I understand that the staff will have high expectations of my child, and they will follow all of the Madison School rules. Behaviors that students exhibit after school may have consequences during the school day (detention, suspension, etc).

I understand that once I have registered my student in MOST activities it is my responsibility to ensure my student attends these programs. MOST staff and volunteers will take daily attendance at each activity, and it is my student's responsibility to be in their assigned activity. I can call the MOST coordinator to check on their attendance.

I have discussed the appropriate behavior with my child and I understand that my child must follow all school rules while in the program, or he/she will face discipline under normal school policy.

I release the MOST Cosponsors, their employees, volunteers, agents, directors or officers from all liability to my child or to me for any loss or damage to property or injury or death to my child, whether caused by ordinary negligence by the MOST Cosponsors or by others, and I agree not to sue them.

Please note: Madison Middle School is a closed campus. Students are not allowed to leave school grounds and/or return at their leisure, they must remain on campus to participate in programs. Visitors and volunteers must always check in at the main office!
