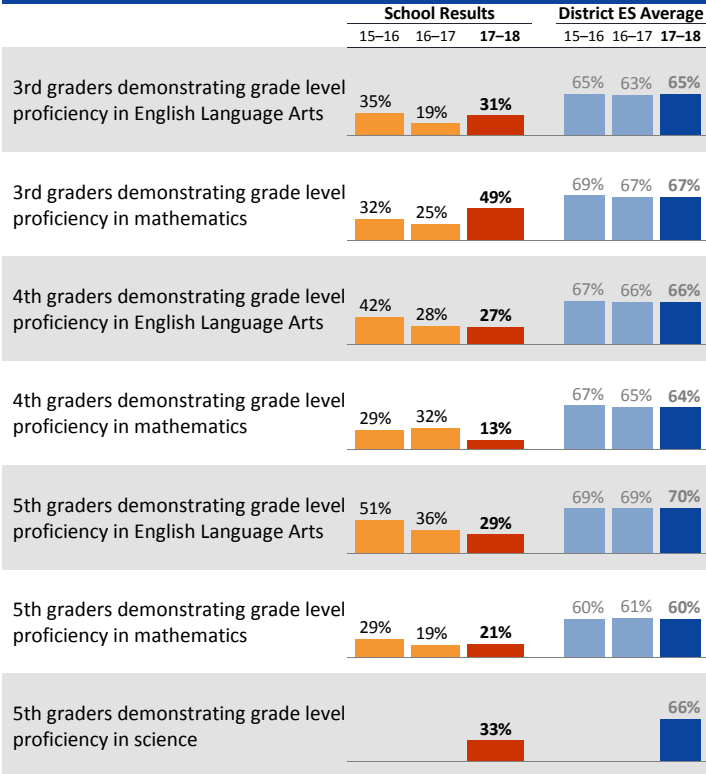

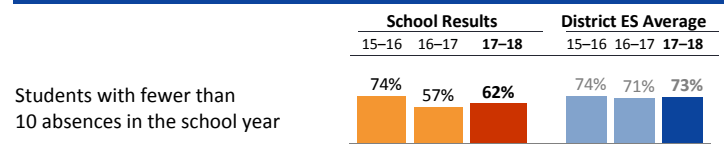

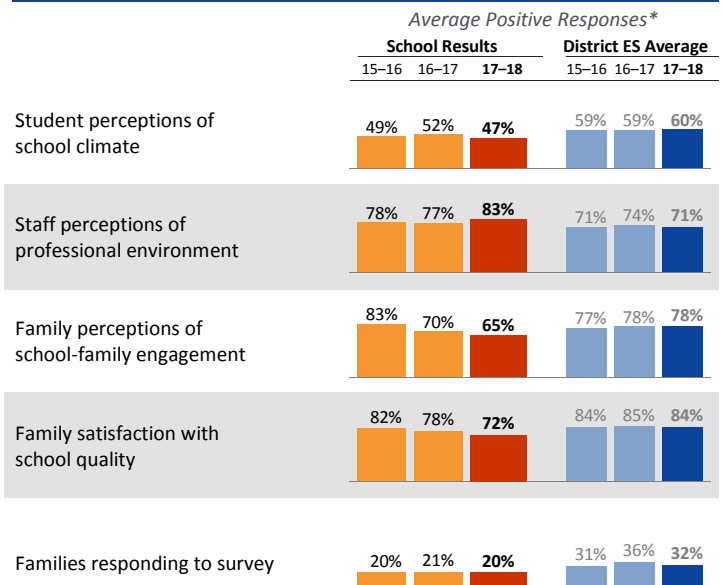

Attendance

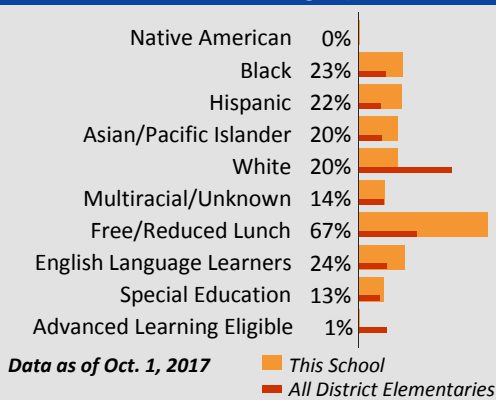


Student, Family, and Staff School Climate Survey

Sanislo is a safe learning community dedicated to building respectful and responsible citizens and empowering ALL learners. Sanislo is the small school with big ideas.

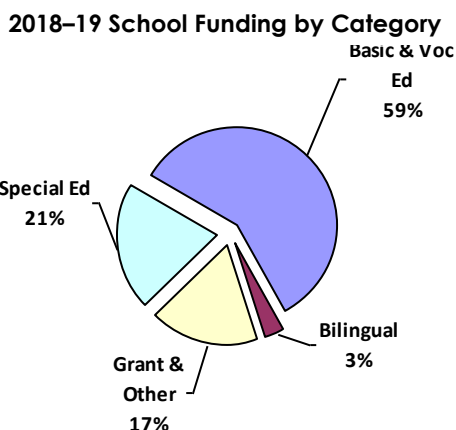
School Goals

Our School Goals for 2018-19 include increasing the number of students that meet proficiency on interim and summative assessments, especially focusing on our students who receive English Language Learning services, students who receive special education services, and our students of color. We are also focusing on improving the total number of students proficient in mathematics and English Language Arts as measured by the Smarter Balanced Assessment and the Measures of Academic Progress assessment.

School Description & Plan to Achieve Goals

Sanislo has 220 students enrolled in grades kindergarten through 5th. Our open concept architecture promotes a strong sense of community and cooperation. Our curriculum of math, reading, writing, science and social studies is supported by a strong P.E. and art program as well as an instrumental and general music program. In order to achieve the goals set forth, the Sanislo staff works collaboratively through common planning time, professional learning communities and focused professional development. During the 2018-19 school year, the staff is continuing to implement a Positive Behavior Intervention Support system to improve overall school climate. Additionally, staff will implement intervention and enrichment activities to support all students. City Year, Fuel Your Future and Reading Partners are community based organizations that will continue to support students academics and social emotional learning. Sanislo Elementary school receives Title I funding, Learning Assistance Program funding and funds through the Families and Education Levy from the city of Seattle.
