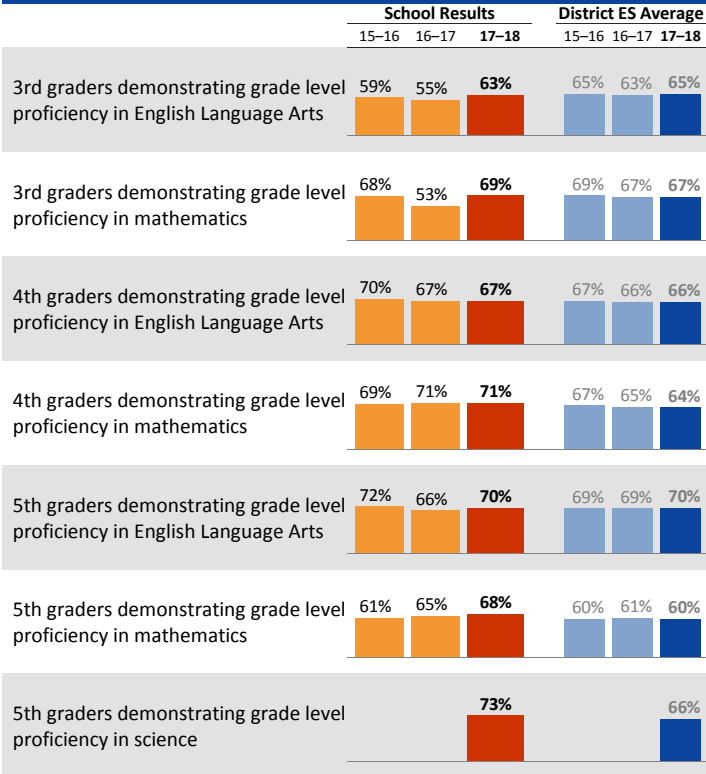

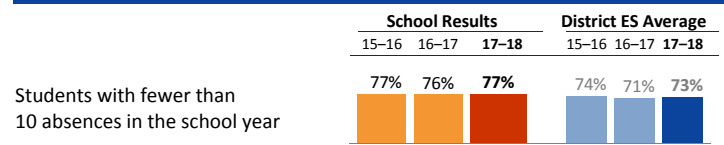

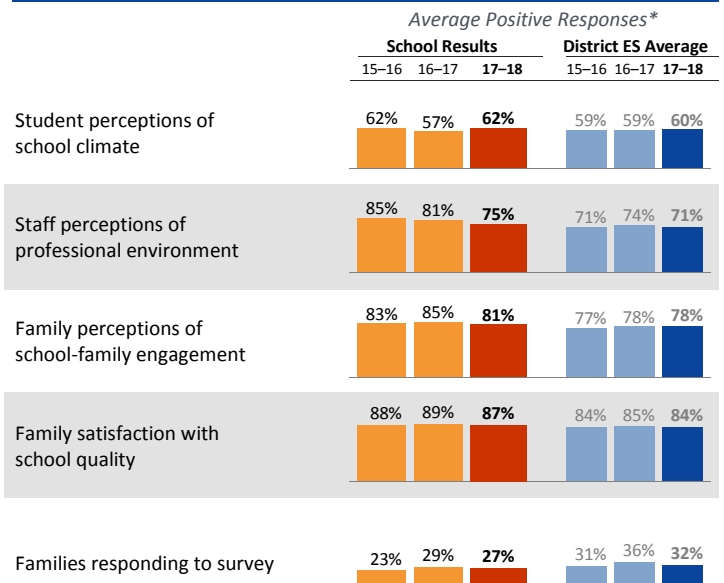

Attendance

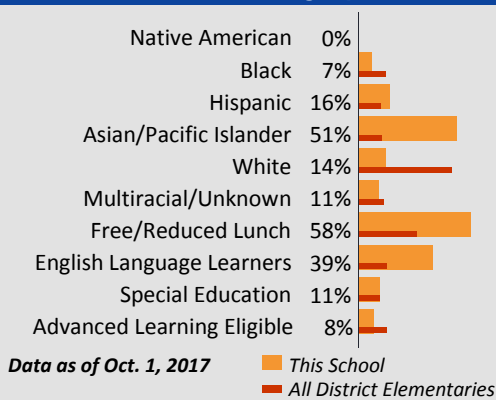


Student, Family, and Staff School Climate Survey

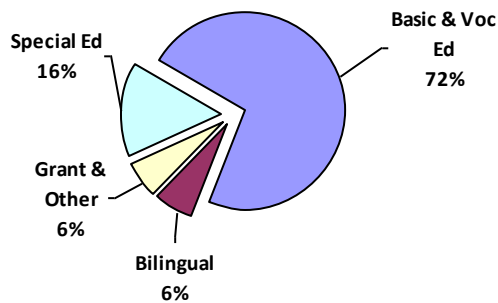
School Mission Statement Every student will attain his/her highest potential and be empowered to become a life-long learner.
