1. TITLE

BTA IV and BEX IV: Award Construction Contract P5098 to CDK Construction Services, Inc., for the Dearborn Park Elementary School Roof Replacement and Seismic Upgrades project

2. <u>PURPOSE</u>

This motion would authorize the Superintendent to enter into a construction contract for the Dearborn Park Elementary School Roof Replacement and Seismic Upgrades project.

3. <u>RECOMMENDED MOTION</u>

I move that the School Board authorize the Superintendent to execute construction contract P5098, from BTA IV and BEX IV, to CDK Construction Services, Inc., for the Dearborn Park Elementary School Roof Replacement and Seismic Upgrades project in the amount of \$444,500, including alternates 1 and 2, plus Washington State sales tax, with any minor additions, deletions, and modifications deemed necessary by the Superintendent, and to take any necessary action to implement the contract.

4. BACKGROUND INFORMATION

a. Background

Dearborn Park Elementary School has Priority 1 Seismic Improvements needed, as identified in the PCS Structural Solutions Seismic Report dated January 23, 2012. In addition, the MENG Analysis Facility Assessment Reports have identified that the roofing membrane system has reached the end of its useful life and requires replacement. Funding was set aside in the BTA IV and BEX IV Capital Levies to fund these improvements.

The A/E firm of S. M. Stemper Architects, PLLC was selected in spring 2017 to provide architectural and engineering design services for the project. A design contract was awarded on September 26, 2017.

The project was publicly bid on March 13, 2018 with four bids being received. The Base bid is \$408,500 plus Washington State sales tax. Accepting Alternate Bids 1 and 2 will result in a construction contract award amount of \$444,500.00 plus Washington State sales tax. CDK Construction Services, Inc., was deemed to be the low bid contractor, and the consulting firm S. M. Stemper Architects recommends acceptance of the Total Bid amount including Alternate Bids 1 and 2 which are additional roofing components.

b. Alternatives

Deny Motion. If motion is denied, the district will not be able to execute the contract to start construction. This may cause periodic disruptions to the learning environment as a result of roof leaks, and will likely result in increased costs for ongoing maintenance, operations and repairs.
