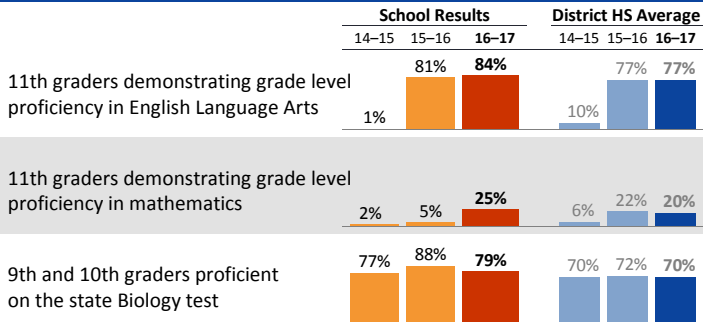

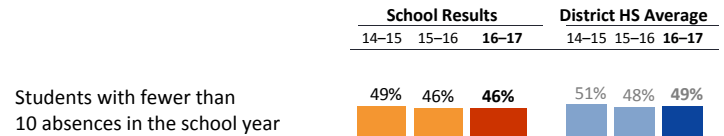

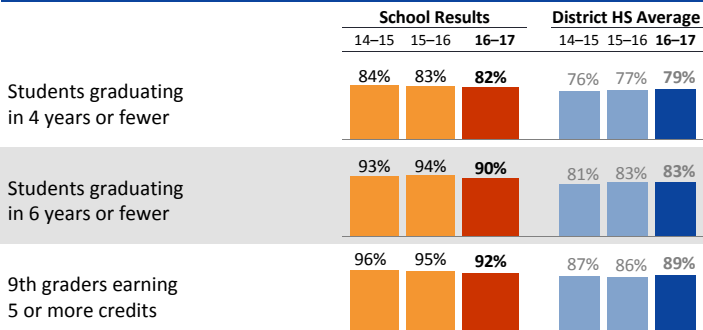

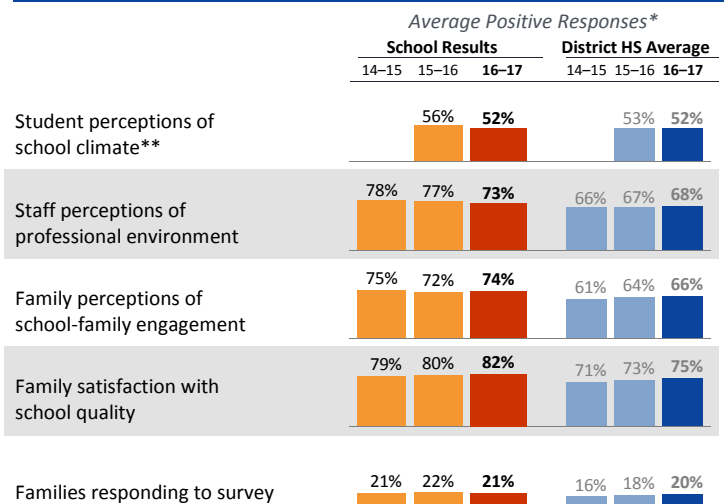
Attendance



On-Track for Graduation



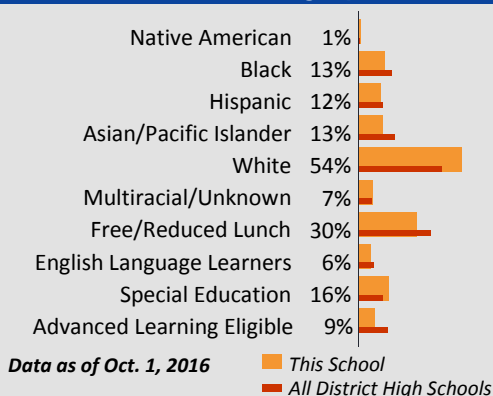
Student, Family, and Staff School Climate Survey

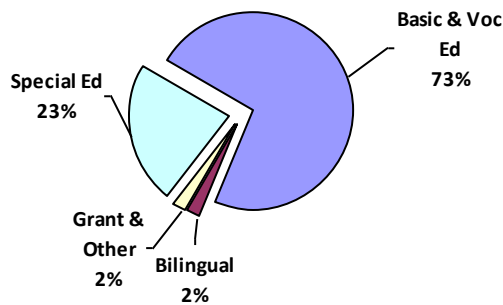
School Mission Statement Our Nathan Hale High School mission is to ensure that ALL students become honorable, thinking, skillful citizens.

School Goals Goals for Nathan Hale High School: Our goal is to increase student survey data by 5% in the following areas: Sense of Belonging, Classroom Environment, Healthy Community, and Student Motivation & Inclusion; In addition, we will analyze attendance data and personally walk students to class so they can engage in learning.

School Description & Plan to Achieve Goals Recognized both locally and nationally as a leader in school reform since 1997, Nathan Hale High School uses the Coalition of Essential Schools' Ten Common Principles to guide our school community, our work and our student outcomes. We believe students build better academic and life skills through a healthy sense of belonging, an inclusive and supportive community, real-world, project-based learning, and end-of-unit exhibitions. Successful fundamental features in place are: our 9th Grade Academy, offering greater content depth through a block schedule, stronger student and staff relationships and the ability to become a successful high school student; our 10th grade Integrated Studies program which builds on an academy-like environment by integrating science, language arts and social studies; our commitment to build a culturally competent school community through race and equity training; a differentiated classroom configuration for Advanced Placement, honors designation and academic support; an inclusive culture for all students and families with many activities such as the Bite of Hale, Booster Clubs, Senate, Hale Action Project, and Hale Ambassadors.
