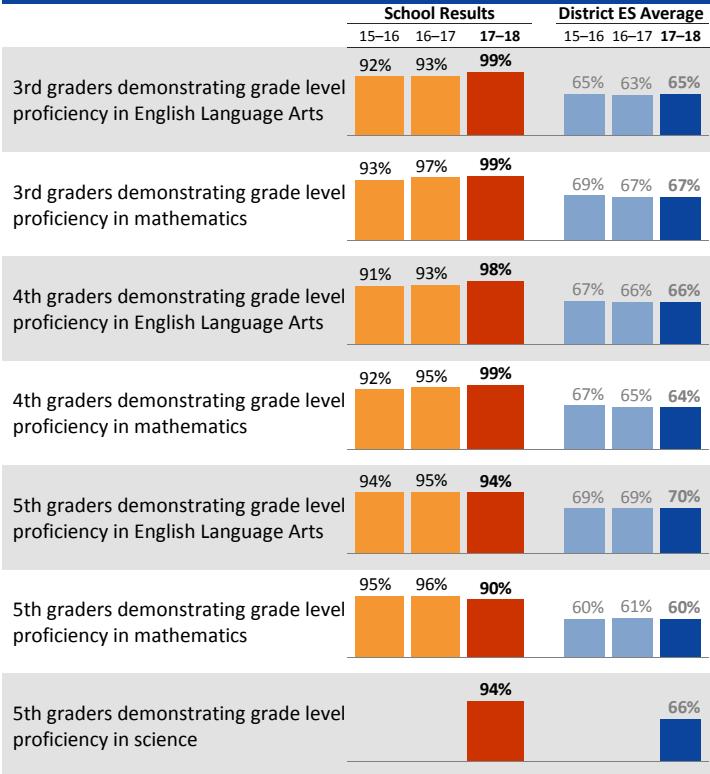

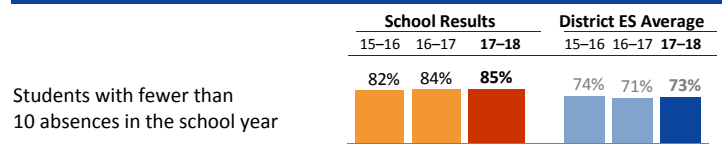

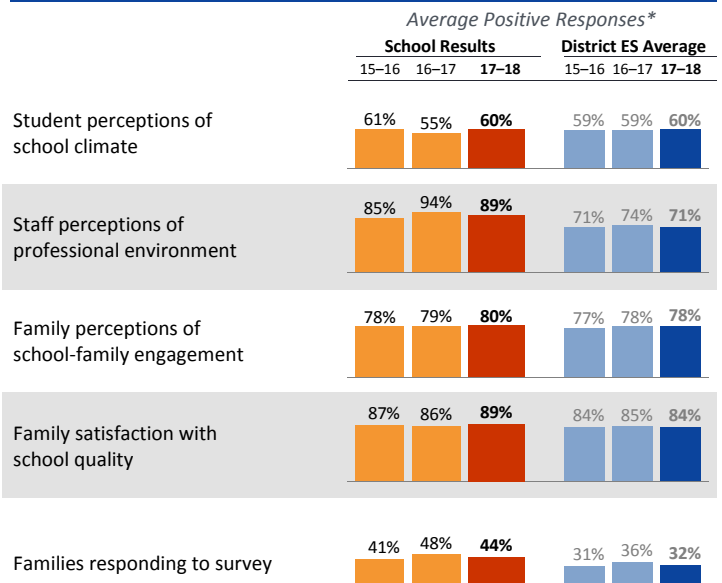

### Attendance

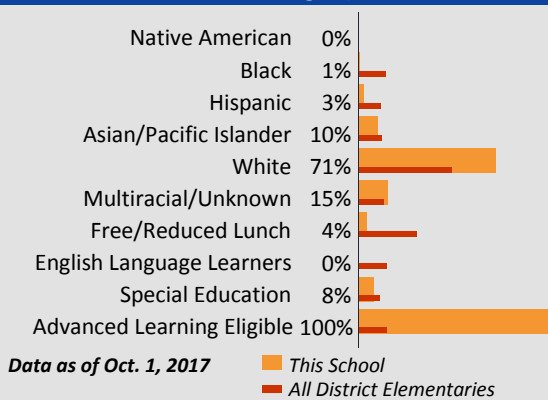


### Student, Family, and Staff School Climate Survey

### School Goals

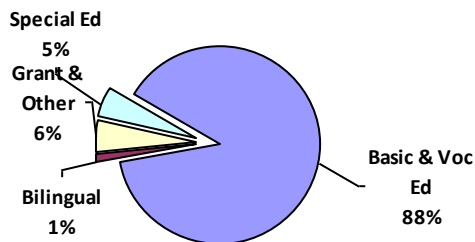
Cascadia provides a stimulating and culturally enriching experience through a rigorous curriculum that integrates technology, science, and the arts. Our goal is to instill a life-long passion for learning in an emotionally supportive environment that will enable students to contribute their wisdom, compassion, and leadership in a rapidly changing world.

### School Description & Plan to Achieve Goals

Literacy: Center for Collaborative Classroom curriculum is implemented one grade above same age peers in classrooms at all grade levels to provide appropriate challenge for students. Additionally, students in grades four and five participate a specialization model. Teachers specialize in Language Arts and Social Studies for half the day. Our writing specialist and Special Education staff support learners in writing at all grade levels. Math: Students in grades 1-3 participate in a Walk-to-Math program. Instruction is differentiated based on pace and individual student need. This differentiation model supports both advanced learners and students in need of individualized instruction. Students in grades four and five use the newly adopted middle school math curriculum, Envision2.0. Teachers specialize in math and science to provide high level instruction that meet the needs of advanced learners. Social Learning: Social emotional literacy is also being taught throughout the school using the RULER Approach to Social and Emotional Learning. Recognizing, Understanding, Labeling, Expressing, Regulating their emotions. Students develop life skills and strategies to deal with conflict, stress and anxiety. -96% of 3rd-5th grade students will meet or exceed standard on the Smarter Balanced Reading Assessment. -96% of 3rd-5th grade students will meet or exceed standard on the Smarter Balanced Math Assessment. -99%of all 5th grade students will meet or exceed standard on the Science WCAS.
