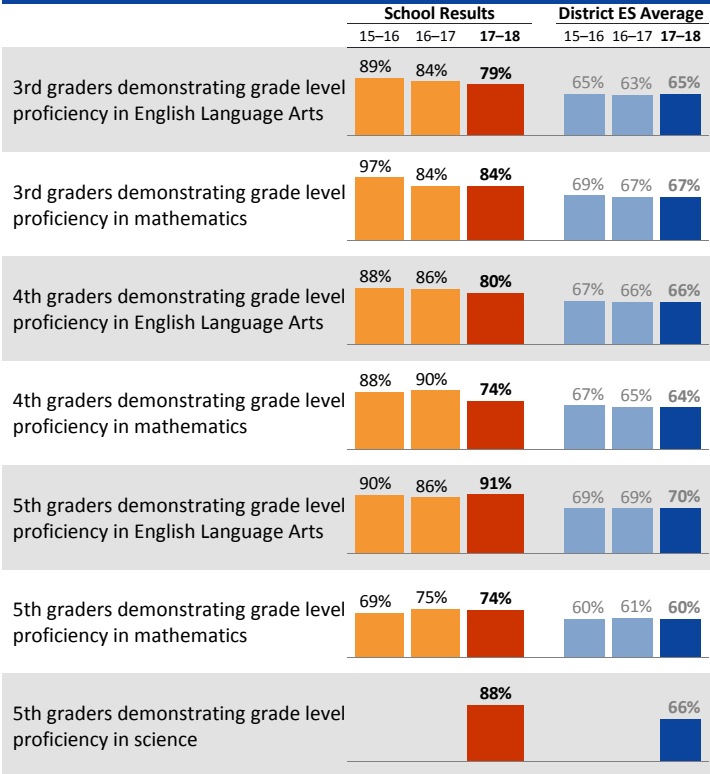

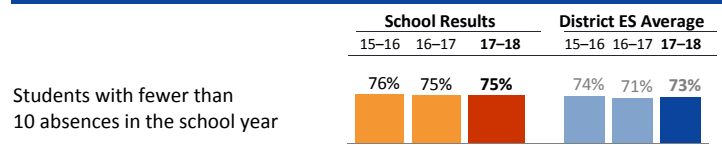

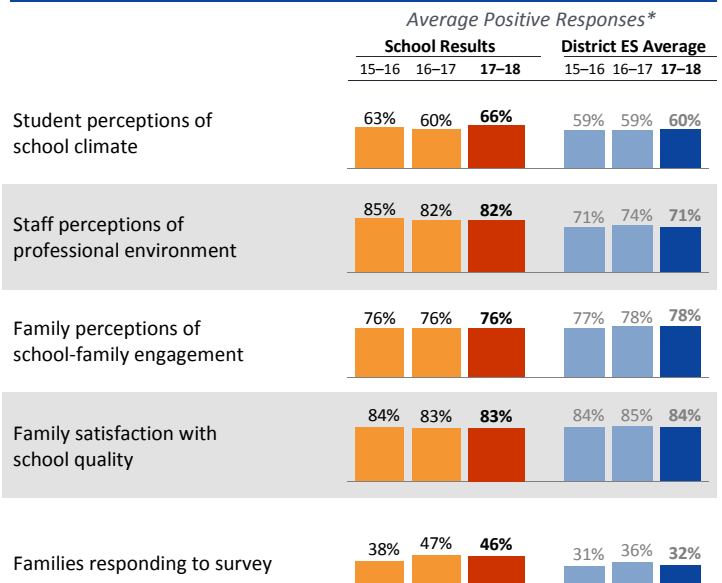

Attendance

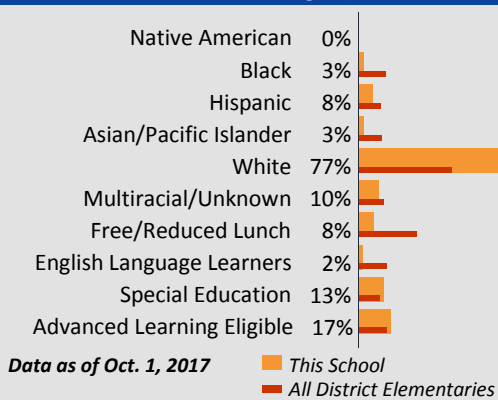


Student, Family, and Staff School Climate Survey

School Goals

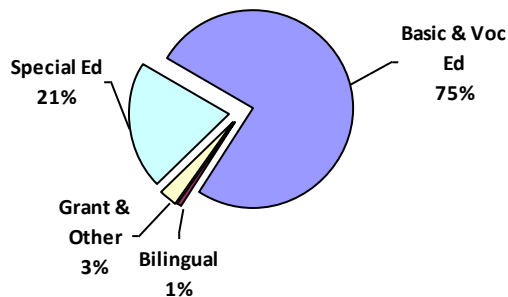
Goal #1-By the end of 5th grade all students will be at or approaching grade level standard in math as measured by SBA.
 Goal #2-On the Spring 2017 Student Climate Assessment, our Class Environment score will rise from 52% positive responses to 67% or greater. Students feel that their colleagues are not focused on learning, that bullying is occurring which teachers know about, but can't stop.

School Description & Plan to Achieve Goals

Loyal Heights is a welcoming neighborhood school that is growing in size and in diversity. Loyal Heights believes that a positive and strong partnership between families, the school, and the community are essential for supporting our children's social, emotional, and academic growth. Building relationships between families, the school, and students are the greatest assets we have for ensuring a safe, productive, and joyful school experience. All of our Loyal Heights teachers are highly qualified and endorsed to teach in areas which they are assigned. We are also a continuum school providing services for students in a special needs self-contained classroom to highly capable students that require enrichment and additional challenge. Students are instructed as a whole class, in small groups and individually according to their specific needs. Some receive tutoring or have Individualized Education Plans or need an accommodation that are implemented to advance student skills and knowledge. Teachers use several forms of data collected regularly to access student progress and inform instruction to meet all students' needs. Benchmarks are set and students are assessed along the way to ensure they are on trajectory to achieve the goal set. Individual student Progress Monitoring reports in Math are sent home regularly so that parents are informed of their child(ren)'s learning growth. We, at Loyal Heights, recognize that it truly takes a village to come together in preparing our students to be ready for Middle school, High school, and in their life-long learning journey as productive global citizens.
