1. TITLE

OSPI Distressed School Grant: Award Construction Contract K1342, Bid No. 11824, to CDK Construction Services, Inc. for the Eckstein Middle School Exterior Sunshade Installation project

2. PURPOSE

The purpose of this action is to provide authorization for the Superintendent to enter into a construction contract in the amount of \$348,000, including base bid plus Alternate #1, plus Washington State Sales Tax, and to authorize the Superintendent to accept the Distressed School Grant funds for the Eckstein Middle School Exterior Sunshade Installation project.

3. <u>RECOMMENDED MOTION</u>

I move that the School Board (a) authorize the Superintendent to execute construction contract K1342 with CDK Construction Services, Inc. in the amount of \$348,000, including base bid plus Alternate #1, plus Washington State Sales Tax, with any minor additions, deletions, and modifications deemed necessary by the Superintendent, and to take any necessary actions to implement the contract; and (b) to authorize the Superintendent to accept the Distressed School Grant funds for the Eckstein Middle School Exterior Sunshade Installation project.

4. BACKGROUND INFORMATION

a. **Background**

The Eckstein Middle School Exterior Sunshade Installation project is located at 3003 North East 75th Street, Seattle, WA, 98115 and will be reimbursed by a Distressed Schools Grant in the amount of \$500,000 through OSPI. In consultation with our state representatives and the school building principal, the grant will be used to install exterior sunshades over south facing windows to resolve problems with classrooms overheating from direct sunlight entering the school.

The Eckstein Middle School Exterior Sunshade Installation project was publicly bid on March 20, 2019, with a total of four (4) bids being received.

This motion allows the district to execute a construction contract with CDK Construction Services, Inc., who was the low responsive, responsible bidder.

The school was constructed in 1950. Prior improvements that have been made at Eckstein Middle School since the year 2000, include electrical power, gymnasium, arts/science and technology upgrades in 2000; reroofing and exterior upgrades in 2000, 2005 and 2006; athletic field upgrades in 2008 and 2017; mechanical, waterline replacement, and fire sprinkler installation in 2015 and 2016; and seismic upgrades in 2018, with a second phase starting in the summer of 2019.

a. Alternatives

Deny Motion. If motion is denied, the district will not be able to execute the contract to start construction to reduce the overheating problems at the school. This is not recommended because it would negatively impact the district's commitment to provide safe and healthy learning environments in our schools.
