#### 1. TITLE

Approval to Procure HEPA units, replacement filters, and UV lights for In-Person Instruction for Fall 2021

# 2. PURPOSE

Approval to procure HEPA units, replacement filters, and ultraviolet (UV) lights to meet Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) guidelines and safely provide in-person instruction for Fall 2021.

# 3. <u>RECOMMENDED MOTION</u>

I move that the School Board approve the procurement of HEPA units, replacement filters, and UV lights for an estimated cost of \$3,552,000 plus freight cost and tax, with any modifications deemed necessary by the Superintendent to complete the procurement. Immediate action is in the best interest of the district.

# 4. <u>BACKGROUND INFORMATION</u>

### a. Background

SARS-CoV-2, the virus that causes COVID-19, particles spread between people more readily indoors than outdoors. Protective ventilation practices and interventions, such as portable HEPA air cleaners, can reduce the airborne concentration, which reduces the overall viral dose to occupants.

In early 2021, the district deployed 1,450 HEPA filters to improve air quality in support of a hybrid educational model that included in-person learning.

In support for a safe return in fall 2021 to 100% in-person instruction, additional improvements will be needed to accommodate the increased building occupancy. An additional 4,000 units for \$2.6 million, plus freight cost and tax, will be needed to meet safety recommendations.

In addition to the purchase of HEPA units, Board approval is needed for replacement filters and UV lights. An anticipated 12,500 replacement filters for \$925,000 plus freight and tax, will be needed for the 2021-22 school year. This will allow for filter

replacements three times per school year. UV lights will be replaced on an as needed basis with an anticipated purchase of 500 lights for \$27,000 plus tax.

The HEPA filters will be procured through the State of Washington's contract with vendor Grainger. The manufacturer is Field Control.

#### b. Alternatives

Do not approve these purchases. This is not recommended because the HEPA filters are needed to safely provide in-person instruction.

The estimated total cost of the procurement is \$3,552,000 plus freight cost and tax:

- 4,000 HEPA units for \$2,600,000
- 12,500 replacement filters for \$925,000
- 500 replacement UV lights for \$27,000
