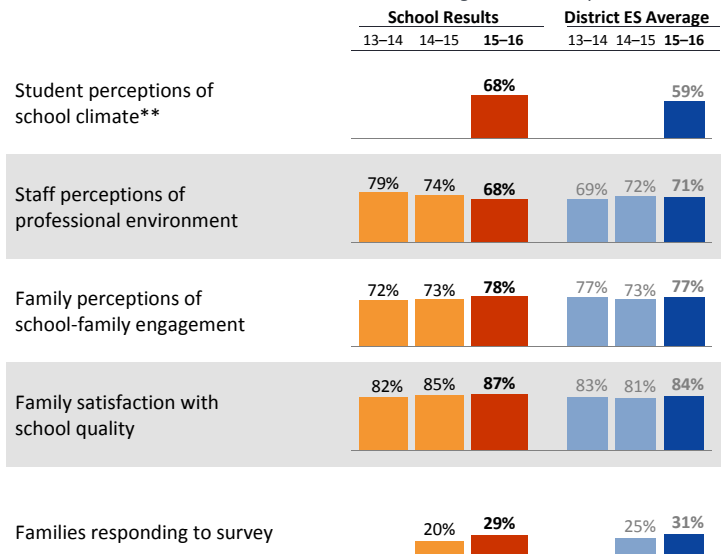

### Student, Family, and Staff School Climate Survey

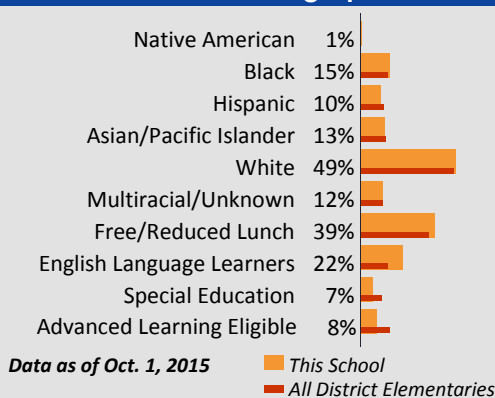
Average Positive Responses\*

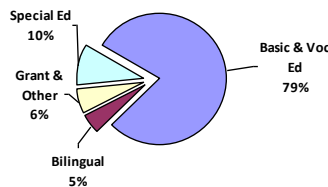
**School Mission Statement** Olympic View is a community of joyful, active learners who are supported and challenged to reach their full intellectual, social, emotional and physical potential.
