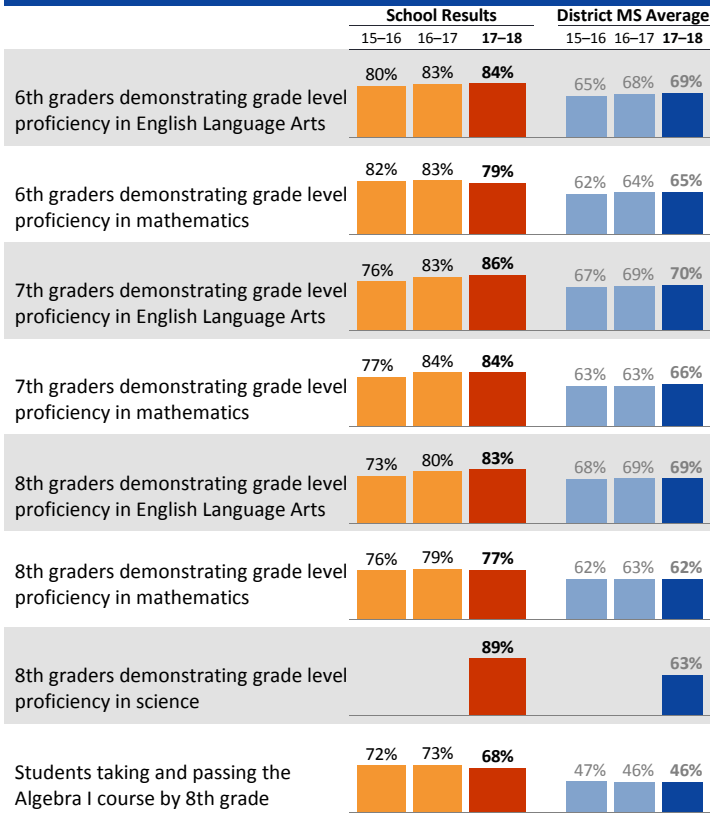

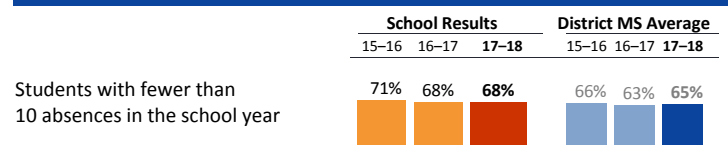

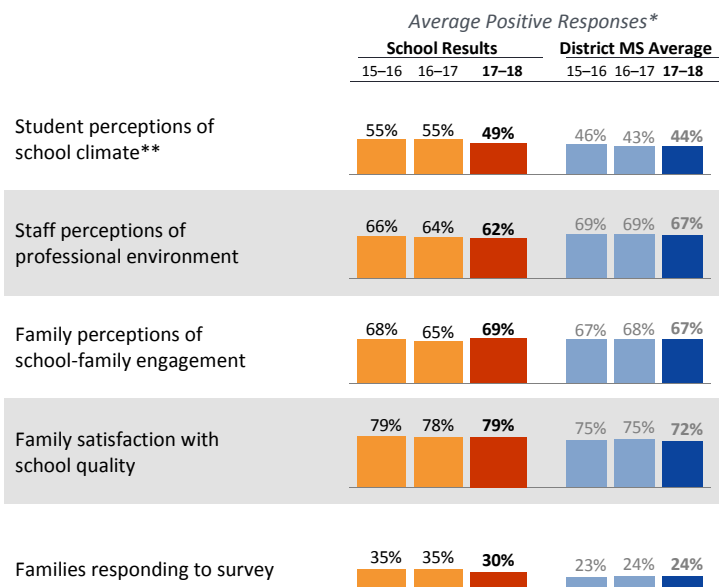

Attendance

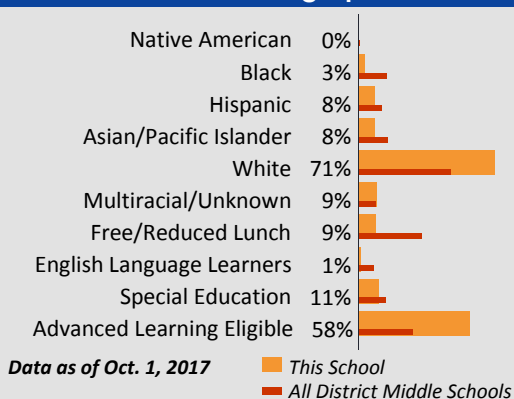


Student, Family, and Staff School Climate Survey

School Goals

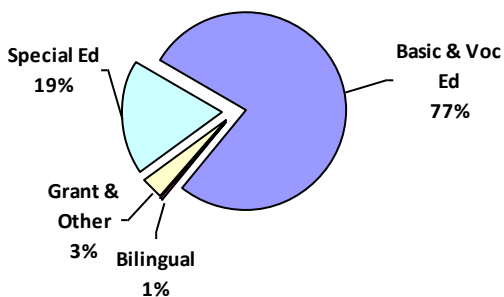
ELA: 59% of our current black or African American students met standard in English Language Arts in the 2017-2018 Smarter Balanced Assessment Goal: By the end of the 2018-19 school year, each black or African-American student will increase their literacy achievement by one level as measured on a 4-point rubric. The focus will be on writing and taught and assessed in classes across the curriculum. Goal: By June 2019, 67% of Hamilton students will demonstrate a typical or high level of growth as measured by the Student Growth Percentile for Math.

School Description & Plan to Achieve Goals

Hamilton International Middle School continues to be a highly collaborative, rigorous academic, growth-minded middle school. Our teaching and support staff work together to ensure every student has access to strong and appropriate curriculum and to identify the learning needs of each student. We develop strong partnerships with our families and community in support of this work. Our students learn to understand global issues and how to have a role in the world. Math: We offer six levels of math classes to meet each students' learning needs. We have also implemented a co-teaching model in math classes for targeted students currently not meeting standard on the SBA. Teachers are working collaboratively to provide math interventions during the school day. Additionally, teachers are developing common assessments and transitioning to standards based instruction in order to better support student progress and provide students with multiple opportunities to demonstrate proficiency. Reading and Writing: We have implemented a co-teaching model in many Language Arts classes to support struggling learners. Teachers are collaboratively aligning the curriculum to the Common Core State Standards and developing common formative assessments.
