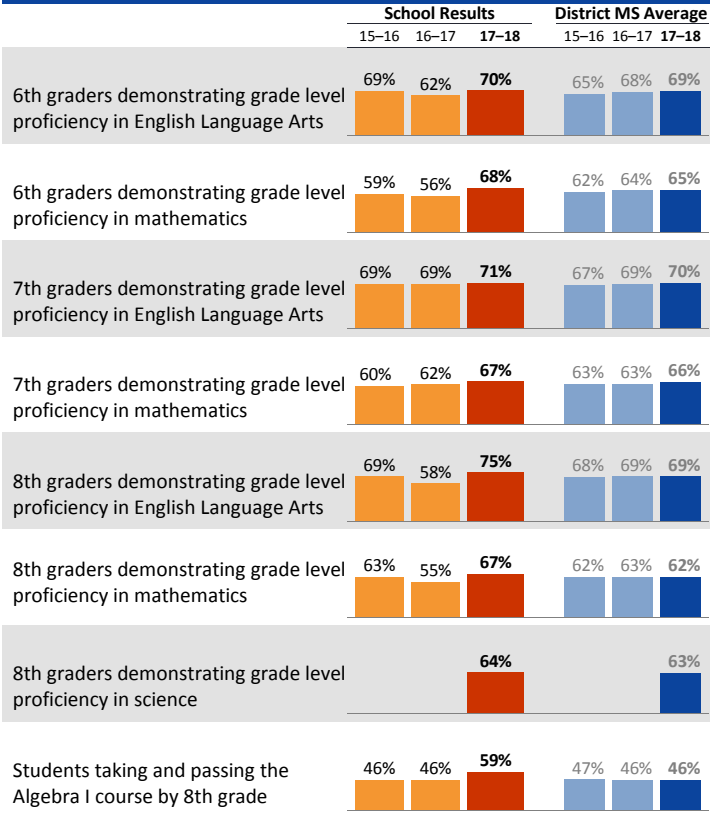

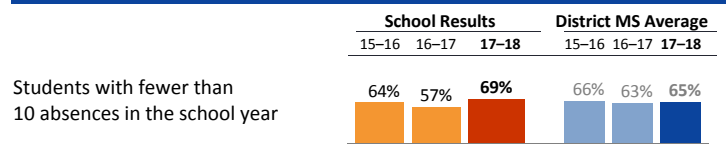

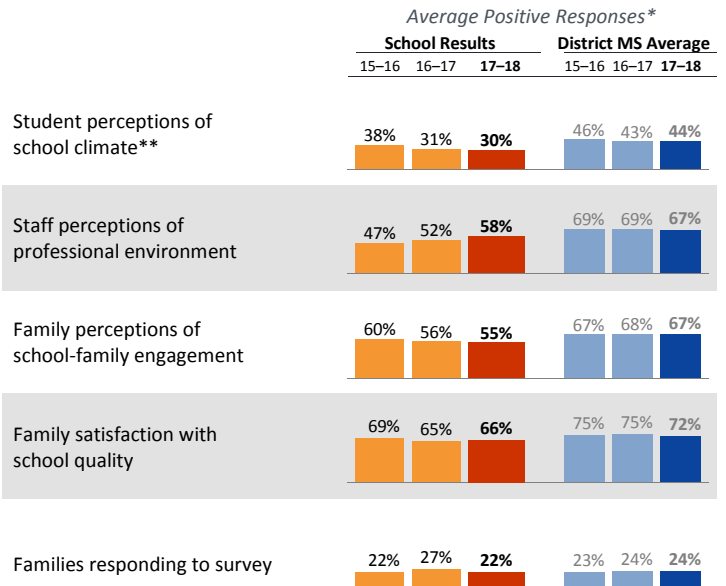

Attendance

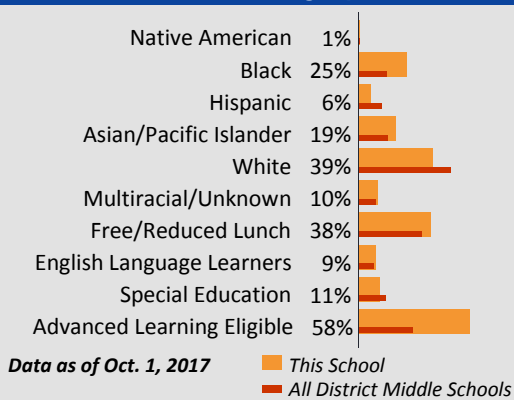


Student, Family, and Staff School Climate Survey

School Goals

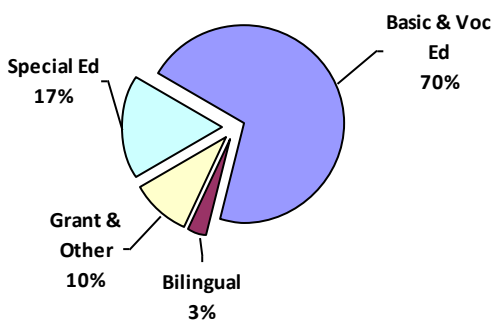
We are committed to the academic growth of all scholars and to eliminating the opportunity and achievement gaps (as % of scholars mastering grade-level standards) between scholars in our HCC magnet program and our scholars not receiving HCC services, as these gaps match and highlight those between race and socioeconomic lines. As an SPS School of Promise, we are also committed to reducing racial disproportionalities in scholar discipline and increasing achievement and growth of our scholars receiving special education services. The three CSIP initiatives for Washington Middle School continue to be: 1) Define and Use the Lens of Racial Equity to Eliminate the Opportunity Gap 2) Implement a multi-tiered system of supports for all scholars, including Positive Behavior Intervention Supports, and 3) Use the WMS Culturally Responsive Teacher Toolkit of Best Instructional and Assessment Practices.

School Description & Plan to Achieve Goals

We are a diverse, historical, Central area school serving 650 scholars from John Muir, Thurgood Marshall and Bailey Gatzert elementary schools. We have scholars and families who speak over 35 languages and who come from a variety of cultural backgrounds, a committed staff, and a wonderful music program. We are committed to 100% of our scholars mastering 100% of grade-level standards, and to giving 100% for 100% of our scholars. Our teachers are committed to teach rigorous and engaging lessons each day in each class to each scholar. Our staff values Justice, Inclusiveness, Relentless Pursuit of Results & Positive Impact, Team & Family, and Fun.
