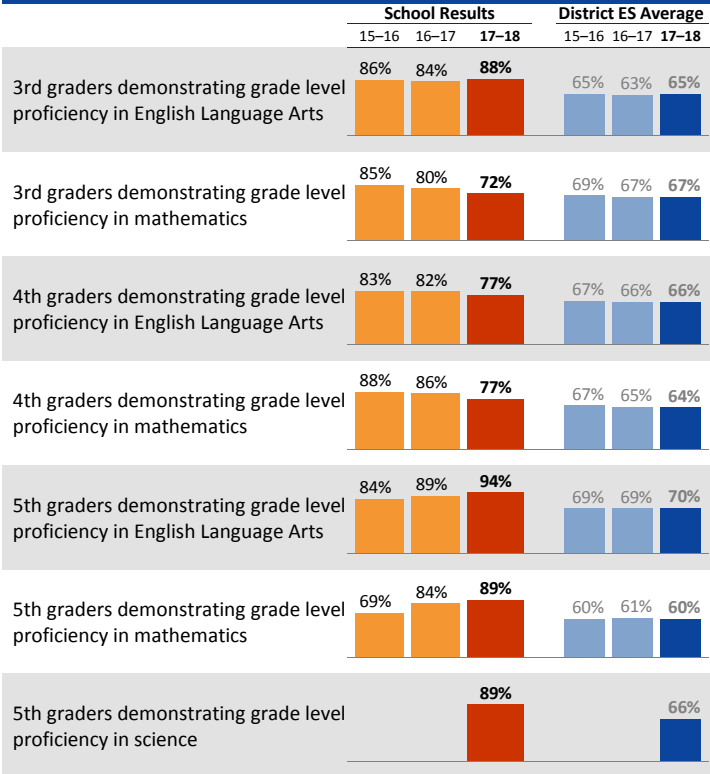

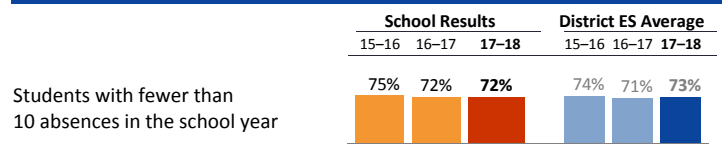

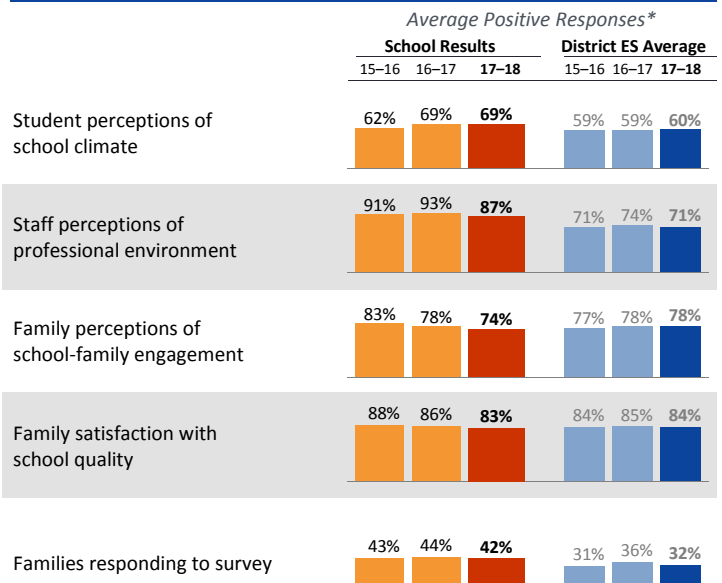

Attendance

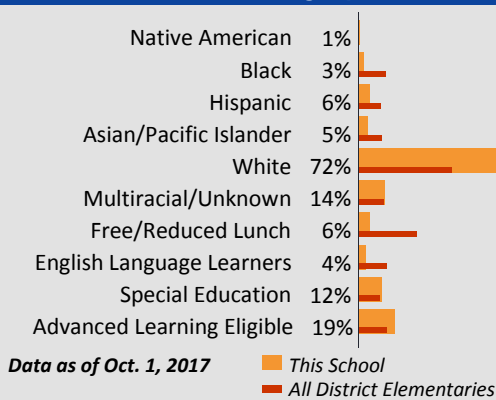


Student, Family, and Staff School Climate Survey

School Mission Statement
 We prepare students to welcome and encourage others, act responsibly, value learning, demonstrate curiosity and creativity, and contribute meaningfully to society.

- School Goals**
1. 100% of 4th and 5th grade students not meeting standards on the math section of the 2018 SBA will make at least one level of growth by June of 2019.
 2. The 5th grade cohort will improve math scores to 82% as measured by the 2019 SBA math assessment.
 3. 90% of 3rd and 4th grade students and 85% of 5th grade students will meet or exceed standards as measured by 2019 SBA ELA assessment.
 4. 65% of students will respond favorably to “Students in my classroom treat each other with respect” by the May 2019 student climate survey.

School Description & Plan to Achieve Goals

Lawton Elementary is a K-5 school in the Magnolia neighborhood.

We believe schools are spaces to inspire all students through equity and inclusion to develop confidence and contribute their unique passions and interests. We believe all students grow through culturally relevant instruction, practice, sharing, and reflection. We believe in multiple pathways to success for the whole child through academic rigor, social emotional learning, artistic expression, music, and physical education. We believe in the value of community and work in partnership with families and the community to connect students to the world around them.

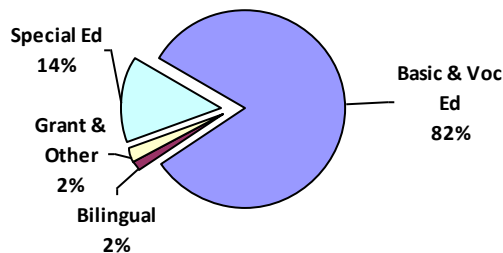
We are focused on eliminating the opportunity gap at Lawton by using intentional and effective strategies that meet the needs of all students.

In ELA, we provide a combination of strong core/tier one reading instruction to ensure that we reach all Common Core ELA standards as well as tier two services (smaller groups, reading specialist support). We will use research-based strategies such as: small groups, targeted/explicit instruction in needed areas, and Center for Collaborative Classroom (CCC) instruction across grade bands.

In Math, we will provide a combination of strong core/tier one instruction at students’ level as well as some push in tier two support in targeted intermediate classrooms.
