




Historical Enrollment

Introduction

- Enrollment has fallen due to COVID-19
- The largest drop in enrollment occurred after the announcement of online learning for Fall 2020
- Districts across the US have experienced similar decreases in enrollment
- This presentation highlights enrollment changes in the district by grade band and changes in student residence by service area





Enrollment by Grade Band (K)






Enrollment by Grade Band (1-5)






Enrollment by Grade Band (6-8)

Summary of Grade Band Analysis

- Kindergarten enrollment dropped by the largest percentage, falling 15.4% from last year
- Elementary (1-5) enrollment dropped by 4.4% from last year
- Middle and High school enrollment saw slight increases in 2020
- Enrollment decreases for K-5 are likely due to remote learning in Fall 2020
 - Some families with children that would have entered Kindergarten in 2020 have decided to wait







2020-21 Change in Student Residence by Service Area









Summary of Service Area Analysis

- 10 out of 12 of the service areas in the district saw decreases in student residence this year
- The greatest decrease occurred in the McClure service area (by 7.1%)
- The only two service areas that saw increases in student residence for 2020-21 were Washington and Mercer Int'l, both areas that have continued to grow in recent years



In/Out Migration - Definitions

- <u>IN Migration</u>: Current students who were not enrolled in SPS in grades K-4 last year, who are newly enrolled in SPS for 2020-21
- **<u>OUT Migration</u>**: Former students who were enrolled in SPS grades K-4 last year, who did not return to SPS for 2020-21



Widening K-5 Migration Gap

Factors of Increased OUT Migration

- Out migration from 2019 to 2020 far exceeded in migration, and at a much higher rate than previous years
- COVID-19 and remote learning have led to large decreases in K-5 enrollment
- Families with children that the district expected to enter Kindergarten this year have not enrolled
- Economic downturn due to COVID-19 could be causing families to move out of the district



Impact of Remote Learning Announcement

 After the announcement of remote learning for Fall 2020, district enrollment dropped by **1,180 students**

 For the first time in the last few years, student enrollment dropped between September and October in 2020-21



Summary

- In 2020, enrollment in the district has decreased by 2-3% due to COVID-19 and online learning
 - A large portion of students dropped after the announcement of the remote learning plan for Fall 2020
- Out migration from 2019 to 2020 far exceeded in migration, and at a much higher rate than previous years
- September to October enrollment numbers decreased for the first time in the last few years
- Enrollment decreases have been limited to K-5, with Kindergarten experiencing the largest percent drop in enrollment from last year
- 10 out of 12 of the service areas in the district saw decreases in student residence this year, with the greatest decrease occurring in the McClure service area



Looking Forward

- Although 2020 enrollment numbers for district schools have been tracking lower than projected due to COVID-19 and online learning, the district does not expect this drop in enrollment to be a new trend
- Enrollment Planning anticipates that district schools' enrollment numbers will continue to match closely with our previous projections
