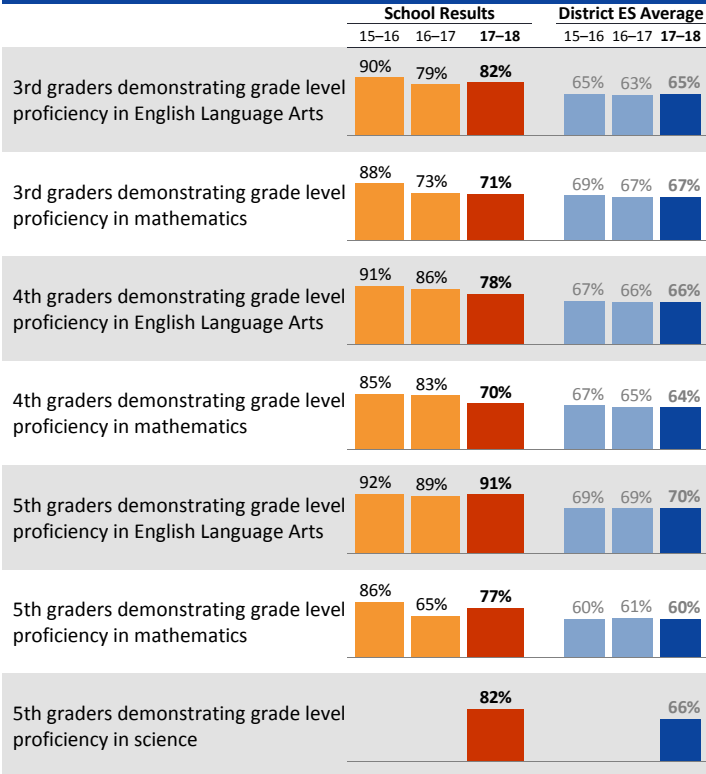

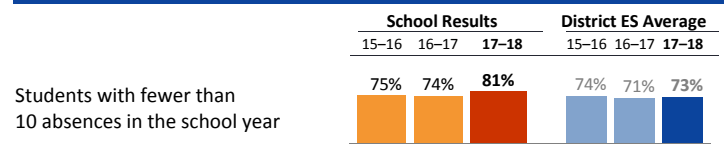

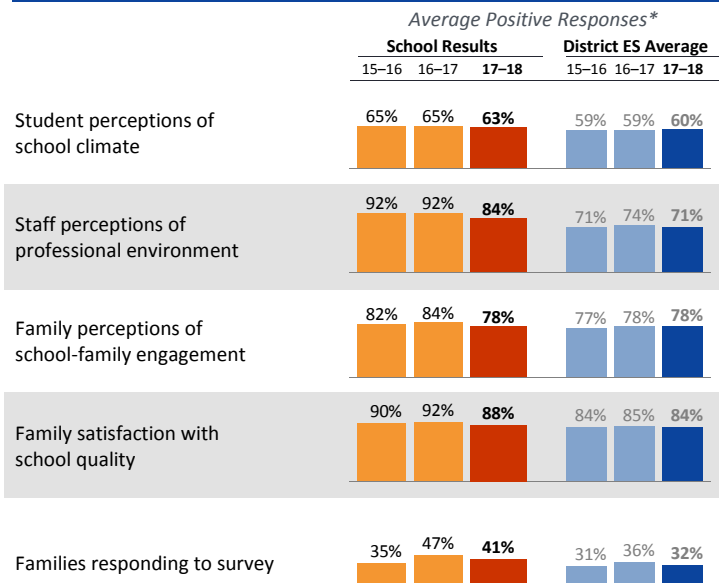

### Attendance

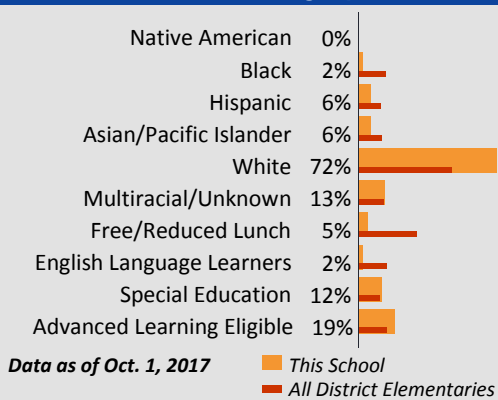


### Student, Family, and Staff School Climate Survey

**School Mission Statement** West Woodland is a caring community working together to create an educational success story for every student.

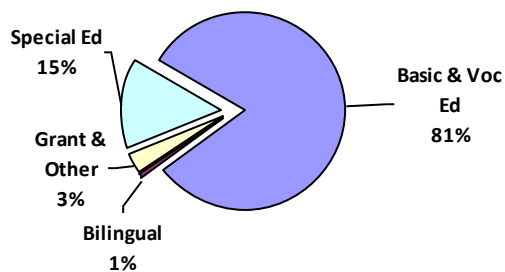
**School Goals** By June, 2019, all students who have been identified as not at grade level reading standard in 1st-3rd grade will make at a year and half growth in reading as measured by the Fountas and Pinnell reading assessment.

Students have been identified using Fountas and Pinnell Assessment, MAP and Smarter Balance Assessment. Students will be progress monitored using our MTSS data tracker as well as classroom based assessments.

**School Description & Plan to Achieve Goals** West Woodland Elementary is a K-5 school in the Ballard-Phinney Ridge neighborhood in northwest Seattle. Active parents and community members make significant contributions to student experience - every student participates in an integrated visual and music arts program. West Woodland is a designated Advanced Learning Opportunities (ALO) school providing balanced literacy and math programs. Small group instruction will be used to teach skills at each student’s level, providing an appropriate challenge in all classrooms. Social emotional literacy is being taught through the RULER curriculum. Class meetings, social skills lessons, friendships/social skills groups are supported through our counselor as well as our special education teachers.
