1. TITLE

Approval of Amendment to Gersh Academy Services Contract and Academy of Precision Learning (APL) Services Contract

2. PURPOSE

This Board Action Report will approve an amendment to the district's contract with Gersh Academy, modifying the original contract of \$273,200. in the amount of \$306, 225273,200 to a revised total amount of \$579,425 due to the addition of students and services required to fulfill services on students' Individual Education Programs through June 2021 and will approve an amendment to the district's contract with Academy of Precision Learning (APL) modifying the original contract of \$297,305 in the amount of \$294,462 297,305 to a revised total contract amount of \$591,767 due to additional students and services required to fulfill services on students' Individual Education Programs through June 2021.

3. <u>RECOMMENDED MOTION</u>

I move that the School Board authorize the Superintendent to amend the <u>original</u> contract with Gersh Academy <u>of \$273,200</u>, in the amount of \$306,225.273,200, for a revised total contract amount of \$579,425, for private placement of fewer than ten students who require therapeutic day services and programming, with any minor additions, deletions, and modifications deemed necessary by the Superintendent, and to take any necessary actions to implement these contracts; and to amend the <u>original</u> contract <u>of \$297,305</u>, with, Academy for Precision Learning (APL), in the amount of

\$ 294,462, \$297,305 for a revised total-contract amount of \$591,767, for private placement of fewer than ten students who require therapeutic day services and programming, with any minor additions, deletions, and modifications deemed necessary by the Superintendent, and to take any necessary actions to implement these contracts.

4. <u>BACKGROUND INFORMATION</u>

Background



There are currently Seattle Public Schools students with Individualized Education Programs (IEPs) who require highly specialized special education services that the District cannot provide because the District does not have the ability to meet these needs. The number of students requiring these services has increased. These identified agencies are approved by the Office of Superintendent of Public Instruction and/or have agreed to accept these students or provide these specialized, IEP-driven services in partnership with District staff. The District has increased oversight and monitoring of all-day treatment placements, has allocated regular consultation, and emergency response protocols (including isolation and restraint data) are reviewed by the District behavior specialists assigned to the service provider. Feedback, professional development, and coaching are provided to the service provider staff to ensure adherence to District protocols and procedures. This vendor is determined to be sole source provider.

- a. **Alternatives** Not to approve this motion. This is not recommended because the students' legally mandated Individualized Education Programs (IEPs) will not be met. The District does not currently have enough internal District programming and services to meet the high needs of these students. There are very limited treatment placements in the region with few openings for new students.

Fiscal impact to this action of \$306,225,273,200 will bring the Gersh contract total up to \$579,425 and the Academy for Precision Learning (APL) contract increase of \$294,462,297,305 for a new contract total of up to \$591,767.
