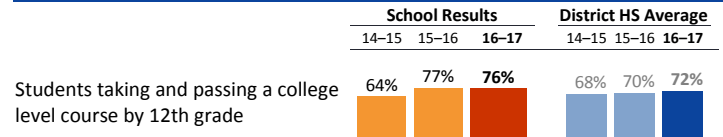

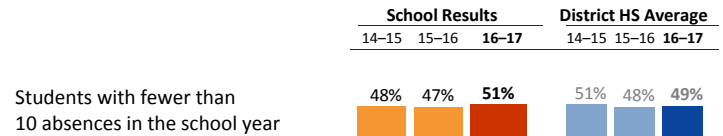

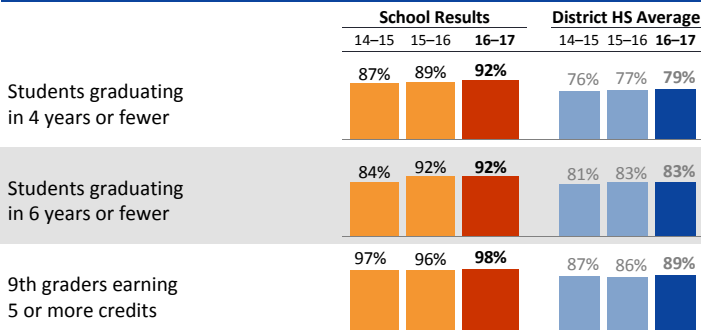

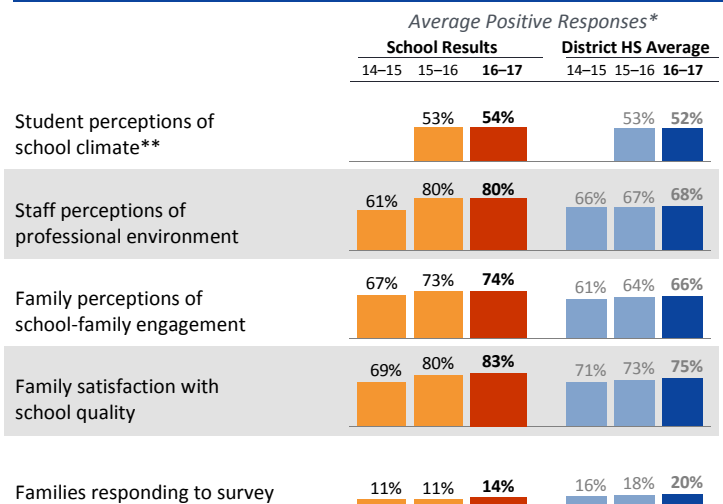
Attendance



On-Track for Graduation



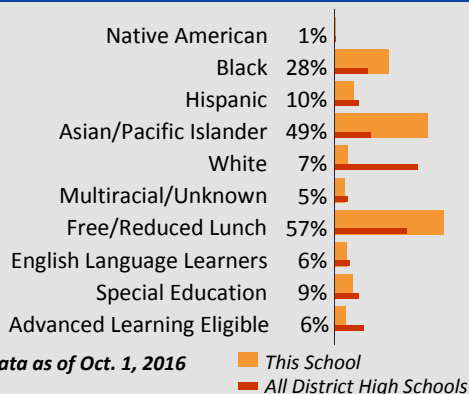
Student, Family, and Staff School Climate Survey

School Mission Statement Real world preparation for real world success, in personalized, rigorous, and relevant small learning communities.

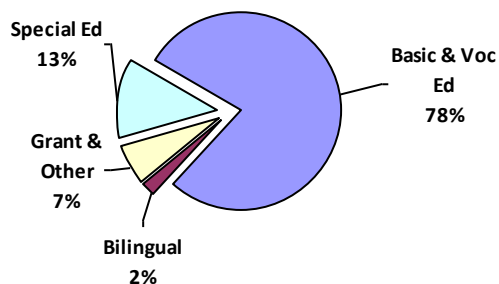

VISION: At Cleveland High School, we... PREPARE OUR STUDENTS IN STEM *We use a school-wide project-based approach for authentic learning. *We provide a 1:1 laptop program for students to enhance learning. *We expect 4 years of science and mathematics for every student. PRODUCE A DIVERSE & UNITED CULTURE *Students find acceptance amongst peers of different backgrounds and social classes. *Students access resources such as peer and adult mentoring, small group collaboration, and social and emotional support. PUSH OURSELVES TO CONTINUALLY RISK, GROW & LEARN *We embrace a growth mindset towards adult & youth learning. *We are not afraid to try different approaches to learning. *Students and staff seek challenge and learn from mistakes. PLAN TO ACHIEVE GOALS: All Cleveland High School students will experience authentic, standards-aligned projects, with effective, consistent assessment and adjustment of instruction to support all students' growth. THEORY OF ACTION: If we support the improvement of teachers' collaboration in project design and ongoing assessment that informs instruction, students will achieve at higher levels.
