1. <u>TITLE</u>

City of Seattle Families & Education Levy Funding for Seattle Public Schools for summer learning 2017 and the 2017 – 2018 School Year

2. <u>PURPOSE</u>

This action report accepts \$16,905,221.00 in grant funding from the City of Seattle's Families & Education Levy. The funding will support supplemental before, during and after programs at selected Elementary, Middle and High Schools throughout the district.

3. <u>RECOMMENDED MOTION</u>

I move that the Board authorize the Superintendent to accept the grant funds totaling \$16,905,221.00 from the City of Seattle's Families and Education Levy (FEL) funded programs with the City of Seattle's Department of Education and Early Learning for the Family Support Worker, Elementary, Middle and High School Innovation, Middle School Linkage, and School Nurses, with any minor additions, deletions and modifications deemed necessary by the Superintendent, and to take any necessary actions to accept the grant funds.

4. <u>BACKGROUND INFORMATION</u>

- a. **Background** 2012-13 marked the beginning of a new seven year cycle of the 2011 voters approved Families and Education Levy (FEL). Work is based on the Partnership Agreement, approved by the Board on August 15, 2012, which describes the roles and responsibilities of the District and the City in the use of the funds and lists the programs authorized for funding. All investments from the City address the outcomes associated with School Readiness, Academic Achievement and Reduction of the Achievement Gap, and College and Career Readiness. They are separated into the following critical partnership areas, which are detailed in the Partnership Agreement: Early Learning, Elementary, Middle and High Schools, and Student Health Services. A summary of program investment areas is attached. The attached summary reflects the new indirect rate of 8%.
- b. Alternatives Not accept the funds. This is not recommended, as the loss of these funds would severely impact the health and wellbeing of our students, as well as reduce the

number and quality of supplemental educational supports available to our neediest students or we would need to find the funding in the general fund.

c. **Research** Contracts and associated outcomes for all programs for 2017-2018 are being jointly developed with the City's Department of Education and Early Learning, staff listed, and the schools receiving funding.

5. <u>FISCAL IMPACT/REVENUE SOURCE</u>

Fiscal impact to this action will be the receipt of \$ 16,905,221.
