1. TITLE

Approval of Guiding Principles for the Building Excellence (BEX) V Capital Levy

2. PURPOSE

This board action would approve the Board's guiding principles for the BEX V Capital Levy. These principles will help inform the selection of projects to be funded by the proposed levy.

3. RECOMMENDED MOTION

I move that the Board approve the guiding principles for the BEX V Capital Levy, as attached to this Board action report. Immediate action is in the best interest of the district.

4. <u>BACKGROUND INFORMATION</u>

a. **Background**

Seattle Public Schools has two capital levies on alternating six-year cycles, so voters see one capital levy every three years. This coming year, the . The Building Excellence V Capital Levy is slated to go before the voters for renewal. Capital project staff and the Board have been engaged in a process of analyzing district facilities and scoping the costs of potential projects. February 2019. As part of the Capital Levy Planning process outlined in Policy No. 6901, the Board mustshall adopt guiding principles to inform this process. the board's decision making on the selection of projects for the Levy. These principles, combined with the priorities laid out in Policy No. 6901, are to be used to create a scoring and relative ranking of all proposed projects within each criterion or guiding principle.

The Board's adoption of the guiding principles, combined with the scoring analysis provides both clear Board guidance and will contribute to a tool for objective measurement of the Board's guidance that will assist to inform the Board's decision making on the projects to be included in the levy. The scoring analysis will also be presented to the School Board for approval as part of the Facilities Master Plan. Capital project staff are presently working on the Facilities Master Plan as required by Policy No. 6901, which includes analyzing proposed projects and scoring them within each of the stated priority areas.

b. Alternatives

The Board could choose to not adopt guiding principles, which would <u>not provide staff</u>

with clear guidance that the Board's additional priorities, such as "Ensuring Educational and Racial Equity" are to be added to the scoring analysis, and would be counter to Board policy. Alternatively, the Board may amend the proposed or choose a different set of guiding principles.

10. POLICY IMPLICATION

Policy No. 6901, Capital Levy Planning, states, "As part of the levy planning process, the Board shall adopt Guiding Principles specific to each levy, to direct the staff in presenting proposals for levy projects."

11. BOARD COMMITTEE RECOMMENDATION

This motion was discussed at the Operations Committee meeting on April 5, 2018. The Committee reviewed the motion and moved it forward for consideration by the Full Board.

12. TIMELINE FOR IMPLEMENTATION

Upon adoption of the guiding principles, the Board and District staff will continue to develop and refine the listrubrics and metrics for the scoring analysis of potential projects to be considered in

the BEX V Levy package overagainst the course Board's adopted priorities. The rubrics and metrics for each of the next few months in accordance with these adopted priorities, as clarified by the adoption of the Guiding Principles, and in Board Policy No. 6901, will be presented to the School Board in a work session for BEX V scheduled for May 30, 2018. These metrics will be used to develop the scoring of each of the projects, which then will assist the Board in determining projects to be included in the BEX V Levy package. Final Board Action on the levy package will take place in November 2018 to approve the ballot language and levy package.

Proposed Building Excellence (BEX) V Guiding Principles:

With the overarching framework of Ensuring Educational and Racial Equity (Board Policy No. 0030) where "This means differentiating resource allocation, within budgetary limitations, to meet the needs of students who need more supports and opportunities to succeed academically..." the Board adopts the following guiding principles for the Building Excellence (BEX) V Capital Levy:

- Building Safety and Security
 - Healthy, accessible and safe facilities to specifically include critical seismic upgrades, safe drinking water, security systems, emergency response equipment, sufficient core spaces (i.e. lunchrooms, libraries, and bathrooms), and safe playgrounds.
- Right-Size Capacity
 - Plan for buildings to have sufficient classrooms and core facilities in permanent structure (i.e. typically less than 10% of school in temporary/portable classrooms) to match student enrollment demand and appropriate lot coverage.
- · Building Conditions and Educational Alignment
 - Prioritize renovating the poorest condition and most crowded schools to ensure healthy, inclusive and inspiring educational environments which appropriately support education programming.
- Environmental and Financial Sustainability
 - Buildings to be constructed or renovated with a focus on conservation of resources both for ongoing operational costs as well as preservation of district investments.
- Updating Technology
 - Balance investments between central office Infrastructure, student and employee data security and privacy, and updating classroom hardware and software with a focus on tools that assist student learning and enhance educator instruction.
