# **SENIOR Planning Information 2025-2026**

## 4-Year College/University Application Resources:

One application is sent to all participating institutions. The student requests recommendations from teachers and their school counselor through the application. Counselor completes the *School report* which includes GPA, class rank, and a *Counselor recommendation* (which includes a letter of rec), if needed. BHS reports weighted rank (decile/percent), unweighted GPA (4.0 highest). Transcript is attached electronically by counselor.

#### **College/University specific application:**

See the college/university's website for more information. Many schools offer options for using the Common app or their college specific application. Often the college specific application is easier/faster to complete, get a faster admissions decision (i.e. Central, WSU, Western), and is a simpler choice if you are not applying to other schools on the Common App.

#### Letters of Recommendation:

To request a letter of recommendation from your school counselor, complete the *Letter of Recommendation Student Information Sheet* (Microsoft Form) online at least 2 weeks before your earliest application deadline. It can be found on the BHS website -> Resources -> Counseling Center Dashboard -> Applying to College -> Letters of Recommendation

If requesting a letter of recommendation from a teacher, you need to ask them if they would be willing to write you one (don't assume – they sometimes reach their limit and aren't able to write more).

#### Class Rank:

On a weighted scale, will be given as a decile (i.e. top 10%, top 20%, etc.), available October 1. Contact BHS Counseling Secretary via email or drop-in to the Counseling Office.

#### ACT or SAT Test Scores: www.collegeboard.org

Most colleges and universities, including ALL Washington State public and private colleges, are **test optional** and **do not require test scores** as part of the application process. All Seniors are pre-registered for the school day SAT on October 8 and 9; Students with College Board approved accommodations will test the following week. If you choose to send your scores, you must order and send them directly to the institutions from your ACT or SAT account.

FAFSA/WASFA: Available starting October 1

To be eligible for financial aid, all Seniors should complete one (not both) of the following:

- o FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid) https://studentaid.gov/h/apply-for-aid/fafsa or
- WASFA (Washington Application for State Financial Aid) www.wsac.wa.gov/wasfa
- Complete the WASFA if you are undocumented, don't qualify for federal financial aid due to immigration status or don't want to be considered for federal aid. All other students should complete the FAFSA.
- Families will use tax documents from their 2024 taxes (fill out the application for 2026-2027)
