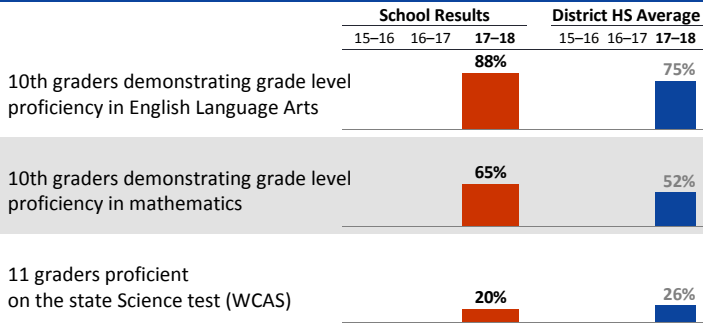

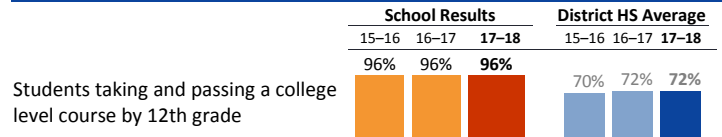

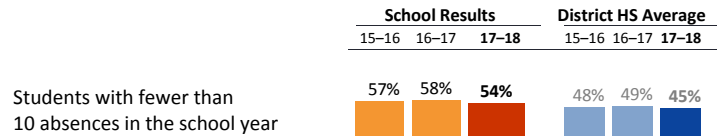

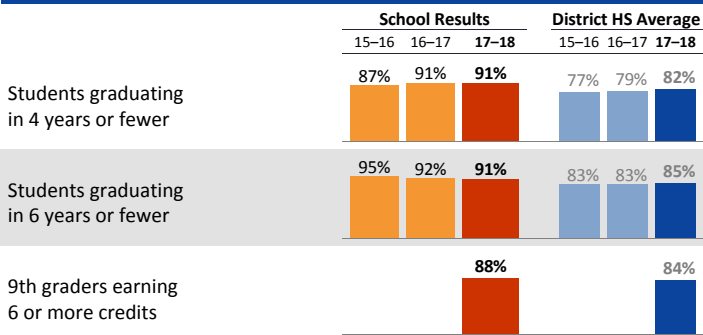

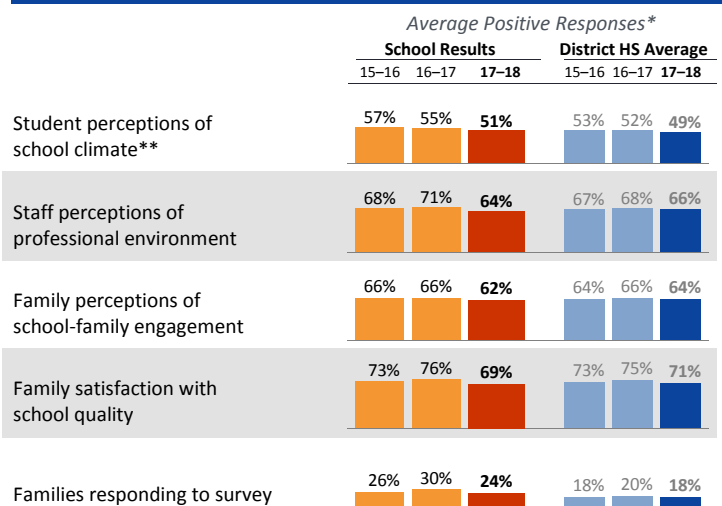
Attendance



On-Track for Graduation

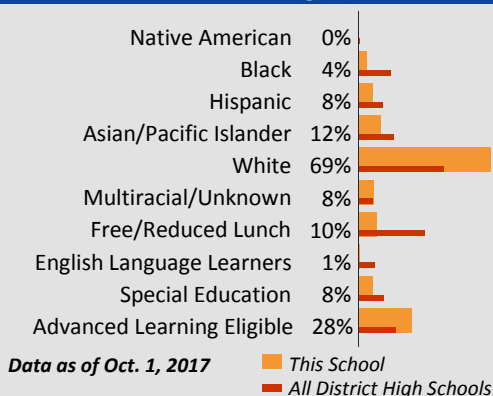


Student, Family, and Staff School Climate Survey

School Goals

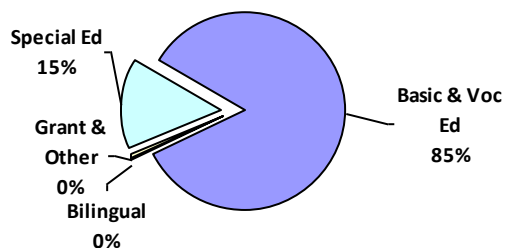
Our goals center on 3 major areas that are focused on increasing the overall performance of all students. These include: 1) Reducing gaps that exist between performance of sub groups of students 2) Increasing performance from students receiving special education services. 3) Increasing students' Social Emotional Learning, reducing stress and increasing coping skills.

School Description & Plan to Achieve Goals

Roosevelt High School is a comprehensive high school of over 1700 students. The strength of our program lies within the students, staff and community who all strive to do excellent work and support the success of all of our students. Whether it is academics, arts, activities or athletics, there is something for everyone. A highlight of Roosevelt High School's academic program is the wide variety of Advanced Placement or College in the High School courses offered in each of our core academic areas including all of our 10th grade students taking AP Human Geography and all students taking AP Language in their 11th or 12th grade year. Our arts programs received national recognition and our student newspaper and yearbook put out award winning publications each year. The athletic programs participate in the Metro 3A League with high student participation. As we focus on the achievement of all of our students, we look inward towards what we are doing in the classroom and outward toward types of support we provide. Support for math, reading and writing are available 4 days a week through our homework center. In addition, an Academic Intervention Specialist provides case management for our most struggling students. In the 2016-2017 school year we added RiderTime, a time for student reflection, homework completion and Mindfulness. We partner with the University of Washington to teach students skills in Mindfulness with the goal of reducing student stress and giving them lifelong skills in emotional regulation and focus.
