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I. <u>TITLE</u>

BEX IV and BTA IV: Award Contract P1454, for Architectural and Engineering Services, to Integrus Architecture, for the Classroom Addition at Ingraham High School project For Introduction:September 7, 2016For Action:September 21, 2016

II. WHY BOARD ACTION IS NECESSARY

Per Board Policy No. 6220, Procurement, all contracts exceeding \$250,000 must be approved by the Board. The contract for the full scope of Architectural and Engineering Services for the Ingraham High School project exceeds \$250,000.

III. FISCAL IMPACT/REVENUE SOURCE

Fiscal impact to this action will be \$2,723,719 900,000, plus reimbursable expenses.

The revenue source for this motion is BEX IV and BTA IV capital levy funds.

IV. POLICY IMPLICATION

Per Board Policy No. 6220, Procurement, any contract over \$250,000 must be brought before the Board for approval.

V. <u>RECOMMENDED MOTION</u>

I move that the School Board authorize the Superintendent to execute Contract P1454, for Architectural and Engineering Services with Integrus Architecture, for the Classroom Addition at Ingraham High School, in the amount of \$2,723,719 900,000, plus reimbursable expenses, in the form of the draft agreement attached to the Board Action Report, with any minor additions, deletions, and modifications deemed necessary by the Superintendent and to take any necessary actions to implement the contract.

VI. BOARD COMMITTEE RECOMMENDATION

This motion was discussed at the Operations Committee on August 16, 2016. The Committee moved this item forward to the full Board with a recommendation for consideration.

VII. BACKGROUND INFORMATION

On February 9, 2016, voters approved the \$475.3 million, Building, Technology and Academics/ Athletics (BTA) IV Capital Levy, which will support Seattle Public Schools (District) long-range plans to upgrade and renovate aging school facilities and address enrollment growth. Currently, the District is experiencing a surge in student enrollment growth. BTA IV includes a classroom addition project at Ingraham High School which will further address the student capacity needs of the District by adding up to 500 seats to the facility.

The scope of this project will include but is not limited to:

- A two or three story classroom addition
- Remodeling of the existing single story West portion of Building 200 if required by Code
- Adding an enclosed connection to the main school building
- Including sustainability and green initiatives
- Including on-site as well as off-site development work, if required
- Seismic upgrades based upon the Structural Evaluation by PCS Structural
- Replace roofing at a portion of the main building and auxiliary gym

The firm of Integrus Architecture was selected through the Architectural and Engineering selection procedures established in Superintendent Procedure 6220SP.C. Six (6) firms submitted their qualifications: BLRB Architects, DLR Group, DOWA-IBI, Integrus Architecture, Studio Meng Strazarra and Rolluda Architects. Four (4) firms were shortlisted: BLRB Architects, DLR Group, Integrus Architecture and Studio Meng Strazarra. Due to client workload, BLRB Architects declined to interview. Of the three (3) firms interviewed, Integrus Architecture was judged to be the most qualified to provide design services for this project.

An interim contract P1473, not to exceed \$93,838, has been executed to allow the design team to perform selected activities prior to the time that a full agreement can be executed. These activities include: conducting a master planning study to provide for selection of the optimum location for the classroom addition; assessing existing building systems to determine the extent of upgrades or replacements necessary to support the classroom addition; and to participate in the School Design Advisory Team (SDAT) and community outreach process.

VIII. STATEMENT OF ISSUE

Whether to execute the Architectural and Engineering Services contract with Integrus Architecture for the work associated with this project.

IX. <u>ALTERNATIVES</u>

Do not execute the contract. This is not recommended. If the contract is not executed, the planned schedule for this capital construction project identified in the BTA IV Capital Levy will not be maintained and the District's capacity shortfall will not be addressed at the earliest possible date.

The architect will employ the following resources when planning and beginning design of this project:

XI. <u>TIMELINE FOR IMPLEMENTATION / COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT</u>

Upon Board approval, the Superintendent will execute an agreement and planning and design will begin.
