1. TITLE

Amendment to the Student Assignment Plan for 2017-18: **For Introduction**: December 7, 2016 Establish Decatur school site as an optional, rather than geo-split, pathway for north<u>east</u>-end elementary HCC students.

2. PURPOSE

This would establish Decatur as an optional HCC pathway for north<u>east</u>-end elementary Highly Capable students, rather than a mandatory assignment, and provide potential capacity relief for Cascadia Elementary.

3. RECOMMENDED MOTION

I move that the School Board amend the proposed Student Assignment Plan for 2017-18 to permit and implement Decatur as an optional HCC pathway for students in the Eckstein and Jane Addams service areas, adding language to the Student Assignment Plan as shown in the amendment attached to this Board Action Report.

4. BACKGROUND INFORMATION

The current proposal in the Student Assignment Plan is to geo-split Cascadia Elementary and other HCC students from Cascadia to Decatur Elementary, which currently has space available.

Historically, the HCC program, schools and students have been relocated or divided numerous times. Some of the same students have been required to move from their existing school multiple times, throughout elementary and middle school. Directors have heard concerns about the amount of disruption these changes cause to families and school communities. This is not in the best interest of student stability.

This amendment would address capacity challenges in a manner that does not force removal of students from their existing school. Instead, it would follow the successful models of Ingraham High School and Fairmount Park Elementary by establishing optional pathways for HCC students. This will serve to alleviate capacity challenges in over-enrolled schools, offer easier access to programming and services to families throughout the District, and better align with the commitment to students outlined in the District's Strategic Plan, which states: "Our Students Come First: We believe it is essential to place the interests of students above all others."

The amendment language also highlights that Fairmount Park is an optional HCC site for students in the Denny and Madison Middle School areas. This is currently the case and has been

noted to date in the Linked Schools Chart. This amendment makes it clear to anyone reading the Student Assignment Plan.

Alternatives

Proceed with previously approved Student Assignment Plan adjustments for the 2017-18 school year, geo-splitting north-end Cascadia and other HCC students between Cascadia Elementary and Decatur Elementary. This is not recommended as a mandatory division of a school population is disruptive to students and families.

The fiscal impact of this amendment is anticipated to require four additional school buses at a cost of \$77,450 each as well as potentially additional teaching staff if low enrollment (typical for option schools) of at least two more teachers at an estimated cost of \$108,000 each for a total general fund cost estimated at \$525,800. difficult to determine because it is difficult to predict Costs may vary based on how many students would choose to opt into the potential alternative site. Should that site be under-enrolled and Cascadia Elementary over-enrolled, there could be potential cost impacts in the form of mitigation funding for the under-enrolled site and cost impacts to address capacity and transportation issues at Cascadia.
