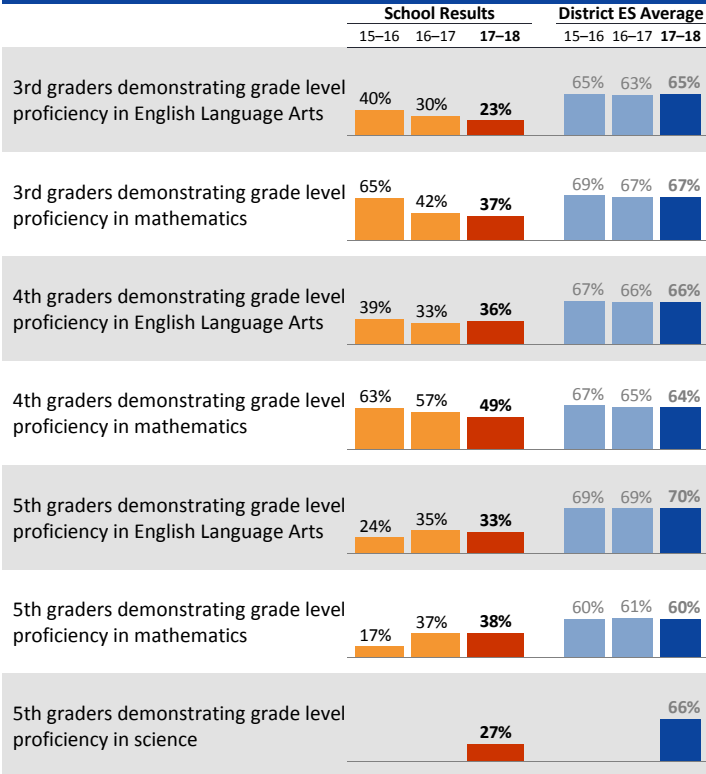

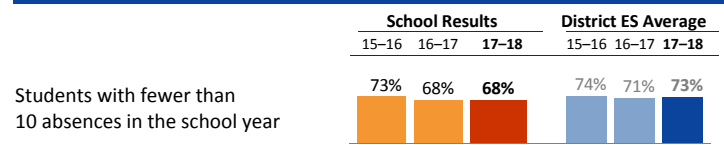

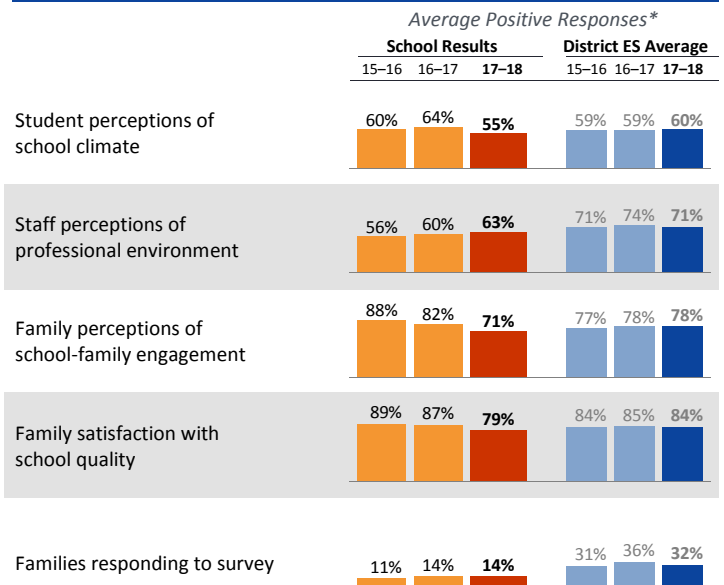

Attendance

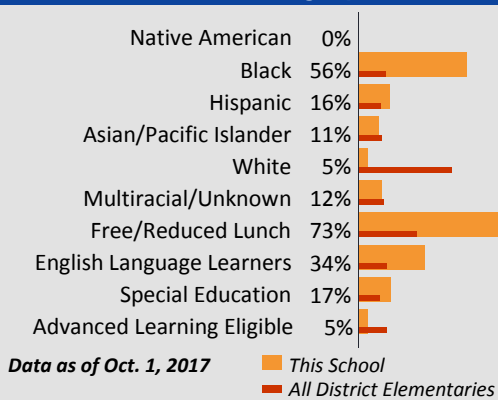


Student, Family, and Staff School Climate Survey

School Goals

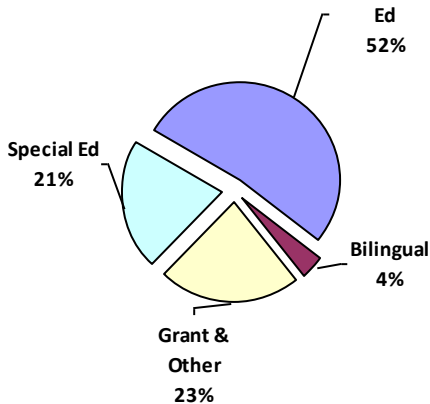
By June 2019 70% of ELL and special education 3rd- 5th grade students will make a gain of at least 1 level on the SBA reading and math. By June 2019 80% of ELL and special education students will make typical growth in MAP reading and math. By June 2019 there will be an increase in Gatzert student academic achievement scores in the following areas: Kindergarten: WA Kids Assessment (Fall 2018 to Spring 2019) Grades 1-2: MAP reading and math assessments (Fall to Spring) Grades 3-5 SBA (comparing spring to spring). By Spring 2019 at least 50% of 3-5th graders will report a healthy classroom environment on the Gatzert Student Climate Survey.

School Description & Plan to Achieve Goals

Bailey Gatzert Elementary is a richly diverse PreK-5 school that seeks to educate the whole child. Our staff is comprised of passionate educators and staff who honor and cultivate each child's individual gifts and talents while developing academic excellence and social emotional strength. We empower children to contribute positively to our diverse and dynamic society through lifelong learning and personal integrity. Daily classes begin with a Community Circle and a check-in on the Mood Meter (based on the Social Emotional Learning Curriculum from Yale University and employed district-wide). Balanced Literacy Program characterizes our reading/writing instruction. School wide implementation of K-5 classroom libraries support Independent Reading with just right books. The Center for the Collaborative Classroom and Early Learning Literacy Program are implemented school wide. K-5 teachers, in collaboration with ELL teachers and our Reading Specialists, make certain that every student receives customized small group reading instruction: K-2 in small Being A Reader groups (CCC curriculum), while 3rd-5th grade students are in small guided reading groups. The Title I Math Specialist, Levy Math Specialist and classroom teachers are using Seattle Public School's Math Scope & Sequence to guide math instruction. Learning opportunities include after school programs coordinated by Seattle University. They include the Brain Train, Redhawks Reading Corps, Team Read, America SCORES, and Seattle Music Partners. In addition, Seattle University leads a twice weekly Family Talk Time (English language classes for families) and Family Tech Time (computer literacy). In addition we have our S.U. sponsored weekend arts events (such as Hip Hop Nutcracker) that are free to Gatzert families.
