



School Mission **Statement**  Kimball Elementary School creates a safe, empowering learning environment where children celebrate continued academic growth and achievement. Kimball fosters lifelong learners and problem solvers within a community of cultural diversity and acceptance.

### School Goals

We will increase the percentage of fourth graders reaching proficiency on the English language arts Smarter Balanced Assessment from 45% as third graders in June 2018 to at least 60% in June 2019. We will increase the percentage of fifth grade students readching proficience on the math Smarter Balanced Assessment from 61% as fourth graders in June 2018 to at least 65% in June 2019. We will increase the percentage of English language learners reachign proficiency on the English language arts Smarter Balanced Assessment from 31% in June 2018 to at least 40% in June 2019. We will increase the percentage of students in grades 3-5 who respond favorably to the statement "adults notice if someone is bullied at school" from 44% in spring 2-18 to at least 55% in spring 2019. We will increase the percentage of students in grade 3-5 who respond favorably to the statement "Adults are able to stop someone from being a bully" from 57% in spring 2018 to

## School **Description** & Plan to **Achieve** Goals

We provide on-going professional development for teachers in CCC, Math In Focus, and Ruler. Our Principal and Assistant Principal set aside time each week to visit classrooms and provide written and verbal feedback to teachers. Our Multitiered Systems of Support (MTSS) Team supports teachers in using research-based interventions, and facilitates data meetings approximately every six weeks. We strengthen our core academic program by meeting twice per month in Professional Learning Communities to align instruction and assessment practices. We provide students an array of extended-day learning opportunities four days per week, including reading tutoring, chess, visual arts, robotics, creative computing and science and engineering.
